Arts groups show support for controversial Bill C-55

In a rare display of solidarity, the performing rights society (SOCAN) and the Canadian Association of Broadcasters (CAB) found themselves on the same side of the fence, with other arts groups in supporting Heritage Minister Sheila Copps' controversial Bill C-55.

The setting was Toronto's Arts and Letters Club last week (March 15) where an impressive and very diverse ad hoc group of people representing recorded music, radio, theatre and film, but not the book publishers, who would be most affected had Bill C-55 been defeated in the House. As it was, despite the efforts of the Reform Party, the Bill was passed by Members of Parliament by a vote of 196 to 43.

Ken Berry promoted to Elektra/Atlantic manager

Kim Cooke, senior vice-president and managing director U.S. division of Warner Music Canada, has announced the appointment of Ken Berry to marketing manager of Elektra/Atlantic Records. His appointment is effective immediately.

Berry was hired on as promotion/sales representative for Warner's London region in 1991. He joined the Toronto branch as promotion representative in 1993 where he quickly distinguished himself as an aggressive and highly knowledgeable music person with solid connections with radio programmers and members of the print media.

In making the above announcement, Cooke pointed out that Berry's "knowledge of and passion for music, and his dedication to Warner Music Canada make his promotion to this key position particularly well-deserved."

Now it goes to the Senate.

Host of the gathering, Robert Pilon, who is vice-president of the Association québécois de l'industrie du disque, du spectacle et de la vidéo (ADISQ) was obviously overjoyed citing "a first." He was referring to the fact that this was the first time so many representatives of Canada's arts industries had raised their voices on one united front.

CAB president Michael McCabe and SOCAN's president Gilles Valiquette, well known adversaries, appeared quite comfortable in their roles as protectors of Canada's culture.


It was obvious that the various representatives of Canada's cultural industries were concerned that

if a stand wasn't taken, to support the Bill, the Americans would probably go on to target any or all of their protected domains next.

It was reported by the Globe and Mail's Val Ross in the March 16 edition that McCabe had revealed he had been approached by a U.S. trade representative making it clear that Canada's broadcast industry was "on the list." McCabe also suggested that the U.S. was annoyed over Canadian support for film production and for simulcasting (the policy of blocking U.S. broadcasts if Canadian television networks are showing the same program at the same time). "I think culture is the No. 1 item on the U.S. agenda," he said.

The Canadian government currently supports Canadian magazines through postal subsidies, tax breaks and restrictions on foreign ownership. Bill C-55 will add another measure, not allowing Canadians businesses to advertise in U.S. split-run editions. The Americans, namely U.S. trade

representatives began rattling sabres, threatening Canada with trade sanctions if the Bill was passed into law.

It should be pointed out that foreigners can only own 25 per cent of a Canadian magazine. The investment Canada Act demands a review of any foreign investment in a Canadian magazine, requiring a foreign investor to pass a net benefits test.

However as the sabres rattled and the mouse roared, there has been somewhat of a backing-off by the Americans. U.S. publishers have apparently revealed they wouldn't be too adverse to a content

rule similar to that of Canadian content on radio, which could open yet another chapter in this battle to preserve an important segment of Canada's cultural mosaic.

SOCAN's General Manager Michael Rock was overjoyed at the show of support by the arts groups at the Toronto meeting. "We were there to support the government on its policy. We find there are many similarities between the problems of the challenges of the threats to the magazine industry and those to the Canadian music industry. So that's why we were there to support the government's policy. They have seen fit to express that policy through Bill C-55 and we're fully behind the government." As far as being allied with the CAB on this policy, "The CAB is

our biggest customer," says Rock, jokingly adding "Michael McCabe is a fine fellow."

Rock pointed out that the concerns aren't just for music "It's television and radio . . . I guess it spans the whole thing of what we call our cultural industries." says Rock.

There is also the threat of the Americans attacking the CRTC's legislated content on radio and television, a content rule that has done so much in building Canada's star system.

Copps isn't out of the woods yet with Bill C-55 which now makes the trip to the Senate. And, as Rock points out "With this Bill, it's not over 'til it's over, but we think the government is on the right track."

Deborah Cox in new role as Roots poster girl




V.I.P. inks deal with Bev Music


ROBBIE WILLIAMS - Pop
The Ego Has Landed
 EMI Music Canada - 97726-2-F
 Not just another mediocre solo offering from that A/C chart-topping soft-pop group Take That. Williams has strayed away from the sugary ballads and has already taken Europe by storm with his two solo efforts and has programmers buzzing with his lead off single release in Canada Millennium. EMI is pulling all the stops with this release and so far their persistent marketing strategies are paying off with Millennium cracking the Top 30 on the RPM Hit Tracks chart after only 3 weeks. The Ego Has Landed is Williams' first assault on the North American marketplace and is a cleverly crafted compilation of material from his 1997 release Life Thru A Lens and its European follow-up I've Been Expecting You. His debut solo effort Life Thru A Lens was a sleeper to say the least, but when it finally caught on Williams was being featured in all of the major British rags and performed for a record-breaking audience at the 1998 Glastonbury Festival which brought him nearer to the top of the European charts and also brought the album over the five times platinum mark in the UK. Expect no less of a reception from the North American consumers as this "Greatest Hits" package, will undoubtedly bring him to the international forefront. -SL



THE KELLY FAMILY - Euro/Pop
Almost Heaven
 Kel-Life/EMI-72438-54556-F
 A pretty phenomenal family, all nine of them; Barbey on vocals, Patricia on vocals and harp, Maite on vocals and percussions, Jimmy on vocals, acoustic guitar, electric-zither and spoons, Joey on vocals, acoustic guitars and electric guitars, Angelo on vocals, drums, percussion, timbales, John on vocals, acoustic guitars, electric guitar and percussions, Kathy on vocals, keyboards, Hammond organ, violin, accordion and piano and Paddy on vocals, bass, guitars, banjo, mandolin, tabla, keyboards and percussions, which makes for a full studio. But they also got an instrumental assist from mouth harpist Johan Daansen Nothing Like Home and Markus Stockhausen with a very effective piccolo and trumpet

performance on You Belong To Me, both key tracks. Well, that's the whole picture, except for the vocal description, which goes in keeping with the splendour of this overall production. Punchy and very artsy, and the punch remains. The album was actually released earlier this year, but with St. Paddy's Day here and gone, and with Kelly as a handle, what better time to patch into this family who have already sold more than 15 million albums worldwide. But don't tag them Irish. Euro/Pop may not be as flattering, but it's what they are, and they're an institution, masters of everything, including publishing (they wrote all the material) and production. I Can't Help Myself, with Angelo and Paddy doing the vocals is also key as is Nanana with vocals by Jimmy and Malte on vocals and Staying Alive with lead vocals by Joey. But don't overlook Hey Diddle Diddle with vocals by Paddy, Malte, Angelo and Barbey, a spoiler track. -WG

GIL - Poppourri
Here I Am

 It wouldn't be too surprising to learn there's a choir boy influence in GIL's past. A 16-year old with the power and elocution of lyrics displayed here opens the door to what should be a pretty phenomenal career. The vocal charm and warmth of this young German goes without question. The kid's a star already in Europe and beginning to gather steam on this side of the pond. If You Only Knew, a track featuring




The Moffatts and taken as the first single, is now at radio and the video has been getting some big time rotation on YTV, and it's expected that MuchMusic and MusiquePlus won't be too far behind. The crossover possibilities on the album are pretty obvious, given what's happening to kid/baby type records these days. There's an incredible market for releases like this as all parents with teenage girls must know by now. The album artwork alone will attract customer attention if front-racked and in-store play will cinch the interest factor. Also key are Charline, I Need You and I Am So In love. But don't overlook Round 'n' Round (It Goes), Bang, Bang, Bang and Am I Crazy, the lyrics and music which would appear to be designed specifically for the teen market, an incredible and growing market. -WG

THE IRISH TENORS - Classical
John McDermott, Anthony Kearns, Ronan Tynan - Point-8552 (Navarre)
 Just in time for St. Patrick's Day and what a wonderful celebration of Irish music by three of the world's top Irish tenors, Canada's own John McDermott, double amputee (legs) Ronan Tynan, a graduate of the famous Pavarotti school, and Anthony Kearns who won Ireland's Search for a Tenor competition in 1993 and whose credits are in keeping with his magnificent voice. And therein lies the magnetic draw of this release, the magnificent voices of all three. And it's interesting too that all three have their own distinct tenor timbre,




not one swayed by the others, which adds to the charm of these three powerful vocalists doing it their way. Incredible repertoire that shouldn't be restricted to the celebration of March 17: Minstrel Boy, The Town I Loved So Well, The Old Man, and who wouldn't be brought to tears by McDermott's Danny Boy. Great Stuff, and all three of them doing Spanish Lady, When Irish Eyes Are Smiling and Love's Old Sweet Song, and, of course, on Danny Boy as well. Includes an 8-page lyric songbook. Don't hide this one away in the classical or folk bin. It screams out to be front-racked and when the store is full of oldsters, in-store play will be a powerful sell. -WG

GEORGE STRAIT - Country
Always Never The Same

 Meanwhile, written by Fred Knobloch and Wayland Holyfield and taken as a single, is edging into the Top 10 and appears to be one of Strait's best chart performances in some time. It's amazing to suddenly discover that Strait has been releasing records since 1980.



His first RPM charted single was in 1981 when Unwound went to #14, followed by If You're Thinking You Want A Stranger, which went to #2 and Fool Hearted Memory, his first #1 hit in Canada (RPM - Sept. 11/82). Strait's secret of survival in this world of country where stars are here today and gone today, is maintaining that perfect vocal connection with his fans and radio programmer friends. All that's changed over those 19 years is his material, and he gets some of the best tunesmiths in country to put it down for him. The same holds true with this release with Write This Down written by Dana Hunt and Kent Robbins, That's The Truth by Steve Leslie and Melba Montgomery, One Of You by Kostas and Jim Lauderdale, 4 Minus 3 Equals Zero by Lonnie Williams, and the title track, written by Marv Green and Terry McBride, all of which should be considered as singles. The instrumental backing is Nashville's best pickers on parade. Perfect balance. Produced by Strait and Tony Brown. -WG




JULIAN LENNON - Pop

 If you can remember Lennon's last album, Help Yourself, released in 1991 and further back to his 1984 debut of Valotte, you're in for a surprise. He's taken the last seven years to "reflect on his place in the world," a nice bit of PR fluff, and it goes in keeping with what's in the grooves here, 14 songs, all of which have that in-depth and searching Lennon lyric modus operandi, some of which he solo wrote, others with Mark Spiro, Day After Day, the first single, Good To Be Lonely and I Don't Wanna Know, three key tracks and with a writer identified only as Dalbello, who just might be Canadian, but no Cancan cigar here, another key track. Lennon produced the album with Bob Rose. To say Lennon has matured as a songwriter goes without question. Vocally, it's probably demeaning to tag him as being more mature here, but there's a comfort zone that he projects that seems to be a tad more noticeable. Also key is his solo penning of Faithful, I Should Have Known and How Many Times. But don't overlook the title track which he wrote with Greg Darling. By the way, there's lots of reading material here, but a very strange, hard-to-read type, which shouldn't detract from the album, which is a guaranteed winner. -WG

WIDE MOUTH MASON - Rock
Where I Started
 WEA - 2 26739-P
 This Saskatoon based trio, recently in Toronto for Canadian Music Week, has set a pretty tough standard to match or surpass their debut self-titled release which spawned three Top 20 rock singles and garnered them nominations for a Juno and a Canadian Music Award. Since their initial release the band has toured across Canada with numerous acts including Big Sugar, Collective Soul, ZZ Top and The Rolling Stones, and they toured the United States with Kenny Wayne Shepherd, and with that kind of notoriety their follow-up looks to be very promising from the onset. The first single from Where I Started is the radio friendly, multi-format-fitting Why, which is making significant waves at rock and CHR stations across the country. To coincide with the release of Why, Wide Mouth opened for the Rolling Stones in Detroit to re-introduce themselves to the American consumer. Where I Got Started boasts twelve original songs penned by the three band members Shaun Verreault, Earl Pereira and Safan Javed and was produced at Greenhouse Studios in Vancouver by David Leonard (Prince and the Barenaked Ladies' Stunt). All tracks are undoubtedly worthy of a second listen with Burn and Half A Chance follow-up single contenders. The band's unity is clearly audible on this offering and band member Shaun Verreault sums it up beautifully when asked what sets Where I Started apart from their debut release, "Musically we have put our best foot forward. We've become better as a unit. It always comes back to the three of us getting closer." Obviously spending a year on the road for a sold-out 24 city tour has brought the Saskatoon natives closer together and plans are already in the works for another cross Canada tour to promote the new album. -SL



Feldman and Tarlton receive S&TG nod

The first Session & Tour Guide Awards luncheon was held as part of Canadian Music Week on March 5 hosted by Steve Anthony.

It was an opportune time to pay tribute to this underrated, yet very important factor of both the music and broadcast industries.

Donald Tarlton (aka DKD) was inducted into the Session & Tour Guide Hall of Fame, while veteran promoter/booker Sam Feldman of S.L. Feldman & Associates saw his organization take three of the awards; Booking Agent of the Year, SLFA president Vinny Cinquemani as Booking Agent of the Year, and Little Big Man, which was named International Booking Agency of the Year.

Tarlton was one of the first promoter/bookers to gain recognition in the industry. He began his career in Montreal in the late '60s, and recently

retired from Universal Concerts Canada, to once again team up with his partner from the '70s, Terry Flood where he reportedly purchased a piece of Flood's 280 Records (RPM - Oct. 19/98). Tarlton was the first inductee into the Session & Tour Guide Hall of Fame.

Feldman began his career on the west coast in the early '70s, becoming a major promoter in B.C. and eventually across the rest of Canada. He now has offices in Vancouver, Toronto and New York. This has been one of the better years for his company, where several of his clients won East Coast Music Awards and Little Big Man, his New York-based office won a Pollster award as the Small Booking Agency of the Year.

Filmmaker Baz Luhrmann shakes up radio

At a time when the record industry is going through a lacklustre period, a chance airing of Baz Luhrmann's Everybody's Free (To Wear Sunscreen), not your usual run-of-the-mill radio fare, on Toronto's Mix 99.9 has literally exploded in the Toronto market as well as the rest of the country.

J.J. Johnston, Standard Radio's vice-president of programming, which includes Mix 99.9, was quick to recognize the potential of the release and picked it up from a U.S. tip service, resulting in the station being the first in Canada to air the single. The record impacted immediately. "I've never seen anything like this in the 25 years I've been in radio," says Johnston, who has tagged the single "an anthem."

The airing of the single sent the EMI people scurrying to get product out to the rest of the CHR and Top 40 stations across Canada, and nail down a retail delivery date of the Something For Everybody CD for next week. "This is going to be huge," says Roger Bartell, EMI Music Canada's marketing manager. "The phones haven't stopped ringing from radio programmers and record retailers. We really had to pull the plug on this one."

As the story goes, it was a Chicago Tribune

columnist Mary Schmich who wrote the words almost two years ago which were included in her column in what is described as "a mock graduation speech" that wound its way to the Internet and was somehow attributed to the writings of novelist Kurt Vonnegut. It was then apparently picked up by Baz Luhrmann, an Australian filmmaker, who was best known for his William Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet and Strictly Ballroom soundtracks. He liked the words and set them to music on an album he titled Something For Everybody.

At seven minutes, the song was obviously too long. Enter Portland's KNRK where the seven-minute song was edited down to a much more workable four minutes and 30 seconds, and that's when the record took off.

Interesting too is Toronto Star writer Besty Powell's report in the March 16 edition, where she reveals that Alan Cross, on-air personality at Toronto's Edge 102.1, had actually included the single on his Air Canada in-flight radio program last summer. Powell quotes Cross, "I remember hearing it for the first time and thinking, this is different. And now, it's crossed over from newspaper to Internet to CD to airplane and now to radio."

Vancouver's JRFM joins RPM National Radio Report this week. The station's Music Director Mark Patric gives the Hit Pick nod to Shane Minor's *Slave To The Habit*. He adds three new releases this week: *Fool, I'm A Woman* by Sara Evans, Neil McCoy's *I Was* and Tim McGraw's *Please Remember Me*. Check out his Top 10 on the National Radio Report page.

The Dixie Chicks squeeze into the top slot with *You Were Mine*, a powerful track taken from their Monument album *Wide Open Spaces*. Their move was no doubt influenced by their recent Grammy wins as best country album and best country performance by a duo or group. Their album has also been a big winner at retail, registering #2 for the second week, just behind Shania Twain's *Come On Over*. No news on a follow-up single, but it's expected to go to radio shortly.

Universal Music's Chris Tripodi was right on the money when he predicted that newcomer Shane Minor had a hit with his first single. *Slave To The Habit*, a song written by Kostas, Toby Keith and Chuck Cannon, has been given a generous helping of spins by Canadian country programmers. The single, taken from his forthcoming self-titled album,

enters the chart this week at #83. Minor, a Californian, has quite an interesting history. He was a bull rider for a number of years and then a member of the Los Angeles police department for seven years before deciding to pursue a career in music. Fortunately, he was discovered by Dan Huff, who produced his album and who has engineered a number of sessions for Shania Twain. The promotion single includes an interview with Minor, some behind the scenes clips from his debut video and a visit to his former L.A.P.D. precinct.

Stephanie Beaumont has hit hard at radio with her latest single, *It's Not A Matter Of Love*, a song written by Nashville writers Damon Medic and Michael Ward. The single, entering the chart at #78, was taken from her *Way Over My Heart* release which was produced by Tom Harding and Jeffrey Steele. The album was recorded at Randall Prescott's Lakeside Studios in the Ottawa Valley. All tracks on the album qualify as two parts Cancon (AP).

Michelle Glover has been getting a healthy promotion hand from Ian McCallum's Starbiz, resulting in a chart happen for *I Don't Know Why*,

her second single which enters the chart at #91. The track was taken from her album *Where's The Fire*, produced and arranged by John K. Gulley. The song was written by Jerry Vandiver and Sandy Romos and qualifies as 100% Cancon. The album was recorded at The Power Plant in Barrie, Ontario and mixed at Toronto's Pizzazudio by engineer Michael Jack.

Amsterdam Music's Elisa Amsterdam is keeping close watch on increasing spins on Steve Fox's single *Why*, a Fox original. Amsterdam has made an impressive connection with country programmers across the country, many of them obviously impressed with Fox's single. Taken from his self-titled album which he produced, the single enters the RPM Country 100 this week at #83. Ever since Fox's showcases during Canadian Country Music Week last year, as well as the Folk Alliance in Albuquerque and Festivals and Events Ontario just a few weeks ago, Amsterdam has been chalking up some pretty exciting concert dates with his band and from songwriter workshops in a duo format and club and festival dates from Ottawa to Regina's Big

Hall of Honour and Hall of Fame join forces

There has been some confusion in the Canadian country music industry over the last few years as to the honouring of artists, songwriters, broadcasters and industry builders, whose Hall of Honour inductees were popularized by the Canadian Country Music Association.

Gary Buck, well known Canadian singer/songwriter and producer, founded his Canadian Country Music Hall of Fame in 1979, which also honours key figures in country music.

The confusion will now be eliminated as the two organizations have agreed to join forces as the Canadian Country Music Hall of Fame.

"We're delighted with this merger into one Hall," says CCMA president Tom Tompkins, "because it gives increased credibility and exposure to the annual awards that our industry gives to the people who make Canadian country music what it is today."

Tompkins also points out that efforts to find a permanent home for the Hall plaques were recently dashed when an Edmonton-based group were unable to obtain the financing for a proposed facility that was also to have housed a performance area and an exhibit hall.

Buck's organization however has been situated at various sites for its collection of exhibits and material on those artists it has honoured. After being

One will be presented to an artist and the other, The Stan Klees Industry Builder Award, will honour an individual's contribution to the Canadian country music business. These tributes will be presented in ceremonies prior to and during the annual telecast of the Canadian Country Music Awards.

Those plaques already awarded by the CCMA to inductees of the former Hall of Honour, as well as other memorabilia collected for the proposed facility in Edmonton, will be on permanent display in the Canadian Country Music Hall of Fame in Calgary.

"Having the CCMA joining with us in the Hall of Fame is a wonderful forward step," says Buck. "Together, we'll be united in our efforts to make the permanent home for country music in Canada a very special place -- both for the artists and business people who have been honoured -- and for the general public who will learn Canada's country music story by visiting us in Calgary."
