The States? Eden's not so sure

EDEN KANE's "Boys L. Cry" which this week moves up to 7 in the Top Thirty, is being released on Fontana in the States this week and it's on the cards Eden will be asked to go over there for a tour if it's a hit. BUT HE'S NOT KEEN!

"I'd like to go there again," said Eden, "but Pm a little doubtful about it really, Even if 'Boys Cry' does take off, I'm not sure it would be a good idea.

"So many one-hit American artists come over here on the strength of their disc, and die a death. I certainly don't want to do that in the States. I'd really like to go over there with at least three definite hits to pave the way."

A hit record after two years in the doldrums outside the charts is a real tonic. "Boys Cry" has restored Eden Kane to the limelight, and he's one boy who certainly isn't cryling these days.

"And you know I didn't even want to do 'Boys Cry' when I first heard it," he told me.

"CAN'T BUY ME LOVE" is going to be The Beatles' most fantastic disc ever, and it could even earn them THREE Gold Discs within a week of its release here on March 20! For at the beginning of this week advance orders in America and Britain alone stood at the fantastic figure of TWO AND A HALF MILLION—and they're still coming in!

At EMPs headquarters in London a spokesman told DISC that America was getting first bite at the new single—its release date there is March 16—and that by Monday advance orders had hit one million seven hundred thousand with every chance of the TWO

MILLION mark being reached before the actual release date.

The disc will be released in Britain the Friday afterwards, and by the beginning of this week orders had reached the staggering figure of nearly NINE HUNDRED THOUSAND.

This puts The Beatles in a class of their own. No one has got anywhere near this figure in Britain, and although Presley has twice beaten a million—with "Love Me Tender" and "Stuck On You"—in the States, The Beatles have now easily outstripped him.

On the Saturday and Sunday before the disc's U.S. release The Beatles are reported to be starring in a 90-minute nationwide closed-circuit TV Spectacular. The show will be taken by 100 theatres right across the country and will feature The Beach Boys and Lesley Gore for 15 minutes each and The Beatles for an hour.

THIS Saturday, March 14, is the first day you will be able to hear the new Beatles' disc on the air. It is scheduled to be played on "Juke Box Jury" and "Thank Your Lucky Stars," and on Sunday you can hear it in Alan Freeman's "Pick Of The Pops."

ACE REVIEWER DON NICHOLL WRITES ..

Recorded on George's 21st!

THE new Beatles single was produced like a serial story—it opened in Paris, continued in America and finished in London.

While the boys were starring at the Olympia, Paris, they recorded the instrumental track for "You Can't Do That." Then in Miami, despite the frantic pressure of their visit to the States, John and Paul found time to write "Can't Buy Me Lova".

Back in London the song was recorded on George Harrison's 21st birthday! "He was really having a ball, too," says Beatles publisher Dick James, "because it was the first chance he'd had to record with the £300 12-string guitar which he bought in the States. He throroughly enjoyed himself twanging and incorporating different effects."

At this session also John Lennon's voice was overdubbed to complete the B side they'd done in Paris.

AND NOW A REVIEW COMMENT ON THE HIT THAT'S A FOREGONE CONCLUSION:

THE BEATLES—Can't Buy Me Love; You Can't Do That (Parlophone R 5114)—"Can't Buy Me Love" is a large noise, a thumping good side with Paul leading the vocal on a forceful chant. The guitar sound, using George's 12-string lead is exciting and often new.

There is one short burst of screaming but none of the old trademark of falsetto "oohs" and "yeah-yeahs," which is probably wise.

John Lennon's singing on the middle-paced "You Can't Do That" achieves a "rough" quality that is interesting though the song itself isn't quite up to the usual songwriting standard of Paul and himself.
