



The ciaim came in a report from Ronald Fearm, principle lecturer in environmental physics at Leeds Polytechnic, who is heading a team researching hearing loss among school children. He is quoted as saying:

Stereo headphones are supported by the campendary of the control of house, parents are more likely to complain about the disturbance and cut down the noise. With headphones there is no such check."

But the people who produce the music seem to disagree. Mick Tucker of Sweet didn't think headphones were any

of Sweet didn't think headphones were any kind of problem at all. "I don't think the cheap ones are capable of making much noise, because it only distorts

the music when they are turned up.
Mike did admit, how-

ever, that both he and Andy Scott had gone slightly deaf after years of playing, though that was something which didn't seem to effect The Duke from Showaddy-waddy He stands with waddy. He stands with his left ear next to a 300 watt acoustic amp every night and he reckons that his left ear is still as good

his left ear is still as good as the right. Malcolm "The Duke" Allured only uses head-phones for recording so there's no chance of his hearing being affected by that.

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



DOWN IN London's Pimlico area, lives Brian Protheroe, also at times known, among others, as Johnny Tomorrow and Conway Tearle.

His flat, shared with a musical writer, Martin Duncan and an incredibly Duncan and an incredibly beautiful girl, has a rather vaguely trendy air, plenty of colour and light and for the basic clue to his real identity, a miriad of wall posters advertising various theat-rical productions.

For the year's most unexpected pop person-ality, Brian Protheroe is an actor, a life which has led him amongst other parts, to being Johnny Tomorrow in a "rather dreadful whodunnit" called, Death On De-mand. And then, there was Conway Tearle, the most recent of his parts.

Conway's role gave Brian his Summer's bread and butter, the



playing teenager found walking the streets forlorn and bewildered and transformed into a rock 'n' roll star.

When he now visits his record company, Chry-salis, Brian says it's like imagining, "myself as Conway Tearle!" How though, did he, the real Brian Protheroe make the actual record scene?



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

Time and time again I am asked the question "Do I need a licence to run a mobile disco?" The question invariably artes out of the statement on every record when states "Unaupressates" Unaupressates "Unaupressates" the desating and copying of this record prohibited."

However, the key to the problem lies in the words "public performance". Provided the DJ only entertains at private parties and dances no problem occurs. The parties and dances no problem occurs. The obtaining of a licence is only applicable where the event is a public one. If, on the other hand, the DJ wishes to provide a Disco at a public dance then a licence is needed for the at a public dance then a licence is needed for the playing of records. In fact to be accurate two licences are required. One from the Performing Bights Society which tasten licences and passes on royalties to the composers of the numbers Played. And secondly from Phonographic Played. licences on behalf of the record companies with ultimate benefits to the

Whilst a DJ can apply for a licence, the person with the greatest responsibility to do so is the organiser of the dance or event. To sum up then, a licence should only be sought for playing records at "public events. 
