My hobby is to make models (the size of teenage dolls) of pop stars.

These stamps go on sale next Wednesday, 19th November, and special presentation packs will be available at all main post offices on the same day, price 82p each.





# ANIMAL ALLSORTS


Over one hundred years ago the French naturalist Abbé David was camped on the edge of the Mongolian desert. He noticed that there were lots of burrows around his camp site, and sitting at the entrance to each burrow were some animals that looked like small yellow rats. Then Abbé and his friends managed to catch a few of these little animals and they sent them to Paris to be identified. There the scientists found that the animals were not rats at all but were, in fact, Mongolian gerbils.



## CERBILS

Different kinds of gerbils have been found in other parts of the world, but it is the Mongolian gerbil which is now bred and kept as a pet in this country. A pet gerbil is a very attractive little animal. It has a golden brown fur and large, dark eyes, and it eats sitting up on its hind legs like a squirrel, holding its food in its front paws.

If you are thinking of buying some gerbils as pets always remember that they are burrowing animals, and will appreciate plenty of litter in their cage. An aquarium (but **not** one filled with water!) often makes a good home for gerbils because it is deep. You can put in about 5 or 6 inches of a mixture of sawdust, woodshavings, straw, sand and peatmoss with some hay for bedding. Cages or aquaria for 2 or 3 gerbils should be 60cm by 30cm by 30cm. Cages need cleaning out every 2 weeks; aquaria every 3 to 4 weeks.



It is best to choose pet gerbils when they are about 8 weeks old; 2 young females will usually get on well together if introduced at this age, and so will a male and female. Adult gerbils will, however, fight if they are strangers. Gerbils pair for life, but they do breed very rapidly — a second litter may arrive 4 weeks after the first litter and so on.

Feed your gerbils on a mixture of grain such as oats, barley, wheat, flaked maize and a few sunflower seeds. They should also have a little fresh plant food, e.g. cabbage, carrot, apple, grass. Water should always be available.


# TYTimes cookery editor Kathie Webber introduces Look-in's weekly fun food spot...

Dates, often bought dried in boxes at Christmas time, come from the beautiful date palm tree (right), which grows to a height of from 18 to 24 metres (60 to 80 feet). It is found in many areas — from the Canary Islands through Northern Africa and from the south-west of Asia to Pakistan and India. Its leaves can be 3 to 6 metres (10 to 20 feet) long and a single large bunch of dates can contain up to 1,000 fruits and weigh 9kgs. (20 lbs) or more!

There are plenty of fresh dates from Israel in the shops at the moment, which are lovely to eat as they are, but for cooking look for the packets of pressed dried dates, cheapest and best for cakes and biscuits such as these lemon date bars. They're delicious!



# LEMONDATEBARS



350g (12oz.) plain flour

225g (8oz.) butter or margarine

125g (4oz.) caster sugar

225g (8oz.) stoned dates

60ml (4 tablespoons) lemon juice

25g (1oz.) granulated sugar

Put the flour in a mixing bowl and rub in the butter or margarine. 'Rubbing-in' means rubbing the fat and flour together with your fingertips again and again until you have a mixture which looks rather like fine breadcrumbs. Stir in the caster sugar and then gather the mixture together in your fingers until it forms a smooth dough. Cut the dough in half, put it in a polythene bag and chill it in the refrigerator for 30 minutes. Chop the dates; mix them with the lemon juice and granulated sugar to form a paste. Line a shallow oblong tin about 25cm by 20cm (1" by 8") with greased greaseproof paper. Roll half the dough to fit the tin and press it in place with your fingers. Neaten the edges if necessary. Spread with the date and lemon mixture. Roll the remaining dough and cover the date mixture, pressing the dough into the edges of the tin with your fingers. Smooth the top and prick through to the bottom of the tin with a fork. You can also make an interesting pattern with fork marks. Bake in the centre of the oven 180 deg. C (350 deg. F) or gas mark 4 or 20 minutes. Allow to cool in the tin, then cut the mixture into fingers.



























Whoops! Follow the laughs next week!



Speeding down the freeway astride two high-powered motor cycles come TV's crimebusters on wheels, Jon and Ponch. Supercops of the small screen, soon to be on the big screen, the mobile heroes of CHiPs (short for California Highway Patrol) are revving up the action in most TV areas this week.

Starring Erik Estrada as the dark, easygoing Officer Poncherello and blond, blue-eyed Larry Wilcox as his no-nonsense straight-talking partner, Officer Jonathan Baker, this series with its all-action formula suffered a near tragedy itself last year. Headline news was made all over the world when Estrada was nearly killed during filming the new series. The incident, however, will not be shown on your screens, despite reports earlier in the year that it would be.


Erik had swerved his 900 lb Kawasaki motor cycle to avoid an accident. Losing control of the machine he calls "The Big Beast", he was thrown over the handlebars and the bike fell on top of him.

With fear for his life, he was rushed to hospital in Los Angeles by helicopter. It was 24 hours before doctors said his heart had not been injured as had been feared.

As he lay in hospital, finally out of danger but with a broken breastbone, four broken ribs and a broken wrist, the star from New York's Spanish Harlem, who receives thousands of fan letters every week, said: "By all rights I should have been killed. I'm just thankful I was in such good physical condition. It's because of that, and 'the man upstairs', that I'm alive today."

Erik and Larry agree that one of the secrets of their success in the enormously popular TV series is being super-fit.

For 30-year-old Estrada, it helped him make a reasonably quick recovery from the accident, even though he wasn't able to get much sleep for days because of the pain he went through.



"Both my lungs were punctured and collapsed," he said, "but I fought to live every step of the way. I was determined not to go."

The real California Highway Patrol sent the actor a cake inscribed: "To ride CHiPs cycles is a piece of cake".

"A piece of cake" is Estrada's favourite expression when faced with some of the action stunts on the show, but when he and Larry took on their roles they had a lot of learning to do. Highway Patrol Officer Bob Hayde was brought in to teach them how to handle the big bikes and he was a tough teacher. "From the outset I wanted Erik and Larry to respect their machines so I deliberately put them in positions where they would learn this respect.

"Competent riding is a blend of judgment, balance and co-ordination. We concentrated on slow speed moves — that's where the skill

comes in. And I must admit these guys were fast learners. At the end of five weeks I rated their competence as above average."

Another vital part of the boys' training was joining real CHiPs officers on duty. "What impressed me most," says Erik, "was their poise under pressure. Their whole day is an exercise in control.

"The fact that kids are so crazy about the CHiPs series has made me realise that we have a responsibility to them."

As a child, Erik himself had toyed with the idea of joining the police force: "A friend of our family was a cop, and I thought he was the greatest guy in the world."

As CHiPs producer Cy Chermak reminds us: CHiPs is a stunt action series about two very handsome officers. We are not playing bullets and bad guys. It's about the boys' personal as well as working lives."

But filming on location attracts the crowds, and security officers are now hired to keep the fans from mobbing Erik and Larry all the time.

Erik, 1.78 metres (5' 10") tall and 73 kgs. (160 lb), now rivals pin-ups John Travolta and Henry 'The Fonz' Winkler with his Latin good looks; quite the opposite of Larry, 1.80 metres tall (5' 11"), and 77kgs, who with his blond country-boy innocence has his own following of fans.

Erik grew up in one of New York's toughest areas, working as a shoeshine boy as soon as he was old enough, his mother having been left to bring up her children alone when Erik was two years old.

After high school, he shunned


>>> from p.15 the street gangs, joining an acting workshop instead. "We kids were paid 32 dollars a week to put on shows in the parks," he says. "We'd sing and dance and do all kinds of things." And he went on to beat 76 other actors for the role of Ponch!

Things change for the characters as the series continues. Ponch sells his cluttered mobile home and moves to a new apartment by the marina. Jon trades his compact car for

a flashy, souped-up truck. And some of you will already have met Brianne Leary, who has joined the cast as Officer Sindy Cahill, a perky patrol officer who dreams of becoming the first female on highway patrol. "At the present time," says producer Chermak, "the real CHiPs does not have a woman motor cycle officer, but as soon as it does, Brianne will get her wheels on the programme."

## DOGGED ROLE

Before CHiPs, Larry was already known for his starring role in the Lassie series, which, together with some Disney films he made, was an area light years away from his previous real-life experiences — as a Marine in the horrifying Vietnam war.





No stranger to television since, Larry's numerous credits include MASH, The Streets of San Francisco and Police Story. In his non-acting moments he takes the role of cowboy, riding bareback in rodeos, a hobby which worries his TV bosses who are scared he will suffer injury. "But I think riding bikes is much more dangerous," says Larry in reply.

He competes for top prize money in rodeos around America. "The steer runs out with one cowbov trying to lasso his head and the other his feet. Those steers are pretty cagev animals and give us cowboys a hard time."

Versatile Erik, one-time night club bouncer, waiter and used-car salesman between drama training, had put his song and dance talents to use on several US TV specials before his accident, including one show with the Bay City Rollers: (remember them from way back in the Seventies?)

Not one to give up easily, his determination won him his first movie role in a film called The New Centurions. As an unknown, he was turned down at the auditions. But undaunted, he followed the director across the States to make him change his mind and the man did. Parts followed in TV shows like Hawaii Five-O, Kojak, McMillan and Wife, The Six Million Dollar Man and Fantasy Island.

On screen, Jon is the tough guy with the heart of gold who is always getting Ponch out of scrapes. But Larry admits that offscreen he has had several clashes with Erik. "We both have quite a temper," he says.

Larry has even talked about quitting. Both actors refused to invite each other to their weddings. In fact, Estrada didn't even tell his screen pal when he married Joyce Miller recently; Wilcox read it in the paper! But when Erik had his accident, Larry was the first to reach him as he lay badly injured, and held his hand to comfort him.

So the heroes of the highway are back: and when they ride onto the small screen, there's always adventure at hand . . !

**England meet Switzerland at** Wembley this week in a very important World Cup qualifying match. One of the Swiss team's best players is Raimondo Ponte. currently starring in the English first division with European Cup holders Nottingham Forest.

Switzerland may be noted for its scenery, standard of living and watches, but its national football team can't be said to have hit too many high notes in recent years. Not that England boss Ron Greenwood will allow his side any cause for complacency when the Swiss visit Wembley for the World Cup qualifier this week. The league scene in Switzerland isn't too healthy, with fewer and fewer people turning out to watch the games. In fact, as in Scotland, the league tends to be dominated by about three sides; Grasshoppers, F.C. Zurich and Servette. When it comes to picking the national team, the side is built around 'blocks' of players from the major clubs in the hope that the familiarity gained playing with team-mates every week will repeat itself at international level.






