in addition to the tuning scales the dial also carries two visual indicators—on the left is located a cathoderay tuning device while on the right is an illuminated band-witch indicator.

#### MAIN CONTROLS

The controls, which are only four in number are accessibly placed, two of them being mounted on the front panel, while the other two are located on the righthand side panel. On the extreme left is a combined main switch and volume control while on the right is a tone control. Of the other two on the side panel, the top one is a special large sized flywheel type tuning knob and the lower one a five-position band-switch.

a five-position band-switch.

The volume and tone controls being continuous in action enable the latener to adjust the signal strength and tone quality to any desired level. The eight-watt pentode output stage provides generous power and the quality is remarkably free from harmonic distortion and blurring. We were particularly impressed with the good reproduction of planoforte tone which is an efficient test for clear quality.

As regards sensitivity the receiver maintains the high standard set by the manufacturers through their warlier models. The knife-edge selectivity reduces side band interference to the minimum. Separation of stations on adjacent wave lengths presents no difficulty as a result of which practically no station of any programme value is lost.

#### TECHNICAL FEATURES

The receiver is an A.C operated superhet incorporating the universal transformer with tappings for 110/240 volts 40/60 cycles supply, the rated consumption of the set being 85 watts. It is fitted with 'E' type metal valves which are: EF13, ECH11, EBF11. EFM11. EL12 and AZ12. There is a provision for directly connecting extension loud-speaker



Signal-to-noise ratio is high enough to give distant reception at good strength. The A.V.C. incorporated in the circuit works efficiently and no trouble is experienced on account of fading.

#### SCHOOL BROADCASTING

Radio as an educational aid is growing rapidly in popularity throughout the world. Its success has been so marked in the mental development of the young that it has, in a short time, become an established institution. In England, for example, over 6,000 schools are equipped with radio sets, and are regular listeners to the educational programmes specially arranged for them.

India has also realised the importance of school broadcasting, and special school programmes have been prepared at Delhi, Bombay, Calcutta and Madras, and are being transmitted regularly from these stations.

#### A CALCUTTA ACHIEVEMENT

THE Calcutta station decided to make an attempt to equip more Calcutta schools with receiving sets, and with this object in view, a concert was held at the New Empire Theatre on 29 November, under the title Radio-on-View, in which Calcutta's leading radio artists very kindly performed and helped to make the show the success it was. At the same time, a committee was formed to administer the funds accruing from the sale of tickets. This committee is

known as the School Broadcast Committee, with Sir Darcy Lindsay, C.B.E., as Chairman, the members being Khan Bahadur Tassaduq Ahmed, Assistant Director of Public Instruction; Khan Altaf Hussain, Director of Public Information; Mr J. R. Stapleton, Director, All India Radio, Calcutta; and Mr C. F. Hooper, Editor, Indian Radio Chronicle, the last also acting as Secretary and Treasurer.

After deducting all expenses, including the hire of the New Empire Theatre (which was rather heavy), the proceeds of the concert have been placed at the disposal of the School Broadcast Fund. The publicity obtained has been invaluable, and has added just the necessary fillip to further, still more, the cause of school broadcasting in Calcutta.


#### BENGAL GOVERNMENT'S INTEREST

MEANWHILE we are pleased to announce that the Government of Bengal have decided to equip eleven schools with receiving sets as an experiment. If this is found to be satisfactory, the equipment of other schools will be considered, and will be an important step forward.

As a result of the Station Director's application to Calcutta University for a grant towards school broadcasts, the University Syndicate at their meeting on 18 November decided to issue a circular letter to all recognised schools, and resolved that a committee consisting of the following members be appointed to consider the matter, and submit a report to the Syndicate:

The Hon'ble the Vice-Chancellor of the University; W. A. Jenkins Esq., D.Sc., Director of Public Instruction: Dr Syamaprasad Mookherjee. M.A., B.L., M.L.A.; J. R. Stapleton Esq., Director, All India Radio, Calcutta.

The Educational Department of the Calcutta Corporation have also been approached in the matter, and it is hoped that they too will undertake, in the near future, to equip their model schools with receiving sets as an experiment.

#### RADIO-ON-VIEW

ND now a word about the show itself. As the title Radio-on-View suggests, the stage of the New Empire Theatre represented a broadcasting studio, complete with announcer's desk and headphones, red and white signalling lamps, a clock on the wall, and a grand piano with, of course, the all-important microphone. From start to finish, each artist was announced exactly as if really broadcasting, which in fact was actually what they were doing. Andy Gemmell as the 'Mae West of the East' brought the house down, and mention must be made of the 'Garstin Plate', for which a lucky draw was held. The winner of the race was 'Radio Calcutta', ably piloted home by Aileen Pallot, while 'New Delhi' was a close second, ridden by Freda Gray.

The stage management was ably carried out by Messrs C. Hart and C. V. Mundy, and the whole show produced and compèred by L. G. E. Clarke, the Director of European Programmes, Calcutta.

This show is the first of its kind put on the boards in aid of Indian education, and all who took part in it deserve our warmest thanks.

#### A FAMOUS INDIAN OPERA

INDRA SABHA, the earliest Urdu musical comedy, recently broadcast from the Delhi station, has provided material for speculation by literary critics. Apart from its literary value, however, it is excellent entertainment, and on 11 January, Lucknow will broadcast this famous opera at 9.45 p.m. It is interesting to quote what Ram Babu Saksena says about it in A History of Urdu Literature:

'The earliest Urdu drama extant is the Indra Sabha, composed by Amanat, a pupil of the celebrated poet Nasikh and a courtier of Wajid Ali Shah who wrote it, it is said, at the instance of his master. The courtiers and companions of Wajid Ali Shah were always devising new means to afford amusement, diversion and fun to their gay master. One of the French companions

#### A RESOURCEFUL PARI

HE play opens with the scene of Raja Indra's Court, the Indra Sabha proper, in which Raja Indra is shown seated on a gorgeous throne in a magnificent hall with rows of courtiers on either side and two Deos, Lal Deo and Kala Deo in attendance. Paris are then introduced one by one: Pukhraj Pari of topaz resplendence comes first, Nilam Pari of sapphire hue next, the Lal Pari of ruby lustie, and last but not the least appears Sabz Pari of emerald sheen, the heroine of the play. Each of these Paris in succession, dressed in gorgeous costumes, entertains the audience with a rich variety of dances and songs, i.e. ghazals, chhands, thumris, basants, dhan bahar, holi, sawan and choubola and then the curtain falls. In the second scene, Sabz Pari, who had fallen in love with a mortal named Gulfam (Rose face), takes Kala Deo in her confidence and asks him to transport her beloved from the mundane regions to her boudoir. Kala Deo complies with her request and then follows an interesting and enlivening scene of the advances of Sabz Pari and rebuffs of the young prince. So much is the Pari enamoured of Gulfam that she on his insistent demands takes him to see the Court of Indra where his presence is detected, and as a punishment for intrusion is thrown into a well to die, and the Pari is exiled with her wings clipped. The Pari is, however, full of resource, and burning for her beloved, disguises herself as a jogin and charms the ear of Indra with her enchanting melodies. She is allowed to name her own gift as a reward for her enthralling songs and she throws off her disguise, disclosing her identity, and asks for Gulfam with whom she is is united in a further dazzling scene of dance and song.

### THE LISTENER'S QUESTION BOX

#### Technical Difficulties Solved

Listeners are invited to write to the Editor about their radio troubles.

Q.—My 'Masterpiece VI' 21 valves recently has aeveloped the following:—I have 4 pdeliety positions. For Lahore which is the best station I like I used to get it full clear and loud when volume control was full 'ON' and at such times the magic eye was just a thin black line. Now the irouble has started as follows: As soon as I come to operate the volume control over the 6th point the magic eye broadens with a slipping noise and this makes the volume go down. I then set it again to thin black line but as soon as I increase volume to 7th point the set fails to carry. 'I am fond of largest volume'.

A.—Your neighbours have my sincerest sympathy if you listen to Lahore with the volume full ON with a 21-valve set. However, I at first thought that the volume control may be at fault but I now find that there are several complicated factors which may cause your trouble. Your set is specially made to conform to customers' requirements and is what is known as 'Custom built'. Fortunately I am in possession of full service details and diagram of your particular model. My advice is that an expensive set such as yours should be attended to by a fully qualined engineer. If you will put the set in the hands of such an engineer I may be able to assist and advise him if you will ask him to communicate with me.

Q.—I have a 4-valve Hetro radio in which I receive 60-metre performance of Delhi as well as Calcutta and Bombay but all the three stations get mixed up and Calcutta and Bombay sometimes get feeble. Will you please let me know as to whether Calcutta can be separated and kept constant, and how?

A.—Your set suffers from the fact that it has no radio frequency amplifying stage and is, therefore, not very selective. The selectivity could be improved by fitting a R.F. stage but that would be a job for an engineer. You could try fitting a 'wave trap' details of which I shall be glad to send you if you are prepared for the added expenditure. There is nothing you can do about the fading as the automatic volume control on such a small set is incapable of holding the signal constant.

Q.—My R C A 7-valve Super-Heterodyne AC Radio works well for a few seconds when put on. Then it clicks and stops. When the power is turned off and valves have cooled a little, if I turn it on again it works for a few seconds and again turns off.

A.—I suspect the rectifying valve. You should have it tested. It is probable that after the filament has become hot it expands and short circuits itself and in consequence it becomes inoperative. When the set is switched off the filament cools down and is ready for momentary work again. Leave the

set switched on for a while and see if the station fades in again. If it does, the fault is undoubtedly the rectifier.

Q.—On Sunday evening I heard a station broadcasting European music just near Daventry on the 13-metre band. Can you identify the station please.

A.—Station WaxE, New York.

Q.—I own a Philips 360B.1 1938 model. The reception is very clear in the evenings after about 5.30 p.m. while the school broaucast on the medium waves is not at all audible. On no day have I been able to get Delhi school broadcast on 338.6 metres while the evening broadcast on the same wavelength is wonderfully loud, likewise reception of Madras on medium wave. My place is a village in Puri District and the question of local disturbance during the daytime does not arise. I am very keen on school broadcasts.

A.—I am atraid it would have to be a very good set to receive Delhi in Puri on medium wave during daylight, it is an unfortunate phenomenon about which we can do nothing and is due to distance and seasonal conditions. Why not try to receive the educational programmes from Delhi on 31.3 and 19.8 metres? Both of these wavelengths are used in addition to 338.6 metres.

Q.—I have a Philips Radio set type 472U, meaium and long-wave, super inductance. Please let me know if I can receive 60 metres

A.—I am afraid the only solution to your difficulty is to use a short-wave converter. You would then be able to receive all short-wave stations.

Q.—One of my customers has a faulty set which fades out when the chassis is touched. I have been unable to find the fault and shall be glad of assistance.

A.—I presume the set is an American one which uses '45 output valves? You will find a .01 mfd condenser connected between the detector anode and the grid of the first audio frequency amplifier. Replace this condenser and all will be well.

Q.—My set is suffering from very bad booming noises at loud volume so that I have to sit with my hand on the tuning controls when listening. I. recently cleaned my set and the trouble dates from that time.

A.—When you cleaned the set you probably put the chassis too far forward in its cabinet. The chassis should be permitted to 'float' on its rubber cushions, the securing bolts should not be screwed up tight and no part of the chassis should be in direct mechanical contact with the cabinet. Make sure that all valves are firm in their sockets, that the chassis is free to 'bounce' on the rubber pads and that the front of the chassis or dial is not touching the cabinet.

### YOUR RADIO TROUBLE

WE notice that the Listeners' Question Box which has appeared in the last two issues is becoming a popular feature. Many readers have sent us a description of the difficulties they experience with their radio sets with the request that advice may be given to them on how to put them right. These letters are being dealt with in rotation and replies to them will be published in The Indian Listener, so that the advice may be available for general information. It would, however, assist our technical expert in diagnosing listeners' difficulties if the following points are covered in their letters:

- i. Model number and year.
- 2. Used on AC or DC.
- 3. Number of valves.
- . What is the trouble?
- 5. Did the trouble appear suddenly or gradually?
- 6. Has the set been repaired before?
- 7. Do you know what the previous fault was?
- 8. Do you use a gramophone pick up?
- 9. Is the gramophone side of the set still O.K.?
- 10. How long have you had your present valves?
- 11. Approximately how many hours is the set used each day?
- 12. Has the set been cleaned out recently?
- 13. Was it cleaned by yourself or a serviceman?
- 14. Has any serviceman tried to find the fault?



THE CREAKING DOOR

They tried cheap shoes, wood rubbed against wood, violin keys, but nothing proved satisfactory except a 'Pakhawaj'. When its leather straps were tightened and pulled together as shown and released slowly they gave the required sound.

### THE GENIUS OF MOZART

By J. G. N. Brown

This sketch of a great European composer, whose music is frequently broadcast from A 1 R stations, will be of interest to Indian usteners.

MOZART worked, as few men have worked since, hard, long and incessantly. He died young, at thirty-six, and was buried in a pauper's grave, but he also started young, at the age of four. He started to learn to play the violin partly because his tather was a professional violinist, but chiefly because he was unhappy, poor and with nothing else to do.

The house that he was born in was a miserable place in a poor quarter of Salzburg in Austria. To-day it is called Mozart's House, where tourists from all over the world go to look at souvenirs of the great man. Picture post-cards of it are sold, tea shops are named after him, guides and hotels swarm, which shows that genius has a commercial

value, at least posthumously.

Mozart's genius, however, had an immediate value which his father was quick to see. The young Mozart was a clever pupil and at six years of age he could play the violin well even in comparison with a grown man, and also the organ. So his father decided to give up his own career as a violinist and to become his son's manager, arranging for him to appear in public. They went to Vienna where the Empress heard Mozart play and was very impressed. Partly because of this but also because Mozart was performing feats never since equalled by one so young, the aristocracy of Vienna took notice and he was an immediate success. He was proudly exhibited everywhere and had his portrait painted.

He was next taken by his father for a grand tour of Germany where he performed new tricks and was enthusiastically received everywhere. Then he went to Brussels and then to Paris. Everywhere he was acclaimed by the aristocracy, concerts were well attended and private performances well

OZART worked, as few men have rewarded but the expenses of the tour did not leave much profit and with nowhere else to go Mozart's father decided to go to England.

Even here, however, Mozart was a great success. He performed before the King and earned one hundred pounds in an hour. With true British scepticism, he was thoroughly examined by experts to see that there was no take, but the experts could only find proof for his unbelievable technical ability and virtuosity. His composition, however, was still poor.

The strain of travelling and arranging concerts was telling on his father, who fell ill. They went to Holland, where his father was again ill, to Paris where he performed before royalty and then back to Salzburg in 1766 after three and a half years' absence. Mozart was now eleven.

After six months they returned to Vienna where a royal marriage was to take place. There were more performances and Mozart caught small pox and nearly died. He had started composing by now with great technical sureness but little invention. He even wrote a small opera which was produced at the country house of Dr Mesmer whose name was the foundation of 'mesmerism'. Mozart did not go to school, but composed a good deal-minuets, serenades, opera and other popular music, and he still took lessons from his father. They went to Italy where they were received in the usual way, with hospitality and praise in spite of the local musicians who intrigued against Mozart, because he was beginning to grow up and to stand on his own merits rather than by his age.

Back in Vienna, he and his father went to witness a public function for which they had been given seats in the grand stand. They arrived too late and fortuntly were not admitted. Later the grand stand collapsed and over lifty people were killed.


Back in Salzburg, he was commissioned, at sixteen, to write the music for the festivals by the archbishop. He went to Bavaria and was a success at the Bavarian court. Meanwhile a new and severe archbishop had been appointed at Salzburg who did not encourage composition of any but religious music, and the struggles of Mozart began. At the same time he composed, at twenty-one, his first truly significant work, the piano concerto in E that major.

He set out to tour Germany with his mother only this time, because his father was in the employ of the Archbishop who would not release him. In Germany Mozart met and fell in love with Alovsis Weber but his father who still controlled his movements by letter sent him to Paris. He gave his son shrewd advice, to see other composers as little as possible and to keep out of controversies. In Paris, his mother died. He was poor and friendless and had to return to Salzburg to accept a position as organist, which his father had intrigued to gain his son for the assured income, but against his will.

Mozart could not be expected to confine himself to the religious music his position demanded and after a number of quarrels, he left the service of the Archbishop and went to Vienna for good in 1781. This move must have appeared as madness to his father and they quarrelled by letter. Because he knew nobody else, he lodged with the Webers, the family of the girl he had fallen in love with in Germany. That the girl behaved badly to him there is no doubt, but it is doubtful that Mozart was ever really in love with her. His preoccupation with music and the wide travelling of his youth precluded him from serious love. There is sentiment in his music but not sentimentality. In actual fact he married Constance Weber, one of the sisters, and the marriage was a success, in spite of the almost ashamed letter he wrote to his father announcing it. This marriage was the final blow to his father who saw that his influence had gone and that his son had once more lessened his chance of becoming a financially successful musician.

Meanwhile Mozart was composing assiduously, taking pupils, working hard and quickly, and trying to get a position at the Austrian court. Only in the latter did he fail. It was typical of him that he wrote a great and significant piece of music while his wife was in the throes of child-bearing. His home life was happy, but they had no money.

This was the most creative period of his life, culminating in the opera Figaro, which, however, was not a success. Mozart was now very poor and with two babies to support, but his opera Don Giovanni was in Prague and was such a success that it resulted in a minor appointment and a regular but very small salary. But this respite was short. When Don Giovanni was presented in Vienna it was a failure. By now Mozart was thoroughly in debt and beginning to write pitiable begging letters. He had one or two particularly generous friends to whom he appealed time after time until they no longer answered his letters, but his music shows no trace of this humiliation and distress.

An opportunity arose and he went to Germany. Here he was a success, received by the King, and with his concerts well attended, but the profits of the tour were soon gone in paying debts and in paying for his wife who was ill and again about to have a child.

He returned to Vienna. There was a busy year in front of him. His recent success in Germany spurred him on to fresh efforts, but his eagerness to get money made it impossible for him to be offered adequate remuneration and publishers and producers took advantage of his situation.

The King of Bohemia was to be crowned at Prague and Mozart set off to produce an opera there, starting work in the carriage. He had eighteen days in which to compose and produce it, and as a result it was a failure. He returned to Vienna in poor health and terribly exhausted.

The Magic Flute was produced. This opera was written for a wide public, just as a pantomime is written in these days. It was composed from popular tunes of the moment. It is probably the only really great piece of music written with one purpose, to please everybody. The opera was a success in spite of a poor cast. It was typical that Mozart's name was only mentioned in a note to the

At the end of the year Mozart's wife went away for the sake of her health, and Mozart himself set to work on the Requiem. Some time before a stranger had commissioned Mozart to compose a Requiem. It was to be paid for generously on condition that Mozart did not tell anyone of its commission. So range was this visit that Mozart became Nobsessed with the idea that it was an omen. He worked at it frantically in between days of fainting fits and terrible depression. He felt that he would never live to complete it. Actually the commission was from a nobleman who dabbled in music and wished to produce a composition that would be considered a great work and realised that the only way he could would be to buy it ready made. But Mozart did not live to finish the Requiem. In December 1791, he died for no known reason. He was buried without examination or enquiry in a pauper's grave and even the site of the grave is now unknown.

Mozart was only thirty-six when he died, but it is difficult to see what more he could have produced had he lived. His music was ully matured. Already he had produced a arger body of work than many twice his age,

### THE WONDERS OF WIRELESS

By 'Trouble Shooter'

The fourth article of a series for the layman.

THE next and last stage consists of the output. There are numerous types of output stages in practical use, but it is sufficient to say here that this is the stage which gives the final punch and purity to the reception and, if it is well designed, produces as near as possible a true reproduction from the loudspeaker as is the input to the microphone at the distant studio.

Some receivers have more than one loudspeaker. I know of one receiver which has five speakers of different sizes, others use a main speaker and a crystal 'Tweeter'. All the various combinations are calculated to produce purity of reproduction by handling various bands of frequencies and preventing cut-off of high and low frequencies.

The loudspeakers are of different types. Some years ago the popular speaker was the horn type which consisted of an oversize in telephone receivers, the large diaphragm of which was caused to vibrate and the sound from which was amplified by a horn. Then there was the cone type which consisted of a paper cone connected by a thin rod to a magnetic reed which vibrated between the poles of an electro-magnet. Later came the electro-static speaker which was really a large condenser composed of two large metal sheets to which a high initial potential was applied, but which could not be incorporated in a small receiver cabinet. Finally came the electro-dynamic or moving coil speaker, the voice coil of which either drives a cone or is used with an exponential horn.

There are several different types of moving coil speakers, the most common in use being the permanent magnet type, the magnetic field in which the cone moves being produced by means of a permanent magnet.

Then there is the mains energised type, the magnetic field being produced by an electromagnet, this magnet also serves as a mains choke in many receivers. Some mains energised speakers are made for direct connection to the mains, those for AC mains incorporate their own rectifier.

The methods of supplying the high tension current and filament heating current to the receiver varies considerably.

1. The 'Battery set' as it was originally termed depended upon an L.T. accumulator for filament heating and an H. T. battery. The H. T. battery could consist of dry cells, small accumulators, or Le Clanche cells. Receivers employing such power supplies were the favourites of home constructors and are still made commercially for districts in

which there is no electrical energy available.

2. There is the DC eliminator which replaces the H. T. battery when the battery set is used on DC mains. It consists of a smoothing arrangement of chokes and condensers and voltage dropping resistors.

3. Another power supply for use with a battery set consists of an AC rectifier for use on AC mains and can consist of a valve of metal rectifier, with or without a transformer. It is still necessary to use an L. T. battery for filament heating.

4. The DC receiver is so made that it can be connected directly to the DC mains and supplies both H.T. and L.T. to the set, and no other batteries are required.

5. The AC/DC universal receiver is one which can be connected to AC or DC mains without alteration and should not be confused with the AC receiver which can be driven from DC mains by use of an inverter.

6. The AC receiver which requires an AC source of supply for its operation. This AC source need not necessarily come from AC mains but may be produced by:

(a) A rotary convertor, which is really a DC motor coupled to an AC generator, sometimes both windings being on one shaft. The DC side of the converter is connected to the DC mains and the AC side to the receiver.

(b) A vibrator inverter which rapidly interrupts the DC supply to which it is connected, and by means of a transformer produces AC to operate the set. Some manufacturers incorporate built-in vibrator systems which are remarkably silent in operation. It can be disconnected for AC operation if necessary.

(c) A vibrator inverter which draws its DC supply from a 6 volt car battery. This latter type is used with what are now called 'Battery' sets.

There is one other item which is commonly found in DC and AC/DC universal receivers. The Barretter or Ballast or Regulator Valve. It is not a valve, in the sense that it has absolutely no effect upon the signal from a radio point of view, but is used to keep the filament current constant when the voltage of the mains fluctuates or is greater than the voltage drop across the filament circuits

There are other versions of the superheterodyne receiver such as the double receiver, in which there are two different I.F. and three detectors, and then there is the diversity receiver which is really two separate receivers fed by two aerials spaced some distance apart, and is used to counteract fading when signals are secured for re-broadcast purposes. If nothing more, it is hoped that these notes will at least help some listeners to gain some idea of the parts comprising their receivers, and perhaps will instill in them a desire to learn more,





Each country in the world has its own great rivers which, in the course of time, have become a link between the present and the past. Rivers that have acquired definite—sometimes superhuman—in some cases even inhuman personality, according to the memories that are associated with them and the environment that have lent them their peculiar characteristics.

By Jamini Kanto Sen Indian sculptors, as seen through the ages, have not attached much importance either to the pure and simple symmetry of form or to the satisfaction of the intellect—ideals which inspired the classical sculptors of Europe and their descendants of to-day. 





He was the first to sound a note of reality in the existing conventionalities of the Lucknow school of poetry. Anis verses are remarkable for their sweetness, elegance and fresnness of diction. In Urdu literature he introduced the epic element which till then had been neglected. His marsias are masterpieces which are unequalled for the depiction of emotions and feelings. Anis died at Lucknow in A.D. 1874 and was buried in his own house.



The bassoon is the bass of the wood-wind and is a double reed instrument. Its conical tube originally presented difficulties for wind instrumentalists but afterwards Continental manufacurers managed to make a double tubing. Hence its Italian name 'Fagotto', from its resemblance to a faggot. Its extensive compass has given composers the opportunity of writing difficult passages which on other instruments would be impossible. Mozart has written a concerto for the bassoon but Haydn thoroughly understood the resources of the bassoon and his scores abound with music for that instrument. Weber has ingeniously used two bassoons. Wagner in his later works has employed three and now modern musicians write scores with four bassoons in their instrumentations.





The precise meaning of the word 'Culture' is not clear. Dictionaries may be satisfied with the statement that it denotes 'refinement' which in turn means 'fineness of taste or feeling or manners, but the question specifically put, 'Is it a fact?' Cannot get a really satisfying and reasoned answer. Quite conceivably it may be called a conspiracy, a conspiracy among those with vested interests to more firmly entrench themselves behind their last remaining defences, and to give a semblance of justification for the 'stake in life' that they alone happen to possess. Culture in this view, is an imposition of a form accepted by the few who are in power. Again, the War of 1914 started, we were told, in origin as a protest against the imposition of a 'Kultur' by Wilhelm II on the rest of the world thought it worth while to sacrifice millions of lives in an effort to protect its own culture.
