HEN Elvis Presley stepped before the MGM cameras for the first time in his career . . . the his career . . . the film was "Jailhouse Rock" . . . motion

film was "Jailhouse Rock" ... motion picture history was made. It really nailed down, once and for all, the claim to stardom by one of the most successful — just look at the box-office figures. There have been 22 Elvis films, with one "Double Trouble" just about finished and ready for 1967 release. He's made movies for Paramount, United Artists, 20th Century Fox ... but this story, in two parts, relates to his career with MGM. He recently signed for eight features with MGM, kicking off with "Spinout", which was "California Holiday" in Britain.

So here's what MGM claim for their "budding boy". It's been adapted by RM's Peter Jones, who thinks it well worth recalling the highlights of El's superstupendous career on disc and film.


After making his initial impact on the entertainment world via RCA Victor Records and standing-room-only personal appearances, Presley made his screen debut ten years ago in November 1956 with the 20th Century Fox production "Love Me Tender". Since then, he has created an individual star record unequalled in the annals of film-making. And his recording hits are equally astounding. In the Graceland mansion in Memphis, Tennessee are 44 Gold Discs, each an award for world sales of more than a million. In addition are multiple awards representing sales of five million and large records denoting album sales of more than 1,000,000 each.

Success has not spoilt Elvis.

It was great to see people get to their feet completely spontaneously. And dance where they stood. First, it was the stalls. Then the gallery. Finally, the circle. Everyone, on their feet... dancing ... waving ... and, especially, singing along with the Tops. It really was a beautiful night.

There's something about Motown music that alone can evoke such emotion and enjoyment. It's today's sound. Today's spirit. Today's 'feel'. 





I'm having dancing lessons, for instance, and learning Tap from the very basic. The foundation of a star is being able to entertain people and what I'm doing now is putting me in my stead for my later life.
"People have offered us lots of things, like Musicals. I worked on the score of one, wrote about 20 numbers and then decided I wasn't ready to do it just yet. I'd rather get to know more about it,
