The single, Do They Know It's Christmas? (PolyGram FEED 1) was written by Bob Geldof and Midge Ure who also organised the recording session last Sunday which involved Wham! FGTH, Ultravox, last Sunday which involved Wham! FGTH, Ultravox, U2, Paul Young, Kool & The Gang, Paul McCartney, Boomtown Rats, Status Quo, Annie Lennox, Bananarama, Culture Club, Duran Duran, Heaven 17, Phil Collins, Jodie, Spandau Ballet, Style Council, Sting and The Young Ones. The supergroup will be on the label as Band Aid.

Everyone concerned in making marketing

Everyone concerned in making, marketing, promoting and distributing the single have given their services free, including sleeve designer Peter Blake, Sarm West Studio, Phonogram and PolyGram distribution.

"Even those mysterious characters who put up fly posters are doing it for nothing," said Geldof who called *Music Week* to appeal to dealers to lend their support by selling the record at cost — £1.35 including VAT. *MW* has donated a full page advertisement (see p31).

Phonogram is offering the single on full sale or return terms and all the major retail chains — Boots,

Phonogram is offering the single on full sale or return terms and all the major retail chains — Boots, HMV, Our Price, Woolworth, Smiths and Virgin — have already agreed to sell at the dealer price.

Geldof has pledged that all the supplies bought by money generated through sales of the single will be shipped directly to the famine victims.

Fifteen artists will appear in an Action For Ethiopia Albert Hall concert on December 7, including Aswad, Thomas Dolby, The Flying Pickets, Nick Heyward, Alvin Stardust and Mari Wilson. The concert has the title "Dinner At Alberts" and record companies are being urged to purchase boxes. The target is £100,000 for the Save The Children Ethiopia fund. More information from 734 8883/4.

Imagination, Haywoode and Animal Nightlife are among artists appearing in a GLC backed concert at the Hippodrome, Leicester Square, on December 2. Proceeds will go to the Oxfam appeal for Ethiopia.

Record Shack forms new indie operation

IN THE wake of the collapse of IDS last week, a new sales/promotion/marketing operation has been formed, based on the Record Shack Company, the most successful of the IDS-distributed labels, utilising EMI's pressing and distribution.

Called The Consortium, the new company will be headed by former IDS labels manager Dave Fagence, and will initially handle Record Shack product plus two other IDS labels, Cocteau and Illuminated. Several ex-IDS staff will be taken on, including Malcolm Packer as sales manager and Christine Wells as administrator.

The deal with EMI was negotiated by Record Shack's left Weston after.

manager and Christine Wells as administrator.

The deal with EMI was negotiated by Record Shack's Jeff Weston after arrangements with CBS, announced last week, failed to be completed. The Consortium will provide marketing and promotion for its labels and has taken on the sales company Impulse for a trial period. Fagence commented: "We will only concentrate on labels we feel we can break, mayber four or five a year; we will be aiming to build reputations and achieve high turnover."

IDS directors John Howes and Geoff Hannington have denied a claim by IDS creditor Tony Harding that the company crashed owing 2m (MW November 24). "Putting aside the banks' investment, our debts to individual creditors is around £800,000," said Hannington. "And a large proportion of that is owed to Damont and Cambra, our two biggest creditors."

The action is being brought by Apple Corps Ltd, the company which is owned by the three surviving Beatles, Paul McCartney, George Harrison and Ringo Starr, and John Lennon's widow, Yoko Ono.

Robert Gatehouse, QC, told Mr Justice Peter Gibson that Apple was

seeking a court order for an account of royalties alleged to have been "considerably under-accounted".

Under their earliest contract with Parlophone counsel said the group were to get a royalty of one old penny per track, later rising to one-and-a-half old pence. This was later superseded by royalties on a percentage basis.
Following the break-up of the group, Gatehouse said that Apple had

commissioned two reports by expert accountants in the music publishing field to audit the EMI accounts. The action is being defended by EMI.

NEW YORK: By virtue of omission — both deliberate and seemingly unintentional — the recent *Billboard* Music Video Conference in Los Angeles raised a number of issues that illustrate the quandry record labels find themselves in regarding music video

illustrate the quandry record labels find themselves megaing music video.

The deliberate omission was any discussion of exclusivity agreements between record companies and MTV — banned at the outset of a panel titled Seen In the Right Places that featured MTV's Les Garland as well as representatives of various other music video programmes. Interestingly, there was no effort to shun talk of which shows pay royalties and which don't, the other side of the exclusivity coin. Exclusivity itself is a two-way euphemism: for MTV it represents a royalty of sorts! On the other hand exclusivity agreements (rather than royalties) protect the labels from artist/producer demands for a cut of the action.

cut of the action.

The seemingly unintentional omission was in the entire area of home video. When Pacific Arts' David Bean attempted to discuss the fact that his company made money selling music video (among other types of cassettes — his argument didn't fully hold water), the other panelists among The Risk Takers, including IRS Records/Video's Carl Grasso, whose label has released long form videos for commercial sale and rental, conveniently chose to ignore both the topic and Bean's comments.

Exclusivity is probably the single most important issue facing Exclusivity is probably the single most important issue facing the labels so far as exploitation of increasingly expensive promotional clips is concerned. Are clips useful after initial release, after a song has peaked? What do such agreements mean in terms of restraint of trade? What will happen as artists and producers seek a share of the premium paid for exclusivity — when the labels see that premium as merely offsetting production costs? (This latter issue was raised if not addressed

production costs? (This latter issue was raised if not addressed at any length.)

As for sale of music video, the matter of rights continues to be a major stumbling block, with no clear cut definitions. Also, there is little evidence to date that music video is of interest to consumers for other than the occasional blockbuster. Sony keeps hanging in with Video 45s, never releasing sales data; I venture to guess that with the possible exception of Duran Duran it's never moved more than a few thousand pieces of any single title.

single title.

Sony may even have profited on those few thousand, as may others with a handful of full-length productions, but to date the numbers can hardly have been substantial. This is the third year in Sony's Video 45 programme — and the one in which the company will have to prove itself. Insiders concede they aren't sure if the concept will warrant continued major investment. (On the plus side; building enthusiasm for Pioneer's 8-inch discs, despite the paltry installed base of laserdisc video players. Perhaps this will rub off on the Video 45 format.)

Most talk about music video is in the future tense, which has been the case at least since Billboard started its music video conferences in the mid-'70s. The reality is that few of the participants in this year's event (or elsewhere) actually make money directly through music video unless they are getting a flat fee for some service (producer/director, duplicator, distri-

flat fee for some service (producer/director, duplicator, distri-

Music video, as far as sales for home use goes, simply isn't a business yet, and most executives these days aren't convinced it ever will be. And without even discussing them in specific terms, the issues above are the ones that drove this year's Billboard music video conference to its greatest success yet.

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Trade split on Sunday opening

HOME OFFICE recom mendations to scrap all restrictions on shop opening hours have by and large been welcomed by major record retailing chains, but reaction from independent dealers has been less favourable, with many feeling the changes may threaten their existence.

may threaten their existence. The proposals, made in a report by the Auld Committee, would legalise Sunday trading for the first time in England and Wales. And while Home Secretary, Leon Brittan, has warned retailers not to flout existing laws, the indications are that seven-days-a-week trading could be legal within 18 months. W H Smith, Virgin, Woolworths and Our Price are among those greeting the proposals with varying degrees of enthusiasm. "We welcome the report and its findings," said a spokesperson for Smiths. "We're now anxious to see legislation passed as early

to see legislation passed as early as possible. As far as ordinary stores go it's not a question of opening up every one, but there are a lot of places like resorts and tourist areas, where people want to shop on Sundays. Traders should be allowed to open if they and their customers want them

The other chains would operate a similar policy of opening only where demand was

Boots offered the loudest voice

chains saying that opening its stores on Sunday would not be in the best interests of its customers or staff. And that rather than create extra expenditure, sevenday trading would simply spread business over longer hours, put-ting up costs and eventually leading to higher prices. An opinion echoed less vehemently by HMV managing director, lan Gray. Both stores would, however, consider opening if local competition

forced them to.

Martin Anscombe who is secretary of the Norfolk Council of the National Chamber of Trade, as well as running Pop Inn Records in Watton, said a trading hours "free-for-all" would kill off the corner shoe.

"It is a blueprint for disaster. If implemented it will be a charter for superstores and Sunday markets — and sound the death knell for many ordinary family-run shops in market towns and

run shops in market towns and villages, who cannot afford to remain open all hours," he said.

Barry Robinson of Millers, a Cambridge shop dealing in all areas of music and employing a staff of around 60, felt similarly saying that the changes would very quickly cut down the public's choice by getting rid of a lot of small shops in a few months rather than over the next 10 to 15 years. 10 to 15 years.

Others were less certain of the consequences, many agreeing with the proposals in principle, but saying that they would probably not be opening them-selves, either because having worked six days they would need the rest, or because they did not believe enough people would be attracted to their area on a

"I can't see how I'd lose custom by not opening, the people you're going to get in on a Sunday are browsers rather than buyers." said Bob Kingdom of KMK

A number of dealers felt that if there is money to be spent it will be spent on either Saturday or Monday, and that Sunday open-ing would merely lower takings on those days.

on those days.

Pointing to the time taken for the public to get used to six full days trading, Tony Mack of Revolver Records in Nottingham, said he thought any changes would happen in the big cities first and take a long time to filter through to the rest of the country.

If and when the proposals come into effect, Tony Relf of Long Player in Tunbridge Wells has no doubts where dealers loyalties should lay: "In retailing it's about people coming through the door. There may be staffing problems and slightly increased costs, but that's retailing and if I don't like it then I have to get

The problems of staffing. overheads, profit — as well as religious and family considerations — vary but most dealers will be keeping a very close eye on what their competitors do.



"Michael Radford knows that his real dispute is with Virgin Films and we will not become his scapegoats," they add . . . Who gets Shep's job at Phonogram? AN AUSTRALIAN has been appointed as MD of CBS Australia for the first time in its 24 years - 33 year-old Dennis Handin who replaces American Bob Jamieson who moves to CRI in Paris. Fifteen years ago Handin was a junior store clerk in a CBS branch office and is known for his informal management style: "I speak to reps, I take them to lunch, I go out at night and get dirty with them," he told a *Billboard* reporter . . . Indie co-operative distributor The Cartel is dedicated "to undermining the industry at large," according to its magazine *The* Catalogue. It also appears to be schizophrenic — seeking to expand music "beyond the numbing constraints of the main charts", but also happy to help labels which are releasing music "that would comfortably compete in the conventional charts"... 

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MPA joins anti-VAT lobby

WITH THE threat of VAT on printed matter, including printed music, looming, the Music Publishers Association has joined the National Book Committee's lobby against the move.

MPA secretary Peter Dadswell has written to influential Conservative MPs on the subject and has

influential Conservative MPs on the subject and has received supportive replies to date from Edward Heath and Patrick Cormack, a member of the All Party Arts & Heritage Committee.

Toby Jessel, chairman of the Conservative Arts Committee, opposes the measure, but pointed out that the UK is the only EEC country which does not impose VAT on printed matter, adding that the UK is not much more noticeably literate or cultured than some of the countries on the Continent.

There is likely to be further pressure from the EEC authorities for the UK to fall in with the practice in other member nations and Chancellor Nigel Lawson would undoubtedly welcome the extra revenue.

However, Fleet Street, which largely supports the Government, is campaigning vigorously against the imposition of VAT, which would add to its already severe economic burdens while magazine publishers could also suffer circulation losses following the addition of a 15 per cent VAT charge to cover prices.

In a written reply in Parliament at the end of last month, Norman Lamont, Minister of State for Trade and Industry stated: "The Government have no present plans to introduce VAT on books, newspapers or periodicals. They do, however, have a commitment to shift the general burden of taxation from taxes on earnings to taxes on spending."

The Publishers Association, whose joint book trade committee chaired by Viscount Macmillan is co-operating closely with the National Book Committee in its anti-VAT activities, regards the operative word of the parliamentary reply as "present", and believes the threat still remains. The NBC expects the issue to be decided by the Treasury by the middle of January at the latest. It urges interested parties to make their representations swiftly "because Treasury policy usually begins to swiftly "because Treasury policrystallise by early December"

VAT of 15 per cent on printed music would seriously affect the modestly impressive recovery made by this sector in recent years. Obviously, printed music will never regain its inter-War glories when it constituted the major source of income for music publishers, but VAT would be a body blow to its current state of health, particularly in the educational field, which is already subject to stringent budgetary restrictions.

Dadswell told MW that the MPA already receives letters from the public complaining about the high cost of printed music. He does not accept that it is expensive relative to other contemporary costs, but points out the inevitable effect that higher charges through VAT will cause.

CURRENTLY FAR too successful to expect anything but cynical reviews from the pop press, U2's latest Wembley date was the very model of a well-measured, note-perfect performance—and thus a little short on excitement because the band are now so predictably excellent.

Bono and The Edge are still the indisputable stars and focal points, though it's hard to imagine a more different pair: the ungainly gait and manner of the singer highlighted by the elegant cool of The Edge's precision guitar playing. But while Bono's secure self-image has made him the butt of endless easy slagoffs, he is a singer of consummate authority, if not class.

Subsequent developments have been adequate, but that's all. Consistent brilliance is a lot to expect from anyone—except, it seems, The Edge, whose guitar still sings with original style which shouldn't be sacrificed to fashion.

Earlier, the evening got off to a rousing start, courtesy of UZ's Island stablemates, The Waterboys, whose potent brand of emotive and intelligent music found favour with the crowd who gave it an unusually good reception for a Wembley support.

John Martyn

FOLLOWING SWIFTLY after Christy Moore, the similarly hard to define John Martyn displayed his own special talents at the Dominion. While Martyn's excursions into

echoing guitar and over-laid melody are well known, it comes as quite a surprise to learn how completely his music has evolved into a jazzy fusion of enthusiastic rhythms.

music has evolved into a jazzy fusion of enthusiastic rhythms.

But the audience seemed somewhat confused and disappointed by Martyn's performance. Never one to stand still, Martyn has continued to experiment within the very distinctive framework he has created. Consequently, the music is still immediately identifiable as his, but with an extra edge.

For this tour he simply played electric guitar, with a keyboard player (still annoyingly prone to be bubbly when he should be complimentary) and the extraordinary Danny Cummins on assorted percussion.

He has moved far from his folk beginnings — there was not an accoustic guitar in sight — and has become alarmingly provocative: his angular guitar could teach quite a few young hopefuls a thing or two.

And then of course, there is that voice...unique, passionate and powerful Bending hysting and slurring.

And then of course, there is that voice...unique, passionate and powerful. Bending, twisting and slurring, Martyn seems to do nothing right and it all sounds so perfect. His violent rendition of Johnny Too Bad is a highlight showing how completely Martyn understands the varying tones and textures he now has in his repertoire.



rns for Ocean

THE CURRENT US success of Billy Ocean, with two singles Caribbean Queen and Loverboy, and album Suddenly, is a great triumph for a singer whose recording career had been in the doldrums for several years, and for Jive Records who see his success as one of the first results of its commitment and investment in black music.

Apart from Ocean's stunning success — the LP is approaching the 1m units markets, and Caribbean Queen topped the pop, black and dance charts in the US — Jive has also been enjoying great success with another dance music act, Whodini, whose album Escape was number 12 with a bullet in the black chart last week, and whose single Friends/Five Minutes

Of Funk is also a big hit.

Jive director Ralph Simon, says: "The Ocean phenomenon is not restricted to just the US — he has also charted in territories like West Germany, Venezuela, Australia and Spain."

After a string of Top 20 hits for GTO Records back in the Seventies —

including the number two hit, Love Really Hurts Without You — Ocean was eclipsed by other rising black stars: "His career was really allowed to languish," Simon says. "His talent was totally neglected, which to me was wrong as he has such a classic voice and the same kind of long-term potential as Lionel Ritchia". potential as Lionel Ritchie.

But, when just over a year ago Jive, which is part of the Zomba group of companies, decided to get involved with the black music market, Ocean was the first signing. Simon and fellow director Clive Calder teamed him with Zomba producer Keith Diamond, and the two worked in New York on the Suddenly album. "We decided to broaden our label's base from that of a purely rock-orientated approach to actively pursue what we believed to be the best talent in the black music field," Calder says.

be the best talent in the black music field," Calder says.
"We also started the Jive Afrika label and bought a mobile record studio in Los Angeles which was sent out to Botswanana in Africa. The first recording to come out of the mobile was Don't Go Lose It Baby, a number two dance hit for Hugh Masekela."

Jive's big project for 1985 is to break 14-year-old Zambian singer Warren Mills, who is now at school in the UK. 

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A fear in music makes light entertainment

THE BOCK Yearbook Volume Five

THE ROCK Yearbook Volume Five is a highly entertaining and intelligent read for music fans as distinct from casual pop punters.

Compiled under the auspices of Melody Maker editor, Allan Jones, and enlisting contributions from eight other current/ former MW writers (as well as 19 others), it not surprisingly has a similar editorial tenor to that similar editorial tenor to that paper. There is plenty of pretentious waffling about the various "Acts Of The Year" (The Smiths, Eurythmics, Frankie, etc.), but it is tempered with interesting sum-maries of developments in music's different forms (rock, reggae, soul, electro, African, etc) written by people who know

what they are talking about.
Like all books of its kind *The Rock Yearbook* is for dipping into
rather than reading cover to
cover. And for the multitude who will doubtless be presented with it on Christmas morning, there is a wealth of light entertainment features to hold the attention at least until the Boxing Day edition

of TOTP comes on.

These include 54 pages of snippets from the year's LPs reviews, a colourful section on the best and worst LP sleeves, plenty of ridiculous popstar quotes and book/video reviews. There is also a large section at the back giving over 52 weeks worth of Music over 52 weeks worth of Music Week/Billboard charts and a brief

As with any book dealing with something as transient as pop-ular music, odd facts are out of before publication (eg the feature on the demise of brief feature on the demise of ABC with no mention of their new, well—received single, How To Be A Millionaire), but this and the fact that it runs from August 1983 to July 1984 rather that January to December, (which would obviously lose the Christmas trade), are the only minor complaints about a book that succeeds very well within the conceeds very well within the conceeds very well within the confines of its brief.

'Startling' talent recognised

THE SERIES of contemporary composers' biographics from Robson Books has already proved itself with the volumes on Tippett, Maxwell Davies

and Ligeti.
They are scholarly works, not for the casual reader,

They are scholarly works, not for the casual reader, but closely argued texts, analysing the life, attitude and work of their subjects.

In Harrison Birtwistle, author Michael Hall has chosen one of the most interesting subjects, for despite his original involvement in the Pierrot Players which became the Fires of London, Birtwistle has little in common with the group of musicians who emerged from Manchester in the late lifties and early sixties and is the least well known despite his early sixties and is the least well known despite his relative obscurity powerful musical imagination has produced some startling scores over the years

Hall moves more or less chronologically through Hall moves more or less chronologically through Birtwistle's creative career, occasionally sidestepping to cast an analytical eye over the composer's main influences, which range from the intensely visual — such as Picasso Dürer and Klee — to "music as numbers". And his importance as a composer is clearly brought out in this admirable

At least the book goes some way to correcting the unacceptable list of deletions (mainly Decca) which result in Birtwistles music being represented by only one work in the catalogue — the opera Punch and

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
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




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

A weird and dramatic combination featuring tinkling piano, swirling strings and a languid double bass backing his inimitable vocal producing an extraordinary clash of styles, and with enough exposure could produce a hit. But what on earth motivated him to record Cockles And Muscles for the B-side?

TEARS FOR FEARS: Shout (Mercury/Phonogram IDEA 8(10), PolyGram). One of their better singles, the follow up to Mothers Talk, has a mid tempo, crashing beat and intricate synth/percussion rhythms beneath power-ful melodic vocals. The Chris Hughes production creates a very memorable track that should ensure a high chart placing.

Superb involved dance rhythms and David Byrnes' stylish vocal supported by strong harmonics, this is an excellent promotion tool for the album. The B-side is a live version of the better known Once In A Lifetime.

MIKE OLDFIELD: Éude (Virgin VS 731(12), EMI). An evocative, atmospheric theme from the film The Killing Fields. Effective, rhythmic percussion work and warbling lead synth line should see it receive a fair deal of exposure which could lead to a respectable chart position.

THE REBELS: You Can Make It (Celluloid/Carrere CART 348, PRT). Excellent hard electric funk. A swinging bass line and dynamic keyboard stabs with Bernard Fowler's powerful rap vocal backed by a strong mix will ensure that this dance single makes its mark in the clubs.

BAR-KAYS: Sexomatic (Club/Phonogram JABX 10, PolyGram). Steamy funk track with slick electro beat featuring sequenced bass, striking synth effects and a melodic vocal. With its clean production and outstanding mix this irresistible dance number could do well. Sexomatic



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

Awards are broadcast live by the BBC — on radio and television — next February.

He plans to make the show live up to the term "spectacular", but is keeping the production details secret as yet. The BBC TV executive producer and director for the live show is

Michael Hurll, and the Radio One executive producer who completes this production team is Stuart Grundy.

Music Therapy, which has in past years received help from many music business functions, is the chosen charity to which the proceeds from the Awards will be donated.

Nominations for 10 of the Awards categories have come from BPI members, but the winners' names will not be revealed until the last moment, when the presentations will be made by invited celebrities.

There will also be two special awards, sponsored by BBC TV and Radio, which will give the public a chance to vote their favourites into the Awards show. Top of the Pops is sponsoring a Best British Video Award, and voting will be organised through the TV show. HE OPENING of the Nordoff-Robbins Music Therapy Centre in Kentish Town, North London, in 1982 was the culmination of a seven-year dream to establish a centre to aid severely sub-normal and autistic children. Today, two years later, the Centre is visited by many children for whom Music Therapy

The aims of the Centre, based at 3 Leighton Place, London NW5 (01-267 1045) are to provide a clinic (the first of its kind in the UK) to which children come for treatment; to provide a base for the professional training of music therapists; and to make available, as a library for study and research, the

Music Therapy

either in individual sessions where two therapists work with one child, or in small groups. The children respond through using their own voices and by playing various musical instruments. The main aim is to set up a musical activity between

therapist and child. Sybil Beresford-Peirse, director of the Centre, emphasises: "We never talk about cure in this work

Pauline Tooth, the Centre's appeals organiser, says Since we opened the building two years ago, our work with children has expanded rapidly. There are now 14 therapists working with us, and approximately 50 children come to the Centre a week. It is necessary for two therapists to work with each child, one acting as the main therapist and the other as support — you have to remember that some of the children we deal with are severely handicapped

physically.
"Originally the therapists
were all trained at the Goldie
Leigh Hospital, and during
the last 10 years some 50 have gone through the

training course."
Some of the therapists who have trained at the Kentish Town centre have stayed on after completing their course, but the majority have moved to spread the work throughout the country. The centre itself is run by a shoestring staff — Pauline Tooth and an administrator although, as she points out: "Costs are rising all the time and we couldn't survive without the help of the music business.

Sybil Beresford-Peirce says: "The music industry has done a wonderful job raising money for Music Therapy and giving us encouragement without their help we should not be here at all."

Music Therapy was "adopted" by the music industry in 1973 and since then thousands of pounds have been raised for the charity. Lady Bradford, a member of the parent

committee, had approached concert promoter Andrew Miller for help from the pop world. A Music Therapy Junior Fund-raising Committee was formed, initially to raise money to buy musical instruments for handicapped children at the Goldie Leigh Hospital in Plumstead.

Next year is the tenth anniversary of music business involvement with the charity, and everyone involved is determined to raise a record amount of money to mark the occasion. Jenny Halsale, fund-raising committee member, says: 'Our target is £250,000, and we are trying to create a safety fund so that the work of Music Therapy will continue whatever the circumstances. It is a lot of money but we will raise it."

records and tapes which document the work of the late Dr Paul Nordoff and Dr Clive Robbins.

Music therapy establishes a relationship between patient and therapist, with inherent communication and obvious therapeutic activity. There are several different techniques, but the Nordoff-Robbins emphasise is on the creative use of music to draw the handicapped child into shared musical experiences.

Therapy sessions take place in two different areas,

because that would be misleading. What we are trying to do is help the child along the path of his or her development, as far as we possibly can. We cannot take them beyond their potential. Through music, children get an enormous lot of enjoyment — with emotionally disturbed children for instance we can help them to be in touch with their inner feelings. Music offers stability and can bring order into their emotional lives."

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
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
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

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Bach's birthday releases

BACH, HANDEL and, to a lesser extent, Scarlatti, are set to dominate next year's classical record releases as labels compete to mark the 400th anniversary of their births

But no one will match the effort made by Deutsche Grammophone, which is preparing a mammoth Bach Edition, which will consist of 12 box sets of no less than 130 LPs, with many of the sets containing

Even that is not a complete collection of the works

Even that is not a complete collection of the works of Bach, indicating the composer's immense output. But it will cover the bulk of the known works. Only about 10 per cent of the Bach Edition will comprise new recordings, unlike the company's Brahms Edition which was dominated by new recordings. But among the new ones included will be The Art of the Fugue recorded earlier this year on period instruments by Musica Antiqua Koln which DG releases on a double LP/tape this month (413 728), along with the Goldberg Canons.

The Bach Edition on LPs — there will not be a cassette version — will be released in February, but DG is pre-empting the event with a Bach Edition Sampler, containing Brandenburg Concerto No 3, and excerpts from the Musical Offering, the St Matthew Passion and other works, on a single LP (413 758) at the special price of £1.89.

But the company is also taking advantage of the Christmas market by releasing the Bach Edition on CD now. This is not simply a CD version of the 130 LP

set, but selected highlights, covering only the most popular works in their entirety. There are eight CD sets, of either 2, 3 or 4 CD packages.

The titles are Concertos (413 634 2 AH3), Works For Harpsichord (413 638 2 AH3), Christmas Oratorio (413 625 2 AH3), St John Passion (413 622 2 AH2), Works For Orchestra (413 629 2 AH4), St Matthew Passion (413 613 2 AH3), Cantatas (413 646 2 AH3), and The Art Of The Fugue, which includes the Musical Offering (413 642 2 AH3).

Most of the recordings are well-known: the Passions are conducted by Richter, and the harpsichord works and the Concertos mainly feature performances by Trevor Pinnock and the English Concert.

Bill Holland, classical manager at DG, explains that following better than anticipated initial dealer response to the CD sets, more supplies from Germany have been requested.

He adds that DG was also preparing a Handel Edition though it would not be secured.

He adds that DG was also preparing a Handel Edition, though it would not be so extensive as the Bach Edition involving mainly the operas and choral works, with all the recordings being re-issues. It would be available next year, with only Samson being rush-released in order to be available for the next production at Covert Gordon in February. new production at Covent Garden in February.

in a new version conducted by Helmut Rilling with Julia Hamari and Arleen Auger among the soloists

The emphasis in the Living The emphasis in the Living Baroque releases is on the Bach family, there are Flute Concertos by JC Bach played by Aurele Nicolet (412 043 LP/tape); Six symphonies Op 18 by JC Bach played by the Netherlands Chamber Orchestra under David Zinman (412 046 LP/tape); the ever popular Toccata and Fugue in D minor along with other 'pop' ever popular loccata and rugue in D minor along with other 'pop' organ works played by Daniel Chorzempa (9502 080 and on tape); and Cantatas Nos BWV 147,74, by JS Bach with Ileana Cotrubas leading good soloists (9502 110 and tape).

Deutsche Grammophon also adds to one of its reissue series this month — the 2LP flapboxes. Beethoven's Complete Overtures conducted by Karajan (413 516 LP/tape), Mahler's Symphony No 6 conducted by Bohm (413 528 LP/tape), and Mozart's Four Last Symphonies conducted again by Bohm (413 528 LP/tape) are among the seven new titles.

ROTH CBS and EMI concentrate their main reissues material of the month on tapes.

received, with repeat orders very

sees 10 new titles.

They are all popular in conception, and range from John

ception, and range from John Williams playing Bach and Spanish Guitar Music — Bach's Lute Suites (MGT 39487) and Granados, Falla etc (MTG 39491) Granados, Falla etc (MIG 39491) and Salute To George Gershwin (MGT 39488) played by Tilson Thomas and Sarah Vaughan to Classic Themes From Films, including Elvira Madigan, 10, and The Deer Hunter (MGT 39495).

EMI's tape releases are of covers of recently released LPs, including Elgar and Delius' Cello Concertos played by Jacqueline du Pre (TC-ASD 2764) and Elgar's The Music Makers coupled with Parry's Blest Pair of Sireus conducted by Boult. Despite the recordings dating from the Sixties, they are full price.

There is also a collection of popular songs for children: Uncle Mac's Nursery Rhymes, led by Derek McCulloch (TC-MRS 5133).

D on the streets

THE EFFECT of Christmas plus a TV campaign has had on CD sales can be seen by the fact that PolyGram's classical van serving the London area will hold only CDs and cassettes in December with the exception of a few top selling LPs.

Both Bill Holland, classical manager of DG, and Andrew Dalton,

Both Bill Holland, classical manager of DG, and Andrew Dalton, classical promotions manager at Decca, report that the rise in the sales of CDs can be most clearly seen in the opera sets.

Both Puccini's Manon Lescaut and Verdi's II Trovatore have sold more CD sets than LP sets, and much the same sales figures apply to Decca's digital remastered CD version of Wagner's Das Rheingold conducted by Solti, where over 500 sets have been sold in a relatively short space of

HMV's classical van, however, is carrying all three mediums, containing back catalogue as well as new releases. The van has been on the

taining back catalogue as well as new releases. The van has been on the road through much of November as part of an attempt by the company to improve the distribution services which have suffered considerable delays during re-organisation at Hayes.

According to EMI classical manager Simon Foster, these problems have largely been solved, and much of the December release will be available by the second week of December. This is in stark contrast to the considerable delays which have been experienced during recent

Unlike PolyGram, EMI does not report a dramatic drop in LP sales in favour of CD or cassette — a factor which has partly been put down by EMI to a particularly strong autumn LP release.

Variations

THE DISTINCTIVE sound of American composer Steve Reich has brought him a wide following outside as well as inside the classical milieu.

So Philips hopes to achieve better sales than are normally better sales than are normally attained by contemporary music records with Reich's Variations for Winds, Strings and Keyboards and John Adams' Shaker Loops, which also follows the "mini-malist" concepts.

They are both played by the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra under Edo de Waart

Victoriestra under Edo de Waart (412 214 LP/Tape).

Another contemporary music record comes from CBS — the second volume of music by Edgard Varese to be made by Pierre Boulez and his specialist group. Ensemble Intercongroup, Ensemble Intercontemporain. This LP contains Equatorial, Deserts — for instruments and tape — integrales Hyperprism, Octandre, Offrandes and Density 21.5 — for solo flute (M 39053 and tape).

And though Schoenberg's opera Moses und Aron can scarcely be called contemporary, its difficulty keeps it a work of minority interest, as Sir Georg Solti, who conducts the latest recording admits.

He has made it with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra and Chorus (414 264 2LP/tape/CD).

Wogan and the Wolf

TERRY WOGAN follows in the footsteps of Peter Ustinov, David Rootsteps of Peter Ustinov, David Bowie, Michael Flanders, Sean Connery, Angela Rippon and many others as the latest to narrate Prokofiev's children's tale, Peter and the Wolf.

The project is a Philips concept whereby the music was recorded by John Williams and the Boston Pops Orchestra, and then the UK and US companies selected a reader most suited to each country. The US opted for Dudley Moore, but Philips' UK classical manager, Mike Sage approached TV and radio's Terry Wogan.
Peter and the Wolf is issued this month on all three mediums

and is coupled with Tchaikovsky's Nutcracker Suite.

Three singers for Mozart

THREE COLLECTIONS of concert and opera arias by Mozart released this month on EMI follows very much the successful idea first initiated by Decca a couple of years ago with similar collections by Mozart performed by different singers, including Kiri Te Kenawa.

The company is optimistic about its latest issues, focusing on two

singers who have strong British-based careers, while the third is a frequent and much-publicised visitor.

frequent and much-publicised visitor.

Thomas Allen is one of the leading lyric baritones, and is currently singing the role of Mozart's Don Giovanni for the first time in Covent Garden. On EL 2701371 (and on tape), he sings arias from Cosi Fan Tutte, the Marriage Of Figaro, and Don Giovanni with the Scottish Chamber Orchestra conducted by Richard Armstrong.

The same orchestra also accompanies the Irish-born soprano Ann Murray in a recital of arias by Mozart and Handel (including the Cantata

Lucrezia) directed by Raymond Leppard (EL 2701381 and on cassette). The third singer is the American-born soprano Barbara Hendricks,

who sings selections from opera, including the premiere recording of an aria from Lucio Silla, as well as concert arias (EL 2701271 and on tape). She is accompanied by the ECO under Tate.

EMI: Elgar World First

THE WORLD premiere recording of Elgar's The Black Knight, a symphony for chorus and orchestra, is issued by EMI this month, in a performance by the Liverpool Philharmonic Choir, the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra under Sir Charles Groves (EL 2701571 and tape). This recording followed a Radio 3 broadcast in April, this year.

Another rare work comes from EMI this month, Debussy's unfini-shed opera The Fall Of The House Of Usher. The music has been revised and orchestrated by Blin, and is issued with a French cast conducted by Georges Pretre (EL 2701581 and tape). It is coupled with Caplet's The Mask of the Red Death, and Schmitt's Study for The Haunted Palace

Celluloid acquires Douglas catalogue

marketed by Carrere, recently acquired from the US, the Douglas label catalogue, which was active in black music in the late Sixties and early Seventies. Celluloid's US-based creative director and house producer Bill Laswell (of Material fame) had long been an admirer of the work of Douglas' leading Seventies act the Last Poets, and it was this which led him to a deal with the label's owner Alan Douglas that allows Celluloid access to anything from the vaults, whether previously released or not.

The first fruit of the deal was the UK release of the original eponymous The Last Poets album (CELL 6101) from 1970, unavailable for many years until now. At the same time on 12-inch came Doriella Du Fontaine (CART came Doriella Du Fontaine (CART 332), credited to Lightnin' Rod' is actually Jalal of the Last Poets, and the track is a previously unreleased item which he cut in New York in 1968, with Hendrix and Buddy Miles. 

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

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
