TVTimes cookery editor Kathie Webber introduces Look-in's weekly fun food spot...

Home-made gifts for Christmas are often appreciated much more than bought ones — and, of course, they are cheaper. Biscuits make smashing Christmas presents for relatives or friends, especially when packaged in pretty boxes which can also be home-made.

Biscuits in the shapes of Christmas trees, stars and holly can be made by placing a cardboard template on the rolled-out biscuit mixture and cutting around it. Biscuit cutters can be bought in many shapes from department stores and kitchenware shops. There is even a kit of Mr. Men cutters which includes nine different Mr. Men, a gauge to ensure the biscuit mixture is the right thickness, and four McCor-

mick food colours to paint the biscuits. The kit costs £3.99. When I tested these cookie cutters, my favourite was Mr. Greedy with his big tummy!



This biscuit recipe is included in the Mr. Men kit but it can be used with your own shapes and cutters.

COLOURFUL

250g (9oz.) butter

200g (7oz.) caster sugar

250g (9oz.) cornflour

350g (12oz.) plain flour

2 eggs, size 3

4 drops vanilla essence

60-75ml (4-5 tablespoons) milk


food colouring

Cream butter and sugar together until soft and fluffy. Gradually mix in the flour, cornflour, eggs and vanilla essence. Add the milk and mix until a firm dough is obtained. Roll out the dough to $\frac{1}{2}$ cm ($\frac{1}{4}$ inch) thick. Flour the moulds or cutters and then cut out the cookies by pressing the cutter firmly into the dough. Paint the biscuits with food colouring by mixing the colouring with a little egg yolk. Place the biscuits on a well greased baking tray. Bake in the oven for 12-15 minutes at 220 deg. C (425 deg. F) or gas mark 7. Allow to cool and store in an airtight container. (Makes 25 approx.).

If you make these as a gift, the packaging for the biscuits must be airtight to stop them from going soft. Put them in a box without a lid so that they can be seen, then wrap in clear plastic film.



ANIMAL ALLSORTS



A Golden Hamster is just a little bit bigger than a gerbil (you might remember that we talked about them recently), but it has a very short tail. Both hamsters and gerbils hold food in their fore-paws, but hamsters also have cheek pouches. If a hamster wants to save a tasty snack until later it will tuck it into one of its cheek pouches and go about looking as if it had had a bad attack of mumps! The food is then taken back to its nest and emptied out into the hamster's food store.

Buy a pet hamster when it is between five and ten weeks old. At first it may seem rather sleepy, but this is because it is young and also because hamsters are most active in the evening and at night. If you offer it some food when it wakes up it will gradually learn that you are its friend. Talk quietly to your pet hamster and don't frighten it. Pick it up carefully, either by cupping it in both hands, or with one hand over the body so that its head is towards your wrist. A hamster will enjoy a run around the room in the evening but make sure it can't disappear down a hole!

Feed it on a mixture of wheat, barley, crushed oats, sunflower seeds and peanuts from a good pet shop. It should also have some vegetables or fruit such as apple, carrot, lettuce or cucumber. Some hamsters like a little cooked meat, fish, cheese or egg, but remove this kind of food at the end of the meal. Never give them chocolate or oranges. They should always have water available.


Hamsters usually have to live on their own because they fight, but give your pet a roomy, interesting cage with a nest box. A small branch from a non-poisonous tree such as an apple tree will give them something to gnaw and climb.

Keep your hamster's cage indoors, but please don't keep it in a cold room in the winter or your hamster may hibernate! If this does ever happen, however, move the cage into a warmer place where your pet can warm up slowly and be encouraged to come out of hibernation.





The Smurfs need a little 'egging' on this week!































Ever since they first started publishing them — and it now seems like centuries ago — the top twenties, thirties and forties have seen countless new recording stars come and go. Although some might stand the test of time, names and faces are constantly changing. That's surely part of the fun about the record charts, watching for the new names to appear each week and wondering which of the new sounds will reach the dizzy heights of the top ten, or perhaps even the Number One slot itself! Have you noticed, however, that when things start buzzing in the charts you rarely get just one new name to watch? And that's just what seems to be happening again now; for, in recent weeks, we've been witnessing a whole array of shooting stars fighting it out with each other.

No doubt some of them will sink without trace, but others will surely go on to bigger and better things. We wouldn't like to make any predictions here, but Look-in has been taking a close look at just a few of these...

STAR GHARTERS!

ADAM AND THE ANTS

Adam & The Ants' first single, Young Parisians, was launched with the help of a London flyposting poster campaign (very crafty that Adam Ant, getting those flies to work for him; or were they flying ants?) back in October '78.

There were a lot of noises made in the rock press at the time, but apart from starting to build up a following of worker ants, Adam was unable to capitalise on the headlines with real chart success.

The first Adam & The Ants LP, Dirk Wears White Sox — Adam dedicated it to actor Dirk Bogarde — appeared on the Do-It label this January and it was really then that a lot of things started to happen for Adam. First, it was the inevitable band changes — new Ants included Marco Pirroni, whom Adam had approached to be a co-song-writer, the first result of this partnership being Kings Of The Wild Frontier. Other Ants are Kevin Mooney, bass (the youngest member of the band), and Tony Lee Miall and Merrick, drums.

By now, you should all know about **Dog** Eat Dog, the big hit, but how much is there to know about Mr Ant himself (above right)? Well, for a start, Adam's 26, and his real name is rumoured to be Malcolm Goddard. Until he formed the Original Ants three years ago, Adam was a graphic design student, but, he says, he felt that he wanted to create an audience, not cater for one. He didn't want to compete. He also wanted to keep his Ants as far away from the course of straight "rock 'n' roll" as possible, and concentrate on making progressively good and exciting records. And so "Antmusic" was born.

By the way, Adam is the mastermind behind all "Antgraphics", designing badges, T-shirts, record sleeves, posters and just about everything else to do with promoting his band and we've heard that he even answers all his fan mail personally!



ORCHESTRAL MANOEUVRES IN THE DARK

With a name like Orchestral Manoeuvres In The Dark, it is much easier to say, and write (!), O.M.I.T.D. The band hails from Merseyside and it is the latest in a long line of bands for Paul Humphreys and Andy McClusky (above). Although just in their twenties, Paul and Andy first got together as 16-year-olds, when they were influenced by the likes of Eno and Kraftwerk, in a band called VCL XI. Next they joined up with an assortment of musicians known as Hitlerz Underpants (!), but this was hardly a successful venture for the duo. Following the failure of Underpantz, they formed an eight-piece rock band, the ID, which they left in the summer of '78 because they felt that their songs were not turning out the way they wanted.

O.M.I.T.D. was started with the help of 'Winston', a tape recorder that Paul and Andy used to take on stage to augment their playing, but the band's first headliner meant most of the tapes being replaced by musicians and no more 'Winston'. There was chart success in store with Messages, however, and their highly acclaimed album, Organisation, which includes the chilling Enola Gay. No, it wasn't another love song — Enola Gay was the name given to the B52 bomber which dropped the first Atom bomb on Hiroshima in 1945.

XTC


After a host of singles — Towers of London is their eighth — a series of exhausting world tours and four albums, it seems that XTC have at last begun to gain the kind of recognition which they had threatened for so long. For, unlike the other groups here, they're relatively 'old-hands' in the charts: Generals — Majors — Don't Lose Your Tempers was there a couple of months ago, and Making Plans for Nigel was a big hit for them last year.


Hailing from Swindon in Wiltshire, the present line-up of XTC got together in early 1979 when guitarist Dave Gregory joined. Previously, guitar man Andy Partridge, bassist Colin Moulding and drummer Terry Chambers had worked together, with others, as Star Park, The Helium Kidz, Skyscraper and Snakes before becoming XTC in 1976.

After getting under way in their home town (although Partridge was born in Malta), XTC had developed a substantial local following before arriving in London at the height of '77's punk invasion.

They've come a long way since those early days, being no strangers to Europe, Australia, Japan and America, but, now that their popular appeal is beginning to really take off, it looks as though they are going to go a long way further!











Formed as long ago as the early seventies, when they called themselves Young Ones From Zion, Black Slate really do know just how long the road to chart success can be. But they stuck at it, and even formed their own record label, TCD, as they felt that the established record companies were not interested enough in British reggae to know sthing happened. It wasn't deliberate, it just

That might have been so, but one company, Ensign, had eyed Black Slate after their mid-1979 first time hit in the reggae charts entitled Mind Your Motion. The success of Amigo, the group's first release on their new label, certainly justified the move to Ensign!

So who are Black Slate? They are: Keith Drummond (24), lead vocals; Chris Hanson (23), lead guitar; Anthony Brightly (20), keyboards; Cledwyn Rogers (24), rhythm guitar; Elroy Bailey (22), bass guitar; and Desmond Mahoney (24), drums.

Although a reggae band, Black Slate draw their experience from a quite diverse background. As Desmond explains: "Reggae was always in our minds, but we were into other things too. A couple of the guys were into soul, some were playing jazz, and others were playing calypso. It wasn't until we got together as a band that the reggae



TEARDROP

The charting of When I Dream saw everyone talking and writing about the re-emergence of Liverpool (home of that most famous of groups, the Beatles, of course) as a force to be reckoned with in the music world. However, although they are Liverpool based, with their origins dating back there to 1977, only Alan Gill, recently joined, is, in fact, Liverpudlian.

The name The Teardrop Explodes was taken from a scene in an American Marvel comic (to be precise Daredevil no 77, June 1971!) and, shortly after a debut gig at Eric's in Liverpool in November '78, their first single Sleeping Gas was issued by the then recently formed Zoo label. A second single Bouncing Babies soon followed after the first had won critical acclaim, and the third, Treason, released early this year, was made record of the week in virtually every music paper.

The Teardrop Explodes has gone through the usual personnel changes that most new groups have to face, but they now look set to go far together following the success of When I Dream after signing to the Mercury label,

For the record, The Teardrop Explodes features Julian Cope, vocals and bass he's from South Wales; Dave Balfe from Carlisle on keyboards; Gary Dwyer from West Virginia on drums and guitarist Alan Gill from Liverpool.

LINX

Linx was formed when 24-year-old Jamaican born David Grant got together with one Sketch, a 26-year-old Antiguan. The two of them (right) formed their own production and publishing company, The Solid Foundation, and, having recruited drummer Andy Duncan and multikeyboards man Bob Carter, they went on to write and produce the hit record You're

As with Black Slate, Linx despaired of gaining record company recognition in the more traditional way, so David and Sketch paid for the pressing of 1,000 copies of You're Lying, which then went on sale through the specialist record outlet, City Sounds. Then they made the rounds of the clubs and radio stations to promote their

Although they were obviously confident with the finished article, both David and Sketch were taken by surprise by the immediate reaction to their single. City Sounds sold out of the record overnight and



it was soon one of the most requested club records around London. As demand for the single spread nationally, it was re-released on the Chrysalis label, and David and Sketch were off on a series of live appearances, eager to prove that the UK can produce funk to compete with the best of what America has to offer.

THE MOTELS

A West Coast American group, the Motels originated in Berkley, California, before moving to Los Angeles in the mid-Seventies. There has been a number of changes to the group since then, but, finally, a new look Motels emerged onto the L.A. club circuit early last year. Within five months they had signed a recording contract with Capitol and begun work on their debut album, Motels.

The group by then consisted of lead vocalist and rhythm guitarist Martha



Gordon Strachan, midfield king-pin for Aberdeen and Scotland. OU can't question the fact that Aberdeen is Scotland's premier oil boom city, or that it is now well on the way to becoming the country's soccer boom city. For too long top Scottish football was dominated by Glasgow's big two, Celtic and Rangers, but with the Premier Championship going to Aberdeen last season, and with the Dons showing no signs of loosening their grip on the trophy so far this term, Scottish soccer now boasts the Big Three.

Although Aberdeen lost king-pin striker Steve Archibald to Spurs last season the near million pounds the club netted from the deal will put them in a very strong position when it comes to buying Scottish talent, for transfer deals are still considerably lower in Scotland, than in England.

The present gem in the Aberdeen side is little Gordon Strachan, already attracting a lot of attention from English


clubs, including Arsenal. Strachan was going nowhere fast with Dundee, a player with greatskill but seemingly unable to put his game together out on the park. His transfer to Aberdeen hardly made the headlines, but now he is recognised as one of Scotland's leading players, virtually guaranteed a place in the Scottish squad, especially after scoring the superb goal that gave Scotland that valuable away win against Sweden in a recent World Cup qualifier. So what brought about the transformation? Once he had settled into the first team squad at Pittodrie, boss Alex Ferguson pulled off the masterstroke of giving him a roving responsibility for motivating the entire side. Gordon rose to the challenge and his ceaseless energy sees him covering every blade of grass during a match. Alex Ferguson's biggest problem concerning the red-headed dynamo will be the struggle to keep him at Aberdeen.
