Broadcasting During the Fourteen Days.

WITH the sudden and almost complete cessation of printed news during the first few days of the emergency, broadcasting immediately came to occupy a position of unprecedented importance in the life of the nation as the sole general channel of communication for news, official and otherwise. It is not easy to estimate what would have been the effect of the strike if there had been no such thing as wireless communication. For one thing, the whole country might have been a prey to panic. Even as it was, a large part of our service was devoted to tracking down and slaving false and dangerous rumours. 0 0 0

It was stated in some quarters that the B.B.C. had been commandeered by the Government. This was not the case actually or literally, though under the Emergency Regulations the Government would have been well within their powers if they had taken over Sayov Hill and the whole organization beyond, and had made broad-casting an official medium altogether, comparable with The British Gatelle We were bound, as we always have been bound, by the terms of the Licence under which we work, to act as a channel for official announcements, and during the strike these were received from various sources in the Government and when broadcast were duly announced as such. Even here in some cases, our advice as to their form and denvery was invited and accepted.

4 4 That the Government abstained from taking the drastic step of definitely commandeering the B.B.C. was probably due to their realization that the B.B.C. could

be trusted and that the confidence and goodwill which it had built up during there and a half years, through its record of sincrity and impertuality, was an asset to the cause of good citizenship not lightly to be discarded. Complete impartiality during the emergency was, in the circumstance, not to be expected. But we endeavoured throughout the emergency to preserve our tradition of accuracy and law play

This is, of course only a partial account of our steward-inp during the emergency, and we are more than grateful for the stream of encouraging messages received from our vest andience of listeners everywhere.
