Morris and Larsen named in Universal shuffle

Edgar Bronfman, Jr., president and chief executive officer of the Montreal-based Seagram Company, has made it official; Doug Morris will assume the position of chairman and chief executive officer of the PolyGram/Universal Music combination to be named as Universal Music Group. The appointment becomes effective on the completion of the acquisition of PolyGram N.V. by Universal Studios, Inc.

In making the announcement, Bronfman referred to Morris as having "an exceptional talent with proven ability to lead the largest company in the music industry." He continues with "Under Doug's leadership, we will work to identify the team that will guide the combined music operations. We are looking forward to working together with the Universal and PolyGram management teams to build the premiere music company of the 21st century."

In commenting on the appointment, Morris expressed excitement at the opportunity and the challenge. "My colleagues at Universal Music and I are looking forward to working with PolyGram's executives to solidify our management organization throughout the world. Our goal will be to maximize our strengths and capabilities so that we can begin to capitalize on the worldwide opportunities that exist for our artists, our labels and our people."

A graduate of Columbia University, Morris began his music career as a songwriter for Robert Mellin, a music publisher. Among his songwriting credits is the Chiffons' 1966 hit Sweet Talkin' Guy.

Warner/Chappell Music signs Jully Black

Annie-Marie Smith, creative manager for Warner/Chappell Music Canada, has announced the signing of Capitol Hill Entertainment recording artist Jully Black to a worldwide co-publishing deal.

Black began singing in church at the age of six and won her first singing competition at age 10. Her big break came when she met Bronx rapper Tim Dawg at a concert in 1992. Dawg was so impressed with Black's talent that he signed her to his management/production company, Bronx Zoo/550 Music, a relationship that unfortunately didn't work out.

However, Black was determined to continue her singing profession and through Fresh Arts, an arts program in Toronto aimed at youth, she met Saukrates and Kardinal Offishall and together they formed Figurez Ov Speech (FOS), an alliance of

He also produced a number of hit songs, including Brownsville Station's Smokin' In The Boys Room. He joined Laurie Records in 1965 as a writer and producer, going on to become vice-president and general manager. He then launched his own label, Big Tree Records, which was first distributed and then acquired by Atlantic Records in 1978. He was named president of ATCO Records in 1978, moving up to co-chairman and co-CEO with Ahmet Ertegun for the Atlantic Recording Group. Morris was named president and chief operating officer of Warner Music-U.S. and later, chairman in 1994. The next year Morris launched Rising Tide Entertainment, a full service record label he formed through a joint venture with MCA Music Entertainment Group (now Universal Music Group). He was appointed chairman and chief executive officer of the Universal Music Group in November of 1995.

At the heels of his promotion, Morris announced that Jorgen Larsen would be appointed Chairman and CEO of Universal Music

IMF elects new board of directors

A new board of directors of the International Managers Forum (IMF) was elected at the organization's general meeting recently in Toronto. A membership drive launched at Canadian Music Week last year has resulted in a membership of more than 60 members from across Canada. The board of directors is made up of eight members with at least one member from five regions (BC, The

Prairies, Ontario, Quebec and the Atlantic provinces) and three at large.

The new board comprises Michael Ardenne (Ardenne International) representing the Atlantic provinces; Sebastian Nasra (Avalanche Productions) and Maurice Velenosi (MCM Entertainment Management) representing Quebec; Rob Lanni (Coalition Entertainment Management) and Nancy Mayer (Silver Star Management) representing Ontario; Gilles Paquin (Paquin Entertainment Group) and Norman Sharpe (Wide Mouth Management) representing the Prairies; and Allen Moy (Gangland Artists) representing BC.

Lanni was appointed to chair a Lobby committee, while James Porter of RamJam Artists will chair a committee on Education; and Graham Stairs of Pop Guru Sound & Vision will chair a committee on Marketing Events.

It was pointed out that Neighbouring Rights has been an important platform and the managers "are working collectively to represent their artists."

IMF member Jeff Maize who is the interim director for Recording Artists Association of Canada (RAAC), was the feature speaker at the meeting. IMF is already supporting RAAC and its position in front of the Copyright Board and has offered support in lobbying efforts for the launch of MuchMore Music.

Ca-na-da's Bobby Gimby is dead at 79

Bobby Gimby, affectionately known as "Ca-na-da's Pied Piper" died in a nursing home in North Bay. The famous trumpeter, who wrote Ca-na-da in celebration of Canada's Centennial (1967), was 79 when he passed away peacefully in his sleep.

The following appeared in the March 18, 1967 issue of RPM. "It was in May of last year when Ben (McPeck) was approached by Bobby Gimby to produce a record having a contemporary sound. This was subsequently used as background to an industrial film which was produced by Herriot Productions. The name of the song was Canada. A few people thought this would be a good vehicle to promote Canada's Centennial year, so Ben was

asked to arrange a demo session which could be submitted to the government. The session was made up of accordion, lead guitar and bass and the voices of three French Canadian youngsters."

The government approved the commercial and McPeck was given the task of arranging the musical production and the booking of the singers.

From the same RPM article. "Thirty of Canada's best musicians, many well known, gathered at Hallmark Studios in Toronto. Also on the session were six English Canadian children under the choral direction of Laurie Bower and six French Canadian youngsters who were directed by Raymond Berthiaume. Seven hours later, under the watchful eyes of eleven government observers, Ben had completed the Gimby tune of Canada as well as the Centennial Train which he wrote and arranged himself.

"Initially, Canada was to be sold as a 45 single, only as part of the Centennial Train promotion. Those who came to view the train could pick up their souvenir copy of Canada. Those with some knowledge of the record business could see the potential of a record of this type and made the suggestion that the record be leased to a Canadian record company for distribution across Canada. The government agreed and tenders were sent out and Quality Records was awarded the contract which turned out to be the best selling Canadian record in their history, thanks to the musical genius of Ben McPeck."

With high energy television promos, picturing Mr. Gimby leading hundreds of youngsters down

what looked like main street Canada, plus the airplay, he became the Pied Piper of Canada. That same year Mr. Gimby was made an officer of the Order of Canada.

Mr. Gimby began his musical career with Vancouver's Mart Kenney and his Western Gentlemen where he was the lead trumpeter. The Kenney group became one of the country's top dance bands.

Mr. Gimby was also featured on the popular CBC's Happy Gang through the '40s and '50s, an eleven year association. He was also a highly successful pop songwriter and writer of jingles. His songs have been recorded by Georgia Gibbs, Ray Bolger, Max Bygraves and Peggy Lee.

Mr. Gimby was born in Cabri, Saskatchewan. His wife Grace, who was also from Saskatchewan, predeceased him in 1977.

Oz cast album recorded at Manta Eastern Sound

Toronto's Manta Eastern Sound was the setting (June 21) for the recording of the first cast album of The Wizard Of Oz, which stars Mickey Rooney as the Wizard and Eartha Kitt as the Wicked Witch and Jessica Grove as Dorothy. The album which will be released on the TVT label is being produced by Robert Sher.

Oz is currently in the midst of a multi-city North American tour and has been playing to capacity houses at the Hummingbird Centre in Toronto since its opening on June 5. The show closes on June 27 and moves on to San Francisco, returning to Canada to play Calgary's Jubilee Auditorium (Aug. 7-22) and Vancouver's Ford Centre (Dec. 4 - Jan. 3).

Southam and Pattison buy stake in Livent

Conrad Black and Jim Pattison have made individual bids to acquire shares in Livent.

Black's newspaper company, Southam Inc. is buying 1.5 million Livent shares for a reported \$18 million, which will give Black, who is a Livent director, 5 per cent of Livent's common shares.

Pattison, a well known west coast entrepreneur who owns Vancouver-based Pattison Group, is buying 100,000 common shares of Livent at \$8.00 US through Great Pacific Financing, another of his companies. Pattison is also a director of Livent.

Livent has been constantly in the entertainment

news, having won 18 Tony Awards, including four for Ragtime, best musical for Kiss of the Spider Woman, and best musical revival for Show Boat. Since opening on Broadway, Ragtime has been the highest grossing production on the great white way.

Most recently Livent became a hot item in financial circles when former Walt Disney president Michael Ovitz bought 2.5 million shares, resulting in Livent founder Garth Drabinsky moving to the position of creative head of the company.

Livent is currently in the pre-production stages of Fosse, which will open in Toronto next month.








MICHELLE WRIGHT

OUTSTANDING NEW MALE ARTISTS


BRUCE GUTHRO


GREG HANNA


BRENT McATHEY

SEAN HOGAN



Farmer's Daughter is going for a repeat at this year's awards, Up once again for Big Country Group Or Duo Of The Year.



THE RANKINS

You'll notice a little difference to the Rankin Family 1998, something in their name. But that's not all: the five siblings (Heather, Cookie, Raylene, Jimmy and John) have also expanded their sound on Uprooted, their newest album on EMI, taking their musical vistas to places they hadn't gone before. LEAHY



With a strong Canadian following, Wade has played the never-ending list of Canadian venues for years and been nominated for Juno Awards in both 1997 and 1998 for Best Country Group. Most recently Wade & Wayward were honoured at the 1998 Ontario Country Music Association Awards for the Group Of The Year title. Walking away with Independent Group Of The Year, Independent Song Of The Year and Independent Single Of The Year at the 1997 CCMA Awards is just another reason that one of Canada's hardest working bands, Thomas Wade & Wayward are up for the Group Or Duo Of The Year Award.

PRAIRIE OYSTER

A once struggling band, Prairie Oyster is now a common household name in Canada. This six piece band has mastered the art of uniqueness. All the components of Prairie Oyster have led the band to becoming one of Canada's premiere groups. Since the release of *Blue Plate Special*, Prairie Oyster has climbed to the next plateau of their career, it has also led to the band's nomination in the Group Or Duo Of The Year Category.


DENISE MURRAY

NANCY DENAULT






SHIRLEY MYERS







CHARLIE MAJOR



That song received radio play on a whopping 350 stations across North America while the trio's third single, *Would You Still Dance* was an indie success, breaking Top 5 on national and international charts. For their first year at The Big Country Awards, The Cactus Pricks are nominated in the category of Outstanding Group or Duo.



THE COCKRUM SISTERS



Griff and Anderson named to Hall of Honour

The Canadian Country Music Association (CCMA) has announced that Bill Anderson and Ray Griff, well known pioneers of Canadian country, will be inducted into CCMA's Hall of Honour.

Griff, a veteran songwriter and recording artist has more than 2,000 songs in his repertoire. Anderson has been a major personality in country radio for the last 25 years, where he was a major supporter of Canadian talent.

Born in Vancouver and raised in Calgary, Griff first moved to Nashville in 1962 when he was only 20. But it wasn't long before he returned home a little worse for wear. He persisted however, returning when Jim Reeves recorded one of his songs. It still wasn't an easy road. Griff worked as a piano service man during the day and in a pressing plant at night, but still found time to pitch his songs. He finally got a job with a music publisher in exchange for \$30 a week and a place to sleep in the back office.

Success began to come his way. He scored 50 singles in the Top 100 and earned more than 50 ASCAP and BMI awards, releasing 22 albums (with a greatest hit package due later this year) and enjoyed the experience of having more than 500 of his songs recorded by other artists, including Loretta Lynn, Wayne Newton, Dolly Parton, George Hamilton IV, Mel Tillis, Jerry Lee Lewis and more. He also continues to build his producer credits.

Griff still has a close connection to Canada and currently has homes in both Calgary and Nashville.

Anderson, who will be inducted into the Hall of Honour as this year's winner of the CCMA's Stan Klees Industry Builder Award, has been a leader in country broadcasting since the early '70s.

It was during the '70s when he was an on-air personality at CFGM, the Toronto area's major country radio station, where he helped lay the foundation for Opry North, a program created by the late Dave Johnson, which syndicated live

country music across Canada.

Anderson moved to CFRB in the mid-seventies where he created and launched Big Country a syndicated radio program that was heard on more than 100 radio stations across Canada. For close to 10 years, Anderson was heard by a weekly audience estimated to be a million plus. He produced, wrote, handled the interviews and hosted the show. The show was designed to appeal to listeners who thought they didn't like country music. Many non-country stations, including CFRB, carried the show. Anderson won his first Big Country award as country radio personality in 1978 and again in 1980, 1981 and 1985.

When the Canadian Country Music Awards were created, Anderson, as co-chairman of the awards committee, worked with other members who created the awards as they are known today, mapping the rules, defining categories and setting voting categories. In 1991 he transformed Key 590 into Country 59. Today, he is national host on the country format at Pelmorex Radio Network which is heard on 35 stations across Canada.

Third album for Narada's Jesse Cook

Canadian flamenco sensation Jesse Cook is as elated as can be expected. He is sitting in the RPM offices looking, for the very first time, at the final product of his newest release, titled *Vertigo*. Cook meticulously studies the packaging and the sleeve design -- all of which were done under his supervision months ago -- before nodding his head in satisfaction.

"A CD is an aesthetic experience from when you open it up to when you put it on," he muses sagely. "Often, while you're listening, you're looking at the sleeve. I've always believed that a

CD should all be one experience, it should all hold together."


Holding it together is something that Cook has become renowned for in the relatively short span of a three album career. His first, titled *Tempest*, emulated what its title suggested in music, making it a year long chart success in the US and in Canada. Narada came knocking at the door soon thereafter, releasing *Gravity*, which certified Gold in this country.

"Gravity was a point of departure for *Vertigo* in that my favourite songs on *Gravity* were unusual. There's a sort of ominousness and a vastness of those songs and also the Arabic influences -- I wanted to incorporate them into this work so."

Consequently, *Vertigo* showcases Cook's mastery over a world music dialect in the tradition of rumba flamenca music. Several songs from

Vertigo carry over the Arabic influence, including the title track, *Byzantium Underground*, and *Red*.

"A record is a very different thing from a live show: what you want to hear in your living room at 11 o'clock at night is not necessarily what you want to hear when you're all pumped up at a big show and you want to dance. With this album, I wanted it to be more aggressive, things like *That's Right* and *Avocado* are more punchy and in your face. What I wanted to do with the song *Tempest* on the first record is what I achieved in *Rattle and Burn*; a real nasty kind of grunge traditional rumba. It's got a nastiness. I know it sounds strange but if you listen to George Clinton and all those big funkadelic era musicians, there's a concept of slamming the one, the first beat of the song is really emphasised, I love that. It really makes you want to dance and I always wondered how I could incorporate it into my music, take a bit of rumba flamenco and incorporate that."
