



Below: The female part of 'The Feet'-left to right, Victoria and Kathy.





VEGETABLES 1

It's not always easy to recognize vegetables at the greengrocers, particularly those which have a short season or are not well known. These pictures will help you to identify some vegetables and the captions give you the ways to prepare and cook them.



Potatoes. New potatoes should be scraped to remove the skin or simply scrubbed to remove loose flakes of skin and cooked in boiling, salted water for about 20 minutes. They are usually served whole with a piece of butter. You can add mint to the water when cooking them.

Carrots. Cut off tops and roots. Scrape if young and peel thinly when old. Cut into slices; leave whole if very tiny. Rinse them. Cook in boiling, salted water for 20 minutes until tender. Can be served with a white sauce.



Cauliflower. Cut off stalk and damaged leaves. Wash the white part. Cook whole in boiling, salted water for 10-15 minutes. Serve with a cheese or white sauce. The white part can be broken into small pieces for cooking.

Onions. Skin them and leave whole. Cook in just enough water to cover them. Cook for 45 minutes to 1 hour in boiling, salted water. Usually chopped and used for flavouring stews and casseroles.



Cabbage. Remove damaged leaves. Cut into quarters. Wash well and shred coarsely. Wash again and put in pan with the water clinging. Cook for 5-7 minutes adding water only if cabbage sticks. Never use bicarbonate of soda.

Cookery Words



BEATING. To beat is to mix well together usually using a wooden spoon. A sauce is beaten to mix the milk with the butter and flour. SCRAMBLING EGGS. Allow one egg per person. Beat the eggs in a basin with a good pinch of salt and pepper to season. Melt a knob of butter about the size of a walnut in a saucepan with a non-stick lining.

When the butter is hot and sizzling, pour in the beaten egg. Cook gently, stirring all the time, lifting the cooked egg from the bottom to allow the soft egg to reach the heat. Cook until the eggs have just set and thickened. Serve on hot buttered toast.

FATS Found in these foods:

Butter, margarine and lard are fats. So is the fat on meat, and in peanuts and other nuts, in herrings and salmon.



And talking of fish, Ferdie has some more White Fish for you to look at.

SKATE. Only the wings are sold and the flesh is slightly pink. Small skate are the best flavour, large ones tending to

be tough. Best from October to March, and fairly expensive. Fry, peach, stew skate wings.

TURBOT. A flat fish with fine flesh. The flavour is delicate and the fish is usually expensive. Good all year round. Poach it, steam, bake, grill or shallow-fry.

Under the Monster Mask

Although he died three years ago at the age of eighty-two, readers' letters suggest that Boris Karloff, the man behind the horrific makeup in so many spine-chilling movies, is still a firm favourite. So here, at the request of reader Leigh Jackson of Poole, Dorset, is a picture of Karloff without his 'monster' mask.



Boris Karloff (his real name was William Pratt) was born in England and educated at two famous public schools before going to North America to seek fame as an actor in 1910. By 1919 he had reached Hollywood, where he played small 'villainous' parts in dozens of silent films and early talkies. It was Karloff's deep voice, with its 'echo-chamber' effect, which won him the part of the Monster in FRANKENSTEIN (1931) and set him on the road to movie immortality. For more than thirty years, he delighted—and terrified—audiences with portrayals of mad scientists, monsters, zombies, 'living' Egyptian mummies and a whole gallery of other horrors.
