



Fighting fit Billy Fury finds that beat songs are back

BILLY FURY sounded happy and relaxed on the tele-D phone last Friday shortly before setting out for his Cardiff date with the Larry Parnes autumn package show. "I feel great," he said. "I didn't like that road accident at all, and it finished my car for good, but there aren't any


