


### No-bake Sweets

1 lb. (400 g) icing sugar 1 teaspoon glycerine 2 small egg whites oil of peppermint vegetable colourings

Sift the icing into a basin. Add the glycerine. Beat the egg whites and add a little at a time to the icing sugar to make a firm paste. Add the oil of peppermint and any colouring you like. Knead the paste until smooth on a board sprinkled with icing sugar. Roll the mixture to a ¼in. (1cm) thickness. Cut out the shapes using small shaped cutters and place each shape on baking sheets dusted with icing sugar until they harden.

You can serve them after dinner, or give these sweets as presents. Makes about 30 sweets.

There are lots of the fish on the fish-mongers' slabs and often they aren't named. Here I show you what to look for and when to buy three species of White Fish.

HADDOCK Belongs to the same species as Cod and is plentiful. It is expensive but its flavour is very delicate. Best between November and February. Bake, steam, grill, fry or noach it.

PLAICE A flat fish with an orange-spotted brown skin. Not so fine a flavour as a Dover sole but can be used instead, and it's fairly cheap. Best from June to January. Bake, steam, poach, grill or fry it.

DOVER SOLE Usually considered to have the finest flavour of all the white fish. It is expensive but available all year round. Grill on the bone or peach it and serve with a white sauce.
