

WELL DON'T say we didn't tell you! Pink Floyd WILL be playing a second series of 'The Wall' concerts at London's Earls Courl in June.

The fate of the concerts has hung in the balance for over a month; with promoter Harvey Goldsmith undergoing a series of 'delicate' negotiations with a third party who had already hired the hall for an exhibition and was then forced to cancel.

Now Goldsmith has been given the go ahead, and 'The Wall' (Part Two) will be presented at the arena from June 13 to June 17 inclusive. The same giant wall which was built especially for an American and British tour last year — and then systematically destroyed during each performance — will again be used, and RECORD MIRROR understands that the show will be essentially the same as last year, but with a few "special surprises".

More than 100,000 people saw 'The Wall' last year, and a spokesman for the band told RECORD MIRROR: "We hope that a lot of people who didn't get a chance to see the shows last year will be able to get tickets this time around."

And, as we exclusively predicted, the announcement of the concerts effectively means the end of the 'Floyd To Split' stories . . for the moment at least. But there will be no new product from the band to tie in with the

Mason.

Instead the Floyd will be making a film of 'The Wall', which will eventually surface as a "half cartoon, half live documentary" in the late summer.

RECORD MIRROR understands that a desire to complete the film by the summer was one of the principal reasons for mounting a second series of concerts. Some footage had already been completed after last summer's "season", and can be completed to the Floyd's satisfaction after this June.



"It has its advantages, though. We all get on very well, and being apart keeps us fresh... tull of ideas coming in from all the different channels.





"The present movement ian't about a style of music, it's about a state of mind, it means this movement that's happening now is going to be a lot more powerful and for a lot longer than other tashion in music has been. "It's a very positive way of looking at the future and attitudes to leisure time, taking the initiative and doing rather than shying away from things. The fans of bands like Visage. Spandau Ballet and Ultravox actually want something new. They want to be stimulated and it makes London a very healthy and exciting scene."

But hasn't your use of electronics negated the grounding you've had in jazz, particularly with reference to Richard Burgess' drumming?

"That will be the computer's role in society. Taking away the dross, the boring aspects of life, and allowing us to fulfil ourselves and express ourselves as individuals.



YOU'D HARDLY expect thanks from the powers - that - be for releasing a record whose very

releasing a record whose very lyrics decry racism and fascism and describe Hopalong Reagan as a "lascist god" now would you? But it's not just lack of airplay that's stopped '(We Don't Need This) Fascist Groove Thang' from making anything more than a small show in the charts (still outside the Top 50 after four weeks) — Heaven 17 have also fallen toul of the IBA. Adverts, even for Heaven 17 records, must be "legal eccent. Inconest and truthful" Apolitical too apparently, and since 'Groove Tang's clearly anti- fascist __no show. Not that they seem at all perturbed by the events, matters are in hand.

Virgin, their record company are attempting to make the issue a debating point in that hotbed of sixth - form tomfoolery laughingly known as the House of Commons, while a slightly altered version of the record (in which President Roy Rogers becomes "cowboy god" rather than "fascist god" I for those sensitive little radio people should ensure that the record gets the airplay it deserves.

Ian Craig Marsh and Martyn Ware, the two Human Leaguers whose acrimonious departure from that set-up occurred some time ago, have now re-surfaced as the British Electric Foundation, a songwriting / production sort of thingy whose first offshoot is Heaven 17.

The group consists of our two heroes plus singe Glenn Gregory, the "hunky aspect of Heaven 17" who arrives halfway through my conversation with Marsh and Ware sporting a gaudity coloured Human League T-shirt. His co-workers double up with taughter in the midst of their chicken and corn galettes.

in 'fascist groove thang — we
thought it was hilarious. We wrote
the words in a couple of hours.
"The single, and the album for
that matter, were recorded on an
eight - track only!!" exclaims Marsh,
"Compared to the average hit
single, ours was recorded in
absolutely primitive
circumstances," he adds groudly,
Heaven 17 apart, BEF have an
impressive set of plans for the
immediate future following the
release of their own 'Music For
Stowaways' cassette.
Available in that fourn only, in a
imited edition of 10,000, it's a
collection of pieces of 'ambient
music, sort of like Eno without the
pretensions. I mean, how could
anyone take titles like 'The Decline
Of The West' and 'Music To Kill
Your Parents By' seriously?"
They may well team up with
Cabaret Voltaire to record, and / or
with Clock DVA. Another possible
collaborator is Gary Glitter (gulp). A
Christmas single is planned alier Ay
and possibly some heaven 17 dates,
though emphalically not a standard
rock tour. Other projects in the
pipeline include an LP of cover
versions — of quality and
discrimination', of course —
including Lou Reed's 'Perfect Day'
and Glen Campbell's 'Wichita'
lineman.
You may take it that lack of ideas
will not be holding back the
progress of the British Electric

WHO MENTOR DIES

AFTER ACCIDENT

IT LAMBERT, the man who turned The Who into one of the greatest rock draws of all time, died last week after a tragic

died last week after a tragic accident.
Lambert, who was 45, suffered head injuries in a fall down stairs at his mother's home in Bloomsbury and failed to respond to treatment at London's Middlesex Hospital. Bill Curbishley, who now manages the group, said he believed a life support machine was switched off with his family's consent.
It was Lambert, along with actor Terence Stamp's brother Chris, who discovered The Who soon after they had released their first single 'I Am The Face' under the name of the High Numbers in 1985. It was he who used his reputation and standing to articulate to others the potential

behind the then outrageous antics

behind the then outrageous antics of the band.
Lambert worked directly with The Who up until the Ken Russell film version of 'Tommy'. He was also cowner of the forerunner of British independent labels, Track Records, a label which havens ent the directors. independent labels, Track Records, a labet which harnessed the diverse talents of artists such as Jimi Hendrix, Marc Botan's John's Children, 'Fire' singer Arthur Brown and Thunderclap Newman. Who leader Peter Townshend was said to be "horrflied" by the tragedy, fronically he was trying to get the services of kit Lambert to help in the production of a Who biography at the time of his death. "kit was a good friend from those times and lots of people will miss him," said Townshend. MIKE GARDNER.



girls, experience strong feelings of affection towards friends of the same sex, and experiment with sexual games out of sheer curlosity. Most boys, often more interested in sex at an earlier age than girls, have tried-out some kind of physical horseplay with masturbation as part of the game. It's all part of exploring and growing-up. You're feeling the backlash because you're emotionally involved with you're feeling the backlash because you're emotionally involved with your friend, but there's no reason to feel guilty or ashamed. What you've experienced shows that you're capable of relating to another person, someone you care about, and enjoying it. That's healthy. You've learned a lot.

CB RADIO

RECENTLY, I'VE noticed Citizens' Band radio kits in the shops and like the idea of having one of these radios in my car, but have heard it's illegal. Is Citizens' Band likely to happen in the UK, the same as in America?

Also, I'd like to join some kind of organisation flighting to legalise CB as I think it's a good idea, and hardly likely to bring the country grinding to a halt.

Citizens' Band Radio, the ● Citizens' Band Radio, the facility of having an open radio communication line in your car or vehicle, enabling drivers and truckers alike to make life on the road more interesting with conversation, has existed in the States for over 30 years. It's especially useful for truckers covering long boring distances to keep in touch with each other and locate their eventual destination.

covering long orbing distances to keep in touch with each other and locate their eventual destination. But, in spite of pressure from the growing number of British enthusiasts and supporters, the UK government has been slow to follow the lead of other European countries and America and legalise. Currently it isn't illegal to own CB sets smuggled into the UK, but transmission on AM frequencies currently used is against the law and subject to a £400 fine or three month prison sentence for the first offence. The Government argues that illegal transmission is causing interference on televisions, radio, hi - fi and, from time to time, has cut in on police and hospital emergency frequencies.

But moves are afoot to change the law, on the basis that if you can't beat 'em, accept' em. A new CB broadcasting wavelength 27 or 28 MHz FM, has already been allocated for future use after CB is made legal, provisionally this Autumn, but decisions on licensing, manufacture in Britain and importation still have to be made. As and when using CB is made legal, many sets already in existence, operating on strictly AM frequencies will be redundant.

was the press hype itself.



IT'S IRONIC that SLF's original public and press success should be precisely what stands in their way today. There are those who want to keep them in their teens, ship them back to Belfast and insist that they repeat 'inflammable Material' over and over. Then there are the others who insist that down the line punk rock of the SLF variety is passe, my dears, alright in its time maybe — but already a dinosaur.

'Go For It' won't dispose of the arguments of either camp but perhaps we should look for other ways of looking at SLF. This isn't a raw, rough record, nor is it 'Oi!' music. For the most part, it's well played and well produced clean hard rock with the recognisable SLF trademarks. Jake Burns's voice is as whisky gravelly as of yore, the guitars as determined hass and drums as precise. SLF in the studio are altogether cleaner and more precise at what they do.

Which, of course, is the problem. Cleanliness has never been one of punk's most important qualities and live, at least, SLF remain a punk band. On record however, we might do better to start thinking of them as a hard driving power pop band. These are merely labels but power pop is renowned for melody and melody has always been a strong part of SLF. Check out 'Just Fade Away' or 'Silver Lining' here. Or the major departure, the C and W style 'Gate 49'.

'Go For It' has characteristically committed lyrics from manager Gordon Ogilvis that cajole and command the audience to 'go for it', to avoid succumbing to the rat traps of sexism or repeating one's parents lives. The music is as direct as the lyrics, the attack as upfront didactic.

It was for them that their manager quit Polydor, leaving behind one of the most impressive A&R track records known in the business, notable scalps including The Jam. Sham 69 and The Banshees. The band was acquitting itself quite nobly, too: 'Killing An Arab: 'Grinding Hall' and 'Boys Don't Cry' were excellent 45s, each totally different yet sharing key characteristics which identified their allegiance to the same origins: adventurous bass lines. Robert Smith's plaintive vocals and an overall appealing atmosphere of wistful uncertainty.

Following the promising 'Three impressionistic direction. Gone was the hit single potential of the early material in favour of an ostensibly more "satistyingly profound" approach.

The Cure are lost in the maze of their spineless meanderings—the words superfluous, tempo changes mechanical and predictable and even the miserable titles telling it all—'The Funeral Parly'. 'Drowning Men'. 'Doub! etc etc.
Musically it's tempting to draw comparisons with Gary Numan, whose paucity of Islent meant that he ran out of ideas remarkably fast. Except obviously The Cure will never be a fraction as successful commercially, which will only serve to increase their martydom to their absolute nonentity of a cause.
Okay, so there's nothing downright offensive about this LP but since when did that alone justify existence, particularly at a time when so much of the garden is bright and green.
Ironically, like the BEF album, I suppose I'll hang on to this if only to play it to my brother and all his professional pals to show what loady's bands sound like, but knowing full well how hollow, shallow, prefentious.





ADAM AND THE ANTS The Ritz, New York By Simon Tebbutt

A DAM AND The Ants have created the biggest stir in America since the Pretenders. But the real excitement at their first New York date was out on the street where fans jostled with police in a scene reminiscent of Beatlemania.

Inside the oid Peurto Rican style dance hall a tightly - packed crowd watched a show which never quite hit centre. Audience response was enthusiastic but not rapturous with many people out for mere curiosity and a glimpse of the latest rage. The night only really came alive at the end of the 98 minute set with the more familiar numbers, particularly 'Ant Music' which exploded into three encores.

From the skull and crossbones festooning the balconies, to the pirate and Indian lookalike clones on the dance - floor, the scene was dedicated to images of Adam. And as the boy himself held centre stage by virtue of his carefully cultivated exotic sheen and coy sexuality which, at times seemed to be a covering for lack of real charisma.

Still, the rest of the band paled into insignificance in comparison, with the exception of Marco Perroni, who in pink skull and cross bones, conjured up the old images of keith Richards as a pirate.

The intricate subtleties and excitement of the Ant albums were rather lost in The Ritz and the numbers had a muted and muddy feel about them. But the humour of songs like 'Jolly Roger' and 'Rancheros' and the double dance rhythm helped to overcome this. By the end of the evening nearly everyone was bopping. At its best, Ant music combines the elegance of disco and the raunch of rock.

Still it remains to be seen whether Adam's obvious but potent pop culture images and theatricality can crack the AOR dominated markets of America. British bands are no longer a novelty here and despite the noble savage appeal the main thrust of this lot is seen as bubblegum music. But Adam And The Ants are attracting a lot of attention. U2 arrive surrounded by a sense of their own importance which they are determined to share with America. Bono announces U2 as rock redeemers insisting that this passive audience return his enthusiasm. The problem is that U2's music is introspective - he's not offering a solid cause around which a crowd might gather.

Like Echo, Teardrop, and Wahl, Bono loves to enthuse, to glisten. His eyes sparke with confidence and assertion as he rides the stage, clutching the mike like a staff, leading his warriors forward.

The music, all of 'Boy' and the singles, washes over the crowd, faintly Gothic, definitely twilight. In the shadow, boy meets man. Adolescence for U2 is more an initiation ceremony than it is the Undertones world of fumbling boys and girls.

For a while it seems as if U2 will falter on the passivity of the crowd. But then the con man in Bono Surfaces, he begins to dramatise, to insist that this is an event, that rock is about transformation, not business.

U2 need their audience badly. They wish to make a circle, to sail on their audience's affection into the mystic. Yet at the same time they use the audience for their own narcissistic purposes, boys staring into the mirror. Except in the seemingly mocking 'Toytown' there are no troublesome girls in U2's music. This is passion without an object, circling about itself. Bono works hard, he contrives an event. But do innocents contrive? And how will U2 grow up, what will they do as men?






