O Sandie Shaw has confounded some of the cynics and fought back, at double-quick tempo, to her rightful place in the charts! RIGHTFUL place! In my submission, it's dead right Sandie has improved consistently since the first time she padded, barefoot, through a recording studio. There's been no resting on her considerable laurels . . . Sandie has worked hard at being a star. star

star.

So it's only right and proper that she should be high in the charts.

Somebody quite important in the business was saying to me the other day. "Tve never fathomed out what Sandie is all about. There was this gimmick of working without shoes on — that hogged the headlines and it was almost as if the fans had come to the conclusion that bare feet made up for a basic lack of talent ..."

That was somebody quite important. It's a view echoed by far too many people. Point is this: When Sandie first started, she WAS raw-edged. There was the gimmick of being discovered by Adam Faith, of announcing: "When I sing, I like to be able to wiggle my toes", of peering shortsightedly round at technicians and being baffled by the whole business.

But Sandie now must be judged on what she IS and what she BoES. And she is still one of our highest-paid girl singers and this, her twelfth single, is a big hit. Okay, it had abnormal plugging But the Eurovision Song Contest entry hasn't exactly been a passport to the Top Ten in previous years. Sandie, skilfully guided by Eve Taylor, has learned her craft — as performer and singer. What riles some folk is that she had to do all this AFTER having a hit record! So WHAT!

Again, there were the gloatings when Sandie's last couple

of records rather sank without trace. And more gleeful chuckles when a Divorce Court judge went, to my mind, outside the bounds of ordinary judgement. If there's one thing people like more than seeing somebody shoot overnight to the top—it's seeing someone shot down. But they were, with the amiable Sandie, much too early.

At a rough estimate, Sandie remains in the £2,000 a week class which is the sort of class to belong to. Trouble is, there is a distinct shortage of equal classmates. — especially boys!

She is also, clearly, destined to branch out into the acting field some time soon. Just as a matter of interest. She has had three firm offers to do straight acting roles, One was for a West End play, but Eve Taylor felt that Sandie would be better in a film for her first straight role. A musical on stage, however, would be most acceptable.

And, of course, there is the point that Sandie is much in demand for modelling — specially on the continent. Time has been against her doing much so far, but the French photographers consider her a "natural".

So what IS coming up? Well, there is an hour-long TV feature based on Sandie's top-shooting career, and it will also include Adam Faith. I understand it'll be shown round the world — Eve Taylor is producing.

Then there are cabaret dates in Italy and France during the summer. An Italian mate told me that Sandie is a very big property in Venice and all points south. It's really a twin-pronged sort of future, then Pop, acting, modelling. But most important of all, Fd say, is the hit status of "Puppet On A String". This came at just the right moment for Sandie. It put paid to the knockers. Laid low the libellers.



## ELVIS GOES UNDERWATER!

#### All about his new film 'Easy Come, Easy Go'

ELVIS PRESLEY has appeared in just about every setting during his long and energetic film career. Now, in "Easy Come, Easy Go", he goes underwater! All part of a search for buried treasure and he gets involved in fights and he suffers a little disillusionment when the coinladen chest is finally brought to the surface.

Which is a short precis of this new movie, released in the next few weeks by Paramount here. And it's also a guide that this is Elvis back to his swashbuckling, tough-edged best. Not that I've anything against him when, as recently, he's the anything against film when, as recently, he's been rather softer and more sensitive. It's just that those body twitches and heftily shrugged shoulders and positive actions are more HIM, if you see what I mean.

Anyway, "Easy Come, Easy Go" is a fine old romp, with plenty of action — and any gaps filled with songs which include some of the best he's ever included in a movie. Glorious colour, too. And girls, Girls galore, as they say. There's always one extra-special one in an Elvis movie. . . . this time the honours go to Dodie Marshall, a dark-haired ball of fire and enthusiasm. When Dodie dances, all one can say is that that dance is well and truly danced. Elvis slugs out the odd fist-fight, carrying the punches well and riding opposition left hooks with rather more skill than Billy Walker, It's an urgent Elvis, a U.S. Navy frogman just demobbed and in search of a fairly easy old life for a year or so.

It's essentially a YOUNG sort of film, both in story and production. But there are great performances from Frank McHugh as "Captain Jack", a phoney seaman who compered

I certainly got just that from "Easy Come, Easy Go". Something here and there is bound to be predictable. But entertaining, brisk, sizzling, song-studded, funny.
