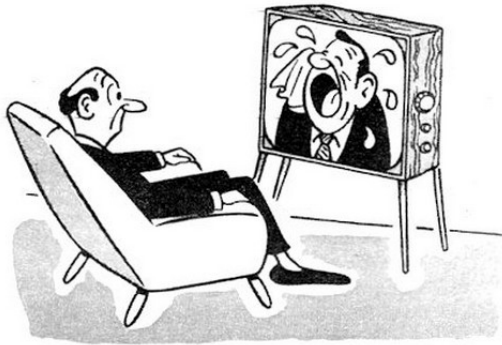

Celtic, with Rangers, are the 'aristocrats' of Scottish football. They have been Scottish League Champions twenty-seven times (with the latest success this season). They have won the Scottish League Cup seven times and have triumphed in the Scottish Cup on no less than twenty-two occasions.

Wizard winger Jimmy is the idol of the crowd at Celtic's Parkhead ground. He is twenty-seven years old and his entire footballing career has been spent in Celtic's green-and-white hooped colours, since his first appearance in March, 1963. He scored his one-hundredth goal for the club this season.

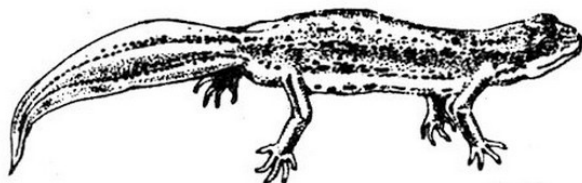
This season, Celtic brought off the Scottish double, winning the League Championship and beating Hibernian by six goals to one in the Scottish Cup Final.

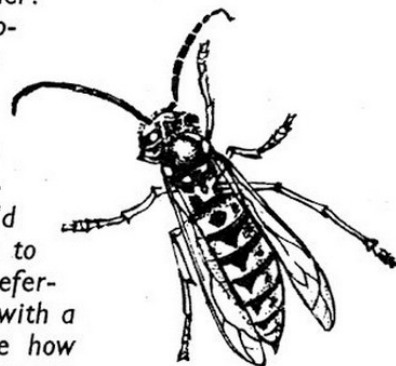


Female smooth newt and egg.

The common wasp.

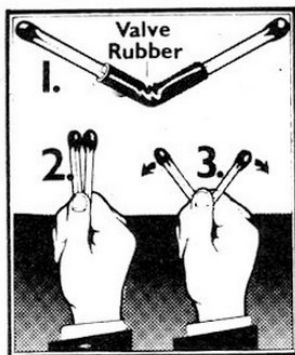
Before you start, here's a little tip. It is best to be systematic in your 'field detection'. Try investigating hedgerows first, then woodland, commons and meadowland.

Spooky Matches



You need a couple of matches and a piece of cycle valve rubber, about 1½ inches long. Insert the bottom ends of the matches into the rubber tube until they meet (figure 1).

Then fold the matches to-

gether and hold them firmly between thumb and forefinger—keeping the rubber tube concealed (figure 2).

Now wave your other hand around the matches and slowly relax the pressure on the valve rubber. The matches will open out in a very spooky and mysterious manner (figure 3).

Copy Cat

Here's a marvellous way to transfer pictures and drawings from a newspaper on to white paper.

Make a mixture of water and turpentine—four parts of water to one of turpentine—add a tiny piece of soap, and shake the mixture well until the soap has

completely dissolved.

Lay the newspaper that you want to copy on a hard flat surface and moisten it with some of the liquid, using a small piece of sponge. Then lay a sheet of white paper on top and rub it hard all over with the back of a spoon. The result will be a perfect copy of the print and picture—in reverse of course. It works best with a fresh newspaper.

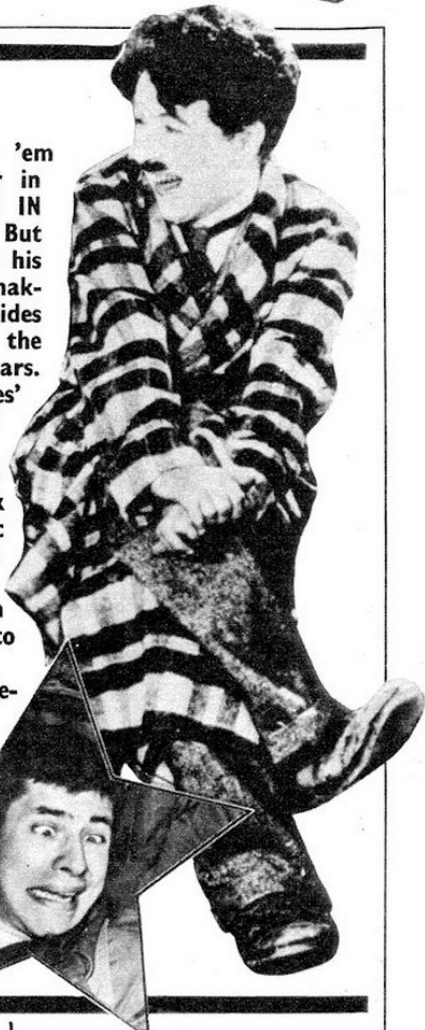
Side-splitters and Rib-tickers

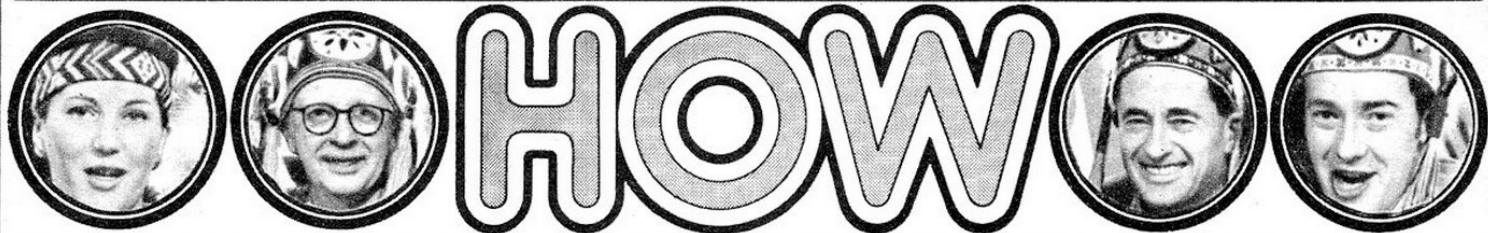

HOW old are the oldest playing cards and who invented card games?

It is thought that the Chinese invented playing cards, Jill. The earliest reference we have to them dates back to A.D. 969. But hundreds of years before that the Chinese used paper money which looked so like their playing cards that no one knows when the two sorts merged. Early cards were often used for fortune-telling as well as for games.

The cards reached Europe around the 14th century, either carried by wandering gypsies or by Crusaders returning from wars in the East—if not by both methods. As to the oldest cards, there are some in existence in museums which date back to the early days of card-playing in 15th-century Europe.



HOW did the term 'flying carpet' come into use and was there really such a 'vehicle'?

Flying or magic carpets—worthless to look at, but capable of taking anyone who sat on one of them anywhere the lucky passenger wanted to go—are part of the folklore of the East.

There is a famous one in the story of Prince Ahmed in *The Arabian Nights*, and an even more splendid example is described in the Mohammedan *Koran*. This carpet belonged to Solomon and was made of green silk. It carried him, his palace and all his army on it. The *How!* team feels safe in stating that there was never a real flying carpet—more's the pity!

HOW was gas invented and who discovered it?

Gas was not 'invented', Billy: it was always there. We cannot say for certain who discovered it. There are many claims, all of them dating from the 17th and

18th centuries. John Clayton, the Rector of Corfton near Wakefield, lit some coal gas around 1684, though details of his feat were not published for many years. He had found some gas burning on the ground, collected some and lit it with a candle. He seems to have been the first to discover gas. But we are not prepared to swear to it!

HOW and why do we hiccup?

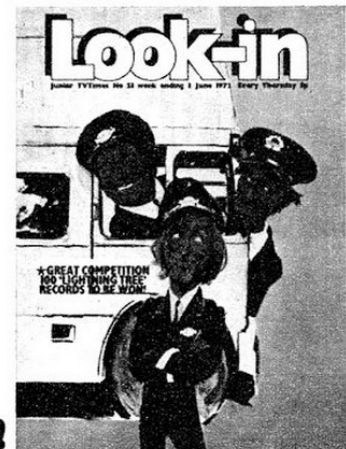
Hiccups are caused when one's larynx—that part of the throat where the vocal chords are located—tightens up and closes suddenly so that air is prevented from passing into the

lungs. The hiccups often begin when the diaphragm—the part of the body separating the stomach from the chest, which is part of the breathing system—gets irritated. A wind-filled stomach may cause this irritation, or hunger or hot food. Everyone has his own pet cure for the hiccups. But, unfortunately, it usually fails to work!

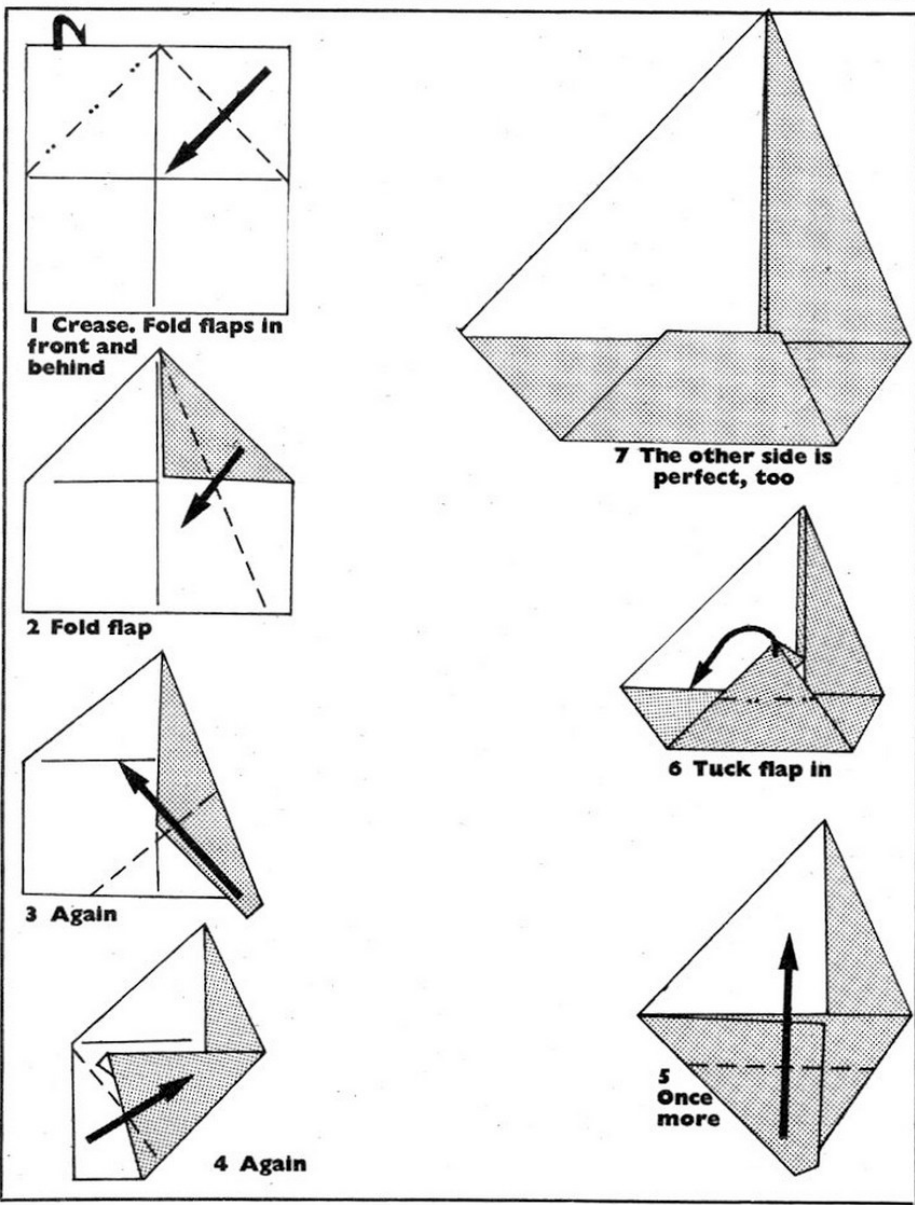

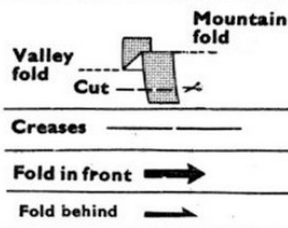

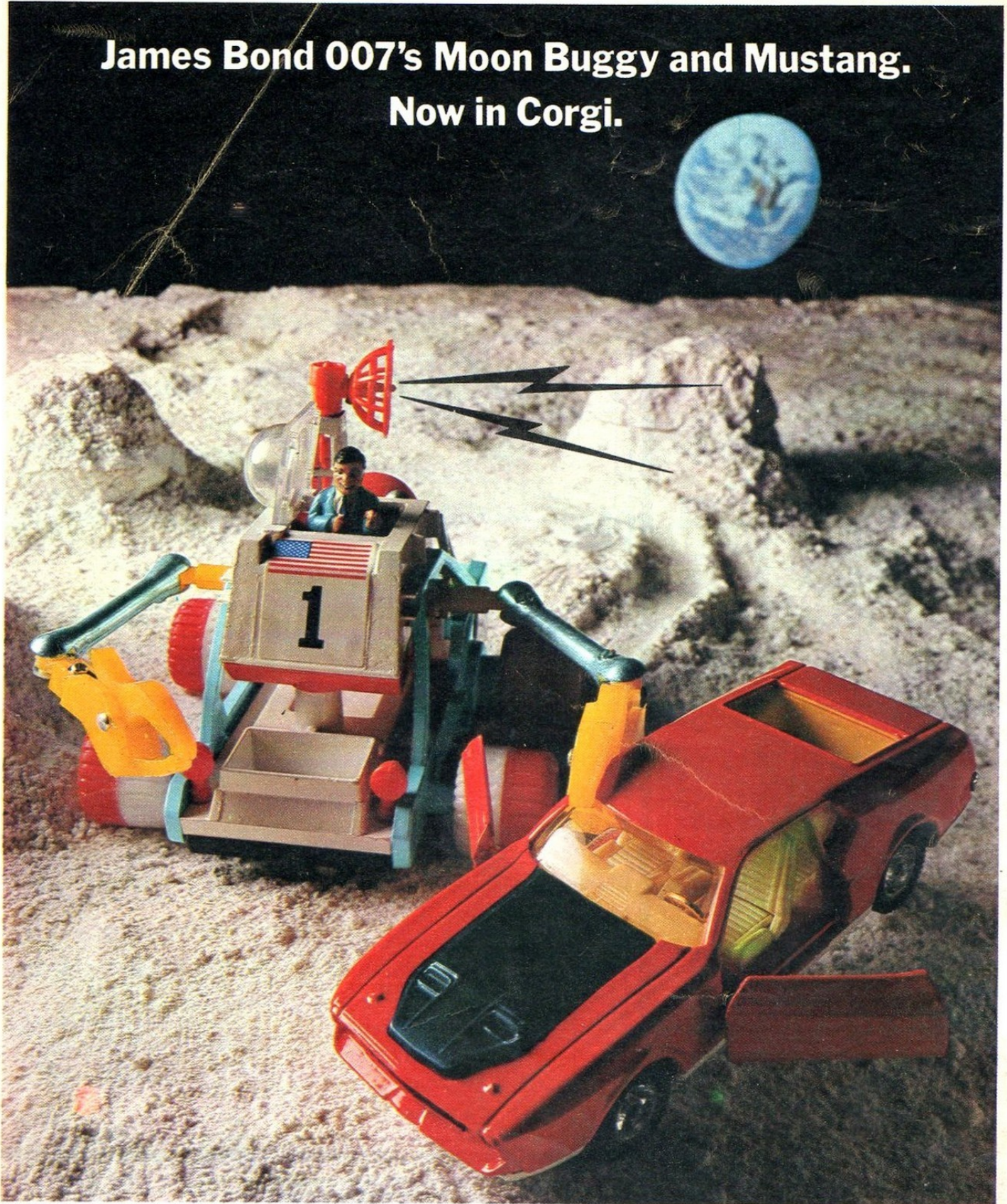
