It's all tied up with the name Columbia, as we've already said in this column, a really big name in the British record industry. The name though, is part of EMI in this country. They got it from American Columbia in the first place but when that deal fell through way, way, back, Columbia (America) began pushing their product through Phillips. Artists like Day, Frankle Lane, uis Armstrong, and Tony Bennett, all went out as Phillips records until 1962. Then and only then, did Columbia (America) decide to adopt a new logo for the British Market.






