





THE BBC in general, and Radio One in particular comes in for a great deal of stick from the public and more particularly, the music business, but Derek Chinnery, head of Radio One, can defend the station's record.

"I don't think the average listener appreciates the restrictions that we at the BBC are subject to. Radio One, like the commercial stations, have their hands tied over the matter of needle time, and we've fought many battles over that point though up until now the progress has been very slow

"I don't care who likes to contradict me, but if it wasn't for the restrictions, there would have been no cause or real need for the pirate stations. I don't need for the pirate stations. I don't think the pirates were a success because of their spontanelty, but be-cause they could play records 24 hours a day

day. Radio One began under tremendous strains. We had very little money, and in the end it was set up

very quickly, and we got attacked when we used jingles that everyone thought we took straight from Radio London. Our from Radio London. Our studios weren't ready for the likes of Tony Blackburn and Johnnie Walker. When they arrived they sat in one room and the engineer or producer played the record in another room. If you wanted to do a voice-over, it had to be rehearsed beforehand."

A recent splurge of activity in the "Anti Aunty BBC Campaign" has centred around the has centred around the latest set of audience figures produced by the BBC Rightly or wrongly the BBC don't publish the actual figures they compile, but what is the reason for this? "I think mainly the reason is that figures if

used incorrectly can be phrased or pieced togeth-er to give a variety of different interpretations For instance, when TV ratings say that 50 per cent of the public watch the BBC and 48 per cent watch ITV, that could either be interpreted that per cent don't watch
