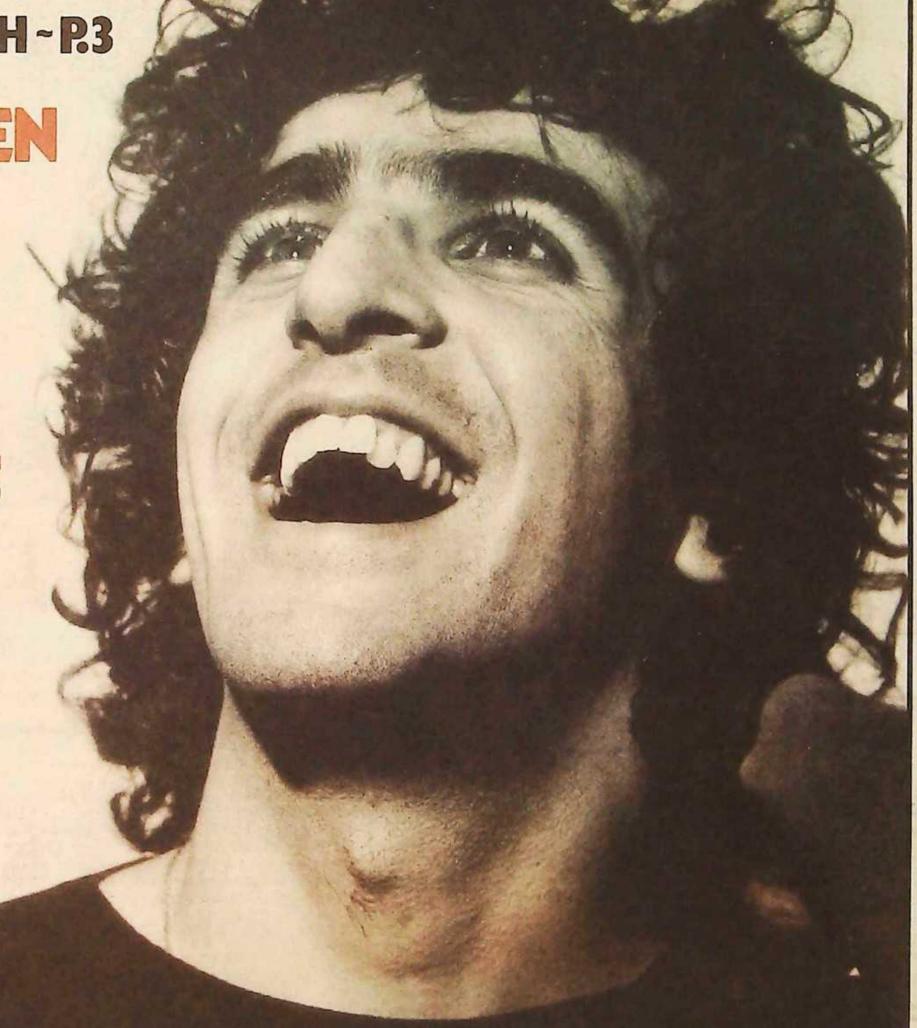

HEAD OF DAVID, in the wake of their first album (cunningly titled 'LP') on Blast First, are leaving their native Dudley for a few gigs around the country prior to a tour of Germany.

They will be playing Tufnel Park Boston Arms November 19 (with Crime & The City Solution), Manchester The Archway Club 24, North Kensington Bay 63 25.

At the latter two dates, Head Of David will be sharing the bill with Blast First stablemates Big Black (above) from Chicago, who are flying in for a few dates to support the release of their album 'Atomiser'. A reputation for wild live shows precedes them.

GARY MOORE is making a return to centre stage with the release of a new single and plans for a new album and tour.

The single, 'Over The Hills And Far Away', is released on December 10 on 10 Records as both a 7-inch and a 12-inch and is produced by Peter Collins.

'Over The Hills And Far Away' is taken from Moore's forthcoming album, 'Wild Frontier', which is scheduled for release in March and will coincide with a tour of the UK with dates at Edinburgh Playhouse March 26, Birmingham NEC 28, Sheffield City Hall 29, Newcastle City Hall 30, Hammersmith Odeon April 1-2.

Produced by REM producer Don Dixon, the album features a guest performance by fellow East Coaster Suzanne Vega.

CD SALES

Compact Discs outstrip all expectations this

QUEEN release their entire 14-album catalogue on compact disc this week, as CD sales start to outstrip all predictions made at the beginning of the year.

Five Queen albums are already available on CD and sales have encouraged EMI to put the other nine out this week. This means Queen now join the select club of major artists who have their entire album catalogue out on CD. Others include Bruce Springsteen, Dire Straits and The Police.

CD sales are now expected

to top seven million by the end of the year. In the first six months of this year, 2.3 million CDs were sold, compared with I. I million in the first half of

And figures just out for the third quarter of this year show CD sales reaching 1.7 million, which has encouraged the British Phonographic Industry to revise its forecast of total CD sales by the end of 1986 from six million to seven million.

Britain is also gearing itself up to meet the CD revolution. The recent opening of the Disctec CD planet at Horsham means that there are now four pressing plants in England and Wales. This is the largest number of CD

THE BIRTHDAY PARTY bass guitarist Tracy Pugh died in Melbourne last week after suffering an epileptic fit. He was 28.

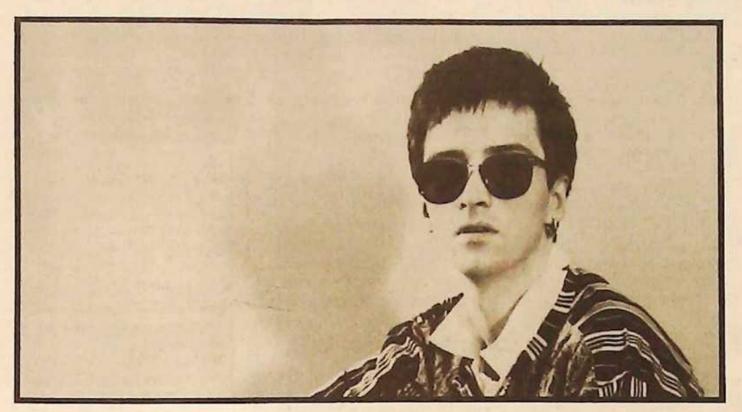
Following the group's implosion in August 1983, he returned to Australia to pursue a further education course, studying politics and philosophy at Melbourne's Monash University. Apart from a brief stint with the Saints in '84 and a guest appearance on Nick Cave's 'Kicking Against The Pricks' album, he had all but given up music.

A spokesperson for the rest of the band said "Tracy's contribution to The Birthday Party extended way beyond the behemoth bass lines which precipitated their pleasure avalanche. His formidable presence was in some ways the exact visual counterpart of their oral assault. He is remembered by friends for his robust intelligence and levelling humour. These qualities helped preserve Birthday Party from a slack and flabby old age. Sadly they could not save Tracy himself."

WIRE TRAIN, a four-piece band from San Francisco, play a one off gig at London's Marquee on November 25 before returning to the

For the past three months, the band have been in the studio recording their debut album for CBS. The album, as yet untitled, will probably be released in February.

JOHNNY MARRED



Third time unlucky for The Smiths as Johnny Marr is hurt in car crash and AAA benefit is cancelled

THE SMITHS' guitarist Johnny Marr (above) was involved in a serious car crash last week, causing the cancellation of their Artists Against Apartheid benefit with The Fall at London's Royal Albert Hall last Friday.

The concert will be rescheduled, but in the meantime, all ticket holders should contact their point of purchase about a refund. It's likely that the concert will be rescheduled at a different venue in order to raise even more money for the charity.

Marr sustained injuries to his neck and back, affecting the use of his fingers. Although not seriously injured, he has had to wear a neck-brace to help him cope with the shooting pains down his back.

The car apparently skidded out of control, hit a wall, and is consequently a write-off.

The Smiths have been dogged by bad luck since signing to EMI. Singer Morrissey was injured by fans at the band's recent Newport, Gwent gig and again at Preston a few days later.

MADNESS have a second greatest hits compilation, 'Utter Madness', released on Zarjazz on November 24.

The album takes off where 'Complete Madness' ended and includes the last eleven Madness singles from the band's biggest hit 'Our House' to their latest, '(Waiting For) The Ghost Train'.

Also included are two songs that never made it to single format-'I'll Compete' from the 'Mad Not Mad' album and a new version of 'Victoria Gardens', a song that appeared on 'Keep Moving'.

Those of you lucky enough to own a compact disc player will be offered a further dose of nuttiness with an additional CD track, 'Seven Year Scratch' - a scratch mix of many of Madness' past songs.

PURPLE REIGN (AGAIN)

DEEP PURPLE's reunion has survived, and they go back on the road next spring for British and European dates.

They've also been recording a new album which will be released by Polydor in January.

Confirmed British dates are at London's Wembley Arena March 3-4 and Birmingham NEC 7. Wembley tickets are £10 and

More dates may well be added to the tour.

THE ROARING BOYS face an uncertain future after losing two of their members to Cambridge neighbours The Bible!

Drummer Dave Larcombe and bassist Neil MacColl, brother of Kirsty, have become full time Bible thumpers after helping the band out on their new album 'Walking The Ghost Back Home'.

All this must surely put a question mark over the future of The Roaring Boys, who have been conspicuous by their silence since the massive media hype that accompanied their even bigger advance from CBS.

A spokesperson for CBS seemed to think a split was inevitable. The band's management, however, were adamant that all was well with the Roarers and that vocalist Paul Michell, keyboard player Stefan Osadzinsky and guitarist Chris Jones would carry on as a trio, in search of those elusive hit records they were paid for so many moons ago.

THE THE will have their Infected film shown in full on Channel Four on December 16.

The 'Infected' LP, which is released this week-end, is available initially in a restricted "brothel" sleeve which comes with a full colour poster of a painting by Andy dog, the artist responsible for all of The The's sleeves in the past.

SOARING

factories outside Japan, although at present British capacity still lags behind Germany.

But already a large proportion of British-made CDs is exported, particularly to the USA where demand is far outstripping supply from just two American plants.

The budget CD emerges this month when Virgin release a 14-track compilation from their roster of acts which will retail for around £5.99.

Compiled in conjunction with Q, the yuppies' music mag, 'Q CD' features such upwardly mobile artists as Phil Collins, Genesis, Simple Minds, Heaven 17, OMD, PIL, Scritti Politti, Feargal Sharkey and Working

The rise and rise of the CD has not surprisingly lured the pirates into action. Batches of compact discs of vintage rock recordings from the likes of Elvis Presley and Cliff Richard have sneaked into Europe from Japan via Denmark under a loophole in the copyright law there.

Not only are the CDs unauthorised and illegal in this country, but their manufacturers haven't had access to the original masters in order to make the CD. In some cases, the first noise you hear on your CD is the sound of the stylus hitting vinyl - a sure sign that the quality is unlikely to be better than an album.

CONFLICT, the anarcho-punk band, have encountered problems over their political associations.

The band had to cancel their Leeds University gig after there was a mini-riot outside. The rumour got round that one of the buildings was being used as an animal research centre, which didn't go down very well at the gig which was an **Animal Liberation Front** benefit. There were 32 arrests.

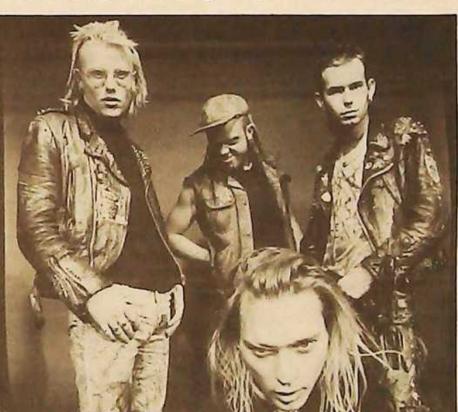
The band then had their **Bournemouth Rooftop Hotel** gig cancelled after a number of handbills had appeared linking the band with the National Front and anti-police activities, and the police are considering further action.

The manager of the hotel said he had "no choice but to cancel the gig". Between 50-100 skinheads turned up and there were a couple of arrests.

Following this incident, the local council in Perth decided to cancel their concert there.

The band have stressed their anarchist leanings, and a spokesman for the band said last week: "The band have absolutely no connections with the National Front whatsoever".

Into The Groovy ...



GAYE BYKERS ON ACID, those lovable leather clad mop-tops from LA (the Leicester area), have their debut single on InTape, distributed by Red Rhino and the Cartel, available now.

Released as a 7- and 12-inch, the single is called 'Everything's Groovy', and is backed with 'TV Cabbage' (a song about a skateboard trip into oblivion). The third track, 'Space Rape', appears as an extended mix on the 12-inch.

The whole thing was produced by Jon 'Big Boy' Langford, and recorded in Leeds. Live dates are expected soon.

THE SCIENTISTS' vocalist Kim Salmon is experimenting with a second career as a solo performer. He has already played a few gigs and recorded a four-track 12-inch entitled 'Shine' which is released on Karbon on January 23.

He will continue to sing with the ex-patriot Aussies on their forthcoming dates at **Brighton Zap Club November** 20 and London 100 Club December 9, but he is keen to "do his own thing as well".

Kim, on vocals and guitar, with Nick Comb on drums, will form the nucleus of the solo project. The remainder of the line-up will be different from gig to gig "in order to make each performance unique," he says.

The repertoire will also change each time and consist of self-penned songs and material as diverse as country, blues and even MOR numbers.

Meanwhile the Scientists themselves are undergoing changes.

"We've purged ourselves of all the old material," says Kim. "We're coming back with a rawer, more minimal sound".

'Rockin' Blues' follows lke Turner's grim attempts to step out from his wife's shadow (ahem) in the early '70s. It confirms that he was a better musician than a frontman.

'Blues & Soul' by Jimmy McCracklin comes from the late '60s and features a remake of his 1961 hit 'The Walk', a West Coast jump jive gem, and then branches out into doo-wop, blues, and Memphis soul.

'Mother-In-Law' is Ernie K-Doe's sole claim to fame and this album of the same name is his first ever British LP. It gets behind the novelty hit into some Allen Toussaint-produced funky gospel.

ATLANTIC STARR, the White Plains soul crossover combo whose line-up has gone from nine to five over the past decade, but is still based around the original nucleus of the Lewis brothers, have a 'best of' collection called 'Secret Lovers' out on A&M. It takes tracks from four of their six albums including 'As The Band Turns', 'Circles', 'When Love Calls', 'Touch A Four Leaf Clover' and 'Freak-A-Ristic'.

SEE FOR MILES' latest '60s reissues offer a slight return to Cliff Bennett And The Rebel Rousers and Dave Berry plus a trip round Liverpool and a dollop of psychedelia.

'Got To Get You Into My Life' features Cliff Bennett's three hits plus 17 tracks to show that they were a shamefully wasted R&B combo condemned to the pop circuit. Years ahead of their time, Brian.

'This Strange Effect' keeps you waiting until side two before yielding up Dave Berry's most distinctive hits, devoting the first side to his R&B beginnings with The Cruisers.

'Liverpool 1963-1964 Volume Two' roams around Decca's vaults to revive such minor classics as Beryl Marsden's 'I Know (You Don't Love Me No More)', The Dennisons' 'Walking The Dog' and 'Be My Girl' and The Mojos' 'Everything's Alright' and 'Seven Daffodils' together with a few that might have been better left gathering dust.

'The British Psychedelic Trip 1966-1969 Volume Two' takes a colourful trip through EMI's cellar. Kippington Lodge, Tomorrow, Idle Race, Love Sculpture, The Moles, The Pretty Things, Keith West and Davy Jones And The Lower Third are among the names who will bring a smile to the lips of hippies young and old. But probably not for the same reason.

ELVIS COSTELLO regains control over his complete catalogue with the acquisition of his first album, 'My Aim Is True', from Stiff by Imp (through Demon). Like his most recent album, it was produced by Nick Lowe. Demon have also picked up on the original lan Dury 'New Boots And Panties' album from 1977.

DUCKS DELUXE, pub rock heroes during the early '70s who've just reformed for another tilt at the London club circuit, have their best bitter out on an album called 'Don't Mind Rockin' Tonite' on RCA. Side one includes their 'Coast To Coast' single in '73 and tracks from their debut album the following year. Most of side two features their Dave Edmunds-produced 'Taxi To The Terminal Zone' album but there's a couple of posthumous discoveries at the end.

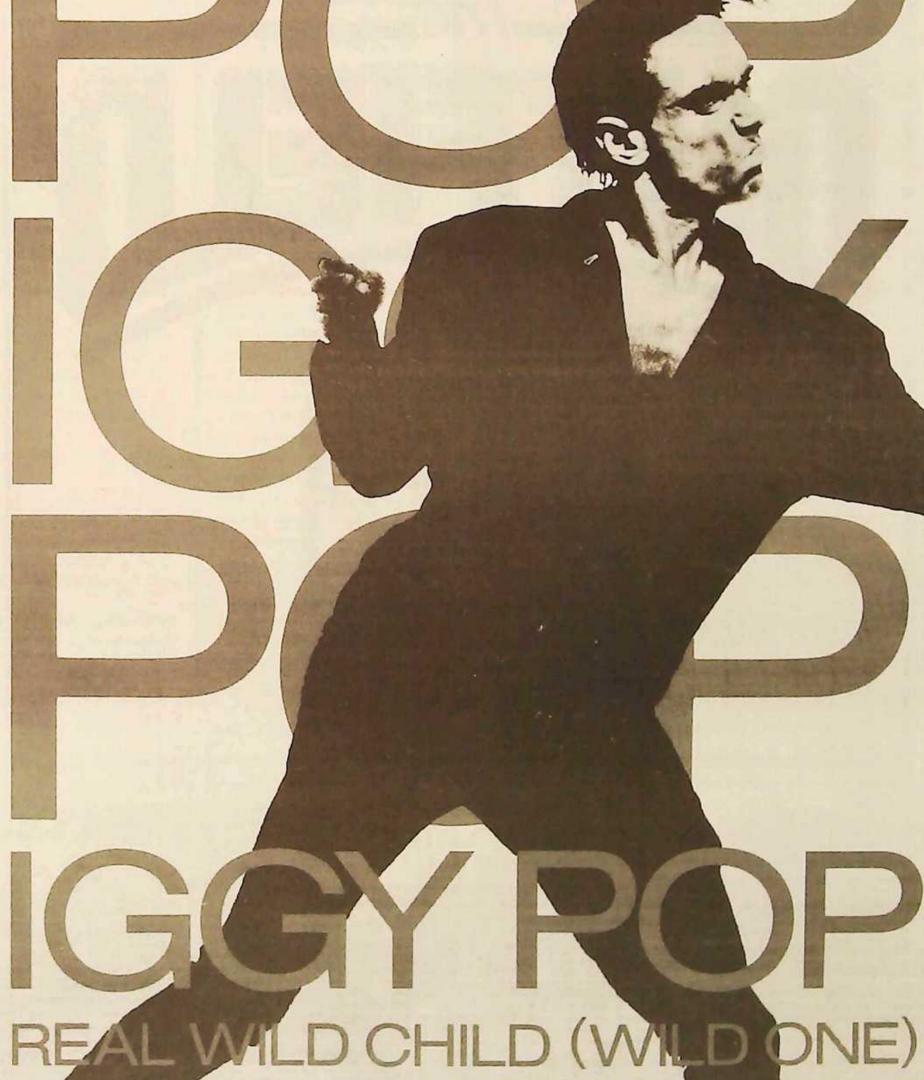

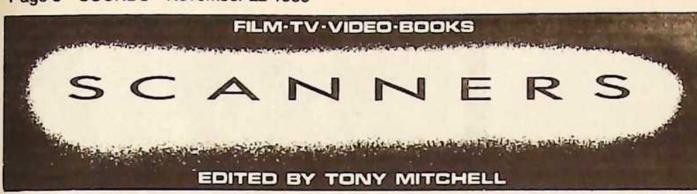

CRITTERS

(Palace Pictures)

CRITTERS, OR Krites as they're more properly known, are the razor-teethed, bastard progeny of a Gremlin and Roland Rat. They mill around like tumbleweeds with a dentition worthy of Esther Rantzen and devour anything that they bump into. What's more, a space cruiser full of the blighters has escaped an appointment on Death Row in a neighbouring galaxy and landed on Earth.

Pursued by a pair of extra-terrestrial bounty hunters, the Krites wind up in the back yard of a Kansas farm and lay seige to the Brown family, gradually increasing in size as they gorge themselves on sundry livestock and humans. Meanwhile the bounty hunters (one having transformed himself into a facsimile of a famous rock star) have landed at a nearby town where they

bemuse the locals and have a run in with Harv (M Emmet Walsh) who, true to his roles in *Biaderunner* and *Biood Simple*, plays a lawman, this time a bucolic sheriff.

Eventually the bounty hunters find their way to the Brown homestead for the confrontation with the Critters. Do they get there in time? Well, that would be telling.

Critters is a strange beast, falling halfway between a parody of the recent spate of films involving diminutive, people-terrorising creatures and a straight, albeit benign, horror/thriller. It does have some nice in-jokes – Mrs Brown is played by Dee Wallace Stone, Henry Thomas' mother in ET, and at one point a Krite pounces on an inflatable ET toy – but this doesn't resolve its identity crisis. It's reasonably funny, reasonably scary and reasonably dispensable.

BIG TROUBLE IN LITTLE CHINA

(20th Century Fox)

ONCE UPON a time, John Carpenter was the originator of that genre of films where grubby, ill mannered anti-heroes led small, abandoned gaggles of innocents against seemingly impossible odds in tight, claustrophobic circumstances. Times and fads change, but Carpenter's output remains as stable as the Californian sunshine.

From Assault On Precinct 13 through to The Thing, there's always been a hint of the ruthless supernatural, and usually it involves a confrontation with Kurt Russell or Jeff Bridges. And so it is again as Russell becomes Jack Burton – fearless, arrogant, sweat-soaked imbecile. In fact virtually the same character he played in Escape From New York (and for that matter Elvis: The Movie).

The story, of course, is implausible. But after a slow start where we're not sure if it's horror, comedy or straight adventure, the plot explodes in a ball of vicious, flaming violence, and before you can say "Hong Kong Phooey", you're on board a rollercoaster ride into the catacombs of hell. A nightmarish labyrinth, awash with evil oriental tortures, mythical monsters and much hokus pokus.

Hero Jack proves to be a major liability to his diminutive allies – always somewhere else when it matters most. It's not his fault; he's a fearless fighter who's a mite too ham-fisted to be effective, though no one seems to notice.

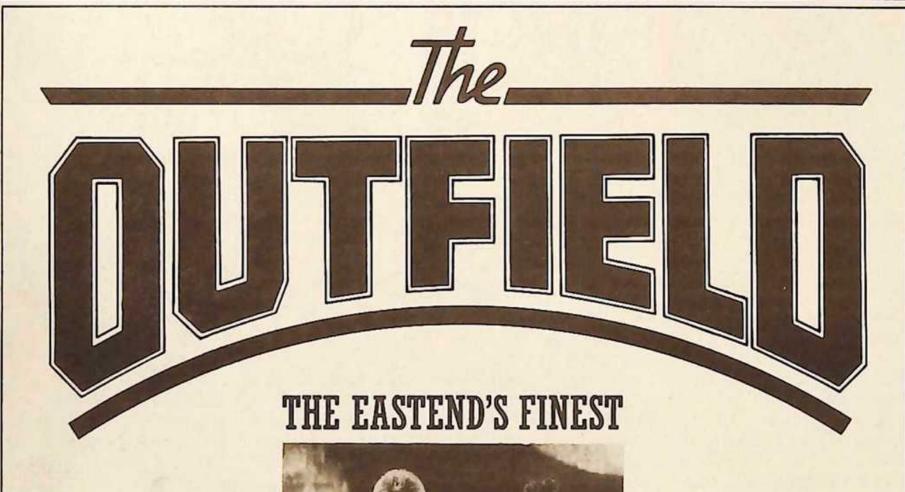
The overall effect is of a gigantic arcade video game where, whichever way you turn and no matter how many baddies you zap, there's always another horde of yellow devils ready to overwhelm you just around the corner.

Fu Manchu, Charlie Chan, Rupert The Bear. They're all here complete with spectacularly tacky special effects (neon-lit Gods?). The Raiders influence is obvious but Carpenter injects enough of his own special magic to make Big Trouble matter. Glorious.

VIVA ZAPPA Dominique Chevalier

(Omnibus Press)

AN IRRITATING fact that all Zappaphiles have to suffer is that many classic old Zappa fanzines were written, at least in part, in French or German. Dominique Chevalier's recently-translated glossy tome Viva Zappa comes across as a sort of sanitised, '80s version of one of those European Zappa mags that littered adolescent male bedsits throughout the early '70s.

Viva Zappa is a curiously jumbled work. After the inauspicious opening bid - a record company-type biog that scampers through his life (a couple of paragraphs on the film 200 Motels fail to even mention the director Tony Palmer, with whom there was such a classic falling out) - the second 'chapter', an A-Z of Zappa thoughts and witticisms, is notable mainly for a gloriously stupid editorial blunder. Under A, for instance, we find Zappa's thoughts on Friends, Love, and Money. Uh? Amis, Amour, Argent!

These 'thoughts' primarily take the form of extensive quotes from magazine articles cunningly glued together with the odd home-grown phrase or sentence. Zappa-isms old and new are trotted out, eg on pop videos: "People who think of videos as an art form are probably the same people who think Cabbage Patch Dolls are a revolutionary form of soft sculpture"; and on jazz: "It's a bunch of people trying to be cool, looking for the certification of an intellectual community" (though I far prefer "Jazz isn't dead. It just kinda smells funny", which is not quoted here).

Subsequent chapters continue in similar vein, with profiles of some of the three million musos he's worked with, and background material on some of the three million records he's made.

Viva Zappa gets better as it goes along. A large chunk of the second half of the book is taken up with reprints of articles written by Zappa himself, including the famous piece Edgar Varese, Idol Of My Youth, and the book concludes with an up-to-date 'thing-ography' which lists not only all Zappa records but books (written about him and by him), videos, films, fanzines, and Zappa appearances in other people's films and records, etc.

Richly illustrated, Viva Zappa will still be of little help to those looking for fresh insights into the man; nor will it be particularly helpful to those who may be unfamiliar with this oddball bandleader. It is, however, a rich enough source of material to please ardent Zappaphiles who may have spent years poring over European fanzines wondering what pearls of wisdom they were missing.

To make this point, which isn't specifically a feminist analysis, the Prof lumbers chronologically through the work of some 70odd vocalists varying from Billie Holiday to Janis Joplin and Patti Smith ad nauseam. Rarely do the artists breathe on the page; even those he is obviously passionate and illuminating about, like Joni Mitchell, die of strangulation by ropey language.

Furthermore, neither does the Prof convincingly site his subjects in a wider cultural context. There is very little echo of the changing times and attitudes which helped shape the music of the women involved.

Grell Marcus, with his phenomenal Mystery Train, proved that it is possible to write intellectually, emotionally and imaginatively about music. The best I can say about Angels is that it has the first quality only and, as such, would make a good book for bedtime, since you aren't likely to get past more than a couple of paragraphs without falling asleep.

And then there's the flattop cellist breaking off from his Bach sonata in mid-flow for a drag of his cigarette.

This film is to the '50s what Monterey Pop was to the '60s.

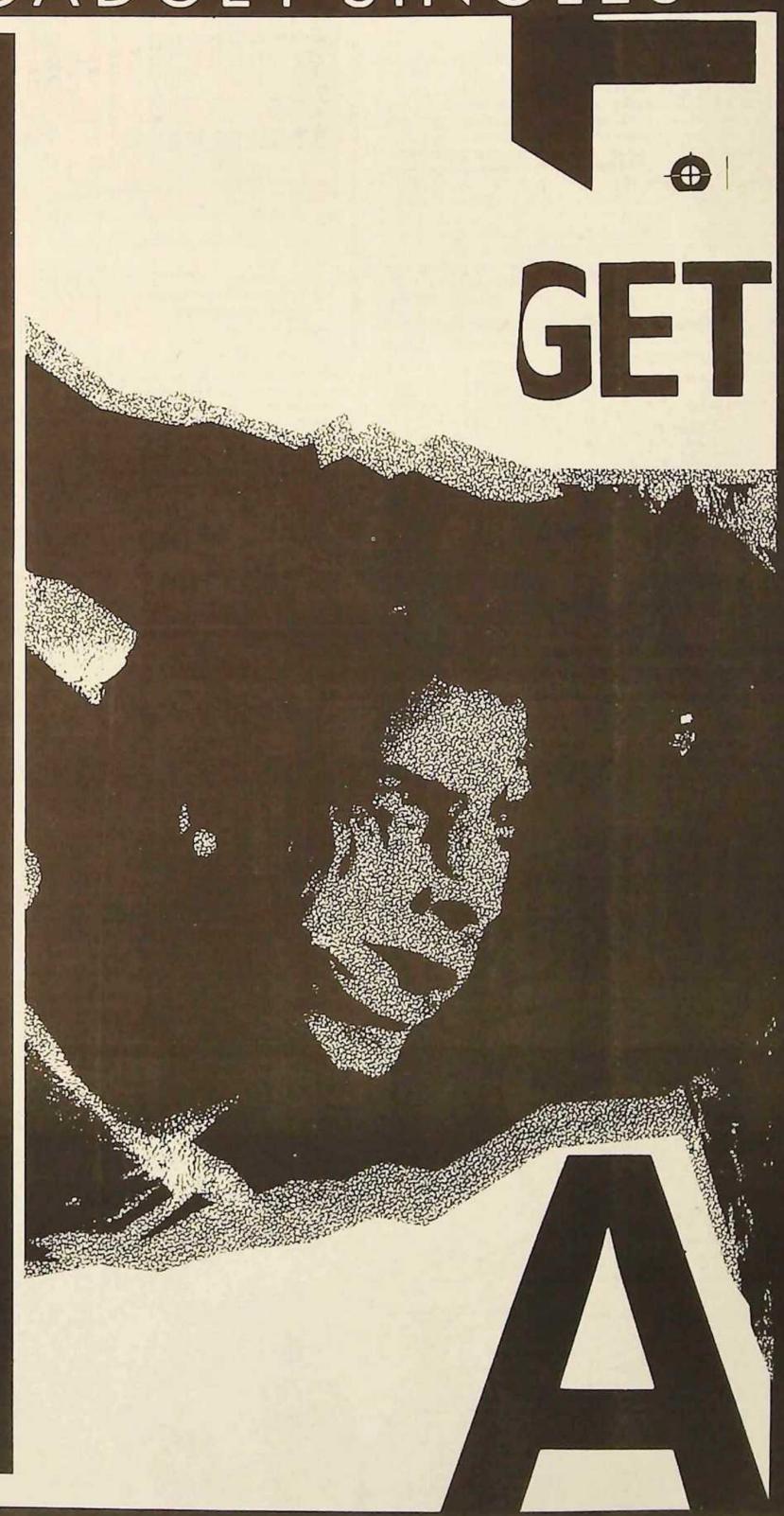

THE SALLIES: Waiting for the weekend

THERE'S SOMETHING about the ring of confidence that emanates from Salvation Sunday that makes you think they've been around for ages. But they haven't. With one single, 'Cold Grey Eyes', they've done the rounds and made sufficient impact to justify the major label attention they received earlier this year.

"Getting a deal is like taking your O'levels," muses Steven Winterbottom, an ex-resident of Bexhill-On-Sea and brother of vocalist and much talked about figurehead Joanne.

"We'd sort of got together in Bexhill, which is a place where old people go to die, and we knew we'd have to move up to London if we wanted to get any further. We played in London and almost immediately there were several deals on the table, from EMI, Stiff and Island."

So how come you ended up at Polydor? "EMI were saying that they'd

make us the Next Big Thing and all that. We just couldn't take them seriously. Polydor were much more realistic about things."

The praise that hovered over 'Cold Grey Eyes' didn't, however, spread to the radio.

"Basically, the general feeling from the radio was that the record was too unusual, which surprised us."

Still, what the hell. The band's next 45 is 'Heart in Motion' and it's a hard, fast pop tune, something quite different from 'Cold Grey Eyes', and maybe that will break new ground.

While they walt on a response to 'Heart In Motion', the group are working on their debut album and returning to the live circuit where Steven assures me they are at their most effective.

But, with such a forceful front person as Joanne, do Salvation Sunday think attention to their music might be overshadowed by references to her blonde locks?

"We've had all that stuff and no doubt it will carry on. She's been called the new Blondle, the Dulux dog, Julie Christle, even Chrissle Hynde. But she's very much a part of the group, and really she's too rude to people to get all the attention."

So, is it easy being in a group with your sister? Do you fight

"No, not now. I used to tie her up and lock her in the lavatory but I like her a lot more now."

Just as well really.

THE ICICLE Works and Pete Wylie have joined forces on the current EMI "anti smack" album 'It's A Live-In World' for a version of Neil Young's 'The Needle And The Damage Done'. The song was actually recorded early in 1985 and has been gathering dust until now because of a dispute between Icicle Works singer Ian McNabb and Pete Wylie's manager Pete Fulwell. Plans to release it as a single were abandoned when Fulwell argued that both artists might be seen to be promoting their own careers on the back of a national tragedy. When 14-year-old Jason Fitzsimmons died from heroin abuse, McNabb urged "desperately" for the song's release but Fulwell resisted. Wylie was torn between his desire to see the problem highlighted and his reluctance to be seen to be making a cynical "career move". Both parties then agreed to release the song as part of a Liverpool anti-heroin compilation album, but that was scrapped. At least now if they are criticised for making career moves they'll be in the company of Elvis Costello, Paul McCartney, Wham!, Feargal Sharkey, Howard Jones, Ringo Starr and many more.



FLOGGED TO DEATH

"THE WHOLE world has gone bonkers about The Boss," reported *The Sun* last week as millions of fans flocked to buy the '1975-85' box set.

According to their report, fans were spending £25 million a day and that the album sold three million copies in just four days.

The paper even sent one of their reporters to New York to buy 100 copies because Britain had apparently sold out.

But what interested us here at Jaws was the news that a certain music Journalist had taken their review copy (free from CBS) round to the 'flogger' shop two days before the official release and was greeted with the remark "Oh no, not another one", and Just £10 for the set.

With this in mind we sent one of our trusty Jaws researchers out around London's flogger shops to find out what you can get for a mint condition '1975-

Reckless Records of Upper St offered £10, saying it would sell for £18. Zippo in Clapham offered £12.50, as did the Notting Hill and Pembridge Rd branches of Record & Tape Exchange.

In Camden R&T offered £10 saying it would sell for £20, while Rhythm Records explained that '1975-85' "Is not something we want to sell".

The best offer we got was from the Goldhawk Rd branch of Record & Tape Exchange, who offered £17 "If It's brand new", which is not what we'd call good business sense when dealers can get the thing direct from CBS for £16.99.

Seeds Of Contempt

Roy Wilkinson talks to The Walking Seeds, who wanted to be called Blue Nosed Bee

GIVING VENT to their cynicism in a variety of accents, The Walking Seeds are on the road as part of a package from Probe Plus, the home of Subutteoinspired satirists, Half Man Half Biscuit.

Not that them playing together implies any mutual respect, as guitarist Barry explains: "The only thing Probe bands have in common is that we hate each other. We loathe the other bands, particularly Gone To Earth."

The Walking Seeds
germinated from the body of
the noise-broking Mel-O-Tones
when they parted company with
guitarist Martin Dempsey. Frank
(vocals from Barnet) and Bob
(bass from Barrow) were joined
by native Scousers Barry (guitar
and sideburns), Tony (drums
and scally sensibility) and Lol
(more drums and Jimmy
Tarbuck jokes).

The Mel-O-Tones break-up was swamped in acrimony, something that makes Bob not want to discuss it: "That was a previous existence, nothing to do with The Walking Seeds."

Barry is less reticent, taking a swing at his predecessor with the kind of contempt that this band reserve for 95 per cent of the known universe: "Martin 'power pop from Lancashire' Dempsey? Ah yes, he's a big influence on me – I try to never play like him. If he used one chord, I'll try to avoid it."

The Walking Seeds' recorded output to date is 'Know Too Much', a four-track EP which gained the coveted Sounds Single Of The Week award some months back. Live, they've abandoned half of this cauterising yet deceptively

organised bundle of nerves, sticking with 'Tantric Wipeout' and 'Eyes Too Big For Your Balls' and discarding the other two tracks as "too sub-Beefheartian".

That may well be, but Beefheart is a fair reference for this band whose racket sounds more like it came from the art schools of America than the Albert Dock.

The limited list they agree on as worthy peers, a list which includes The Swans, Sonic Youth, The Butthole Surfers and sundry '60s Americana, seems unlikely to offer safe harbour to a band from their adopted home town. Just ask Bob: "Every other band in Liverpool is crap."

Frank is in substantial agreement: "It is pretty dull. It seems that if you want to form a band, you have to go down to this council office where you get a band rule book, official band licence, an assigned name and a list of U2 riffs.

"In fact, when we went down we were lucky – they said we could be the more outlandish mob, something we didn't mind because the licence for that was cheaper. The only thing is, is that week 5,000 new bands started up as opposed to the usual 3,000 and by the time we got there, they only had names beginning with 'W' left. We were a bit pissed off because we really wanted to be called Blue Nosed Bee."

Well, let's be thankful for that. They wouldn't be quite the same if they were called The Entire Population Of China, Sixteen Tambourines or some other arch Mersey moniker.

Here's to The Walking Seeds, the Liverpool band who aren't.

SOUNDS CONFUSING

In Spacemen 3 Ricky Kildare finds a rock 'n' roll band in the best traditions of the 13th Floor Elevators, the Velvets and the Stooges, who make a "staggering melodic screech"

"IT'S THAT moment, that orgasmic peak in a song where everything comes together and it's just all over the top with confusion. It's a sound, a taste and a smell. It's all one solid thing, a feeling – the concept of confusion."

We're heading somewhere into the darker regions of abstract city here, so I'll let you in on the big one.

Spacemen 3 are a rock 'n' roll band in the best traditions of the 13th Floor Elevators, The Velvets (cf 'Sister Ray') and The Stooges. In other words, they make a glorious, mindenveloping wall of noise, tinged with a healthy streak of. . . erm. . . psychedelia.

I imagine this is quite a feat of will coming from a place called Rugby.

"No, it's brilliant in Rugby, it alienates us from all this," says guitarist Sonic, casting a hand around a tiny Soho coffee bar to indicate the capital at large. This gives vocalist and guitar No.2 Jason a chance to speak.

"There's too much going on down here to take in. And you need lots of money too."

But don't people hate you in Rugby?

"Yeah," says Sonic, jumping back into the fray. "But how did you know?"

Oh, something to do with the prophet being hated in his own city. "Yeah, they begrudge us our comparative success; the fact that we've got an album ('The Sound Of Confusion') and a single ('Walkin' With Jesus') out. They hate us because we use drugs and they hate to see someone who uses drugs go out there and do something."

And just how would you describe it, this something?

"We're just trying to show people that there is a primitive enjoyment which you can get out of music, and any three people can form a band and get on stage and do it.

"There's nothing clever or technical or musical about what we do. It's quite the opposite of that. What we play is actually quite minimal, and purposefully so, just to show that you can get this primitive enjoyment easily."

Oh, such modesty from one who makes this staggering, melodic screech. Still, I know what he means.

"We spent £800 making our album, and there's all these people spending a fortune making records which aren't even enjoyable. For all the money they spend, they don't gain any more excitement."

I know, it's an economic equation that doesn't work. So

what's your answer?

"Some of the most sincere things ever done were done by illusionists, like Orson Welles. The difference between fakeness and truth is absurd; to me it's purely the result, the product that counts.

"For example, there is a painting, The Man With The Golden Helmet, which had always been attributed to Rembrandt. But a few weeks ago some experts discovered that it is, in fact, a fake; this completely f**** the idea that individuality primes everything.

"Many people had considered the painting to be a masterpiece, simply because it had Rembrandt's signature on it, which is a stupid attitude – you could call it the museum syndrome."

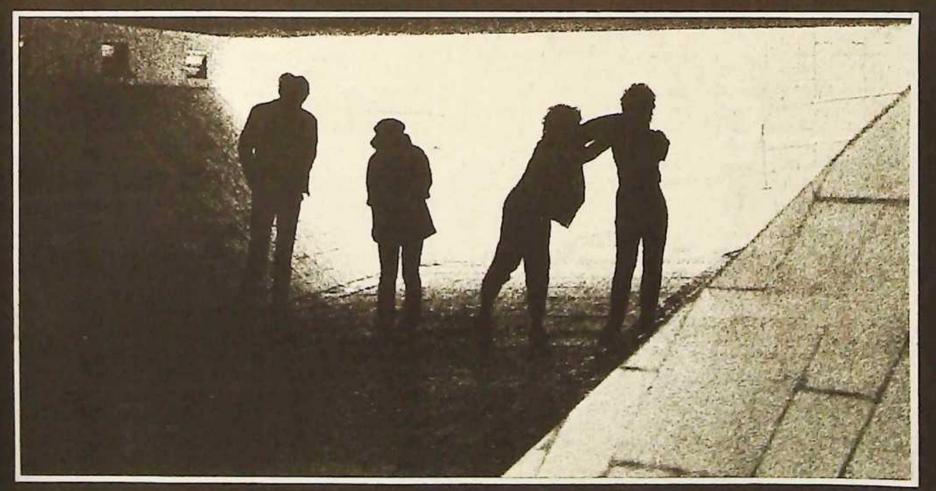

However, when the notorious McGhee management team pick something up and throw it at the wall, you can bet your life it's gonna stick. Doc McGhee has a mean track record. He's engineered the unprecedented successes of both Mötley Crüe and Bon Jovi; and The Unforgiven is his new baby.

Conceived in the ashes of The Stepmothers – "a prototypical Hollywood hairspray band" – John Henry Jones (singer, sole songwriter and one of four guitarists), describes The Unforgiven as, "a band of roving rock 'n' roll pirates with a tyrant attitude and a mental age of about four and half".

Imagine a hybrid of U2 and Blazing Saddles – The Unforgiven slide a collective tongue firmly into the corner of their unshaven cheeks and perpetrate a rousing, albeit lyrically plaintive collection of anthemic icons decrying the injustice of the Wild West.

"I write sick pop songs," says John Henry. "And I'm often accused of preaching. Sure, some Americans have a conscience, especially people like ourselves with Red Indian ancestry. But the US press has really been taking the whole thing far too seriously. They just don't get the joke. You Europeans seem to be much more receptive to self deprecating humour."

The Unforgiven have a bad reputation, probably the worst of any young band on the road, according to Jones, and have already been banned from the state of Colorado for life.

"It was nothing to do with me, I was at a baseball game. I've never raped anybody," he insists.

"Apparently the management at the Holiday Inn panicked and called the police after somebody spotted women's underwear flying out of the window of one of the rooms we were staying in on the sixth floor. But the first thing I knew

about it was when the law turned up at the gig in Denver to escort us off stage. They gave us until midnight the same

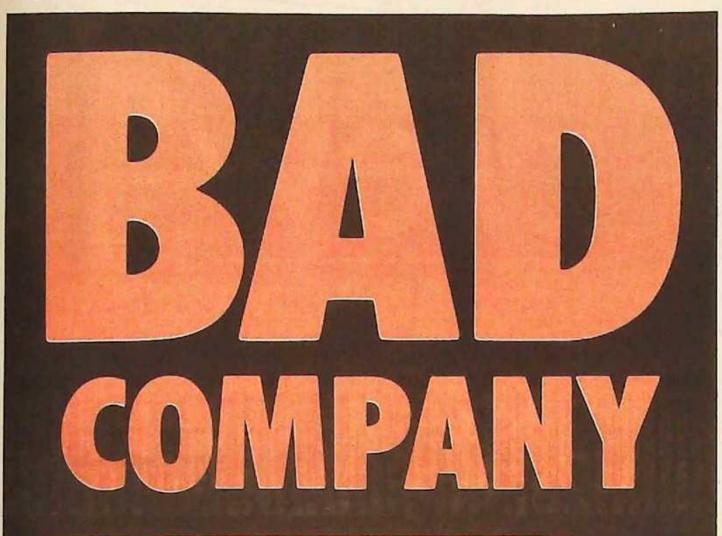

THE PRIMITIVES want to have real pop hits with songs they'd like to think comfort people. HARRY SWIFT (who he?) talks to the band who don't pout but do boast a pop goddess with an urge to be rich and famous. PARKER caught the hamburgers



OW I ain't dumb but I like my music loud with chicks singing and The Primitives sound alright to me.

They're Tracy, Paul, Pete and Steve, they're from Coventry, they're young, and their second single, 'Really Stupid', is scraping seven shades of shit off the roof of the indie chart.

"We are nice people," they tell me, wondering why I'm invisible. "We don't do anyone any harm. We sound nasty and beautiful at the same time, we're inexperienced but varied. Anyone who compares us to any other current bands is just being lazy. We don't pout, we just adopt a cool stance."

"I'd like to think our songs comfort people," says guitarist Paul, who once fell over a baby at a wedding reception, was quite barmy at school, has slugs in his bathroom, doesn't like romance, wonders about life, thinks he might as well be an arrogant bastard if that's the impression people get even though really he's just shy, and has fine taste in sleek black jerseys. But is he a rebel?

"I trod on a mouse once, but that was an accident. I crushed its head. I was only about eight so I didn't know what I was doing. Carry On Cowboy was on.

"You remember these things."

Steve and Pete are the hairy rhythm section and are not averse to laughter.

Pete wishes more girls would come backstage, small girls, while Steve notes that civilised people tend to throw hamburgers at them in the street.

Drummer Pete has an elastic face and climbed up the front of a butcher's shop the other day. Steve's cat could've been called Wardrobe or Jesus, but it plumped for Jello. They both suffer from insomnia. This comes out in the music. Paul, by the way, is going to kick hell out of his guitar one of these days. We eat grapes.

Tracy sits patiently waiting for pop goddess status and is surprised I'm not mentioning The Shop Assistants. I'm not lazy. She's a tough lady if she needs to be, and wants to be rich and famous, because that's survival. She doesn't get depressed as often as the three boys "who aren't very typical", and her cats are called Jet, Prince, Tiger and India. She used to live in Australia. She's pretty.

Since their first release, 'Thru The Flowers', The Primitives have gigged incessantly and the roaring new single (the other tracks 'We Found A Way To The Sun' and 'Where The Wind Blows' are just as powerful but more subtle) will further increase their following, who have a tendency to stare longingly into Tracy's eyes.

Paul: "Peter Skellern."

Pete: "Clint Eastwood."

Steve: "Laurie Anderson."

Tracy: "Fred Flintstone."

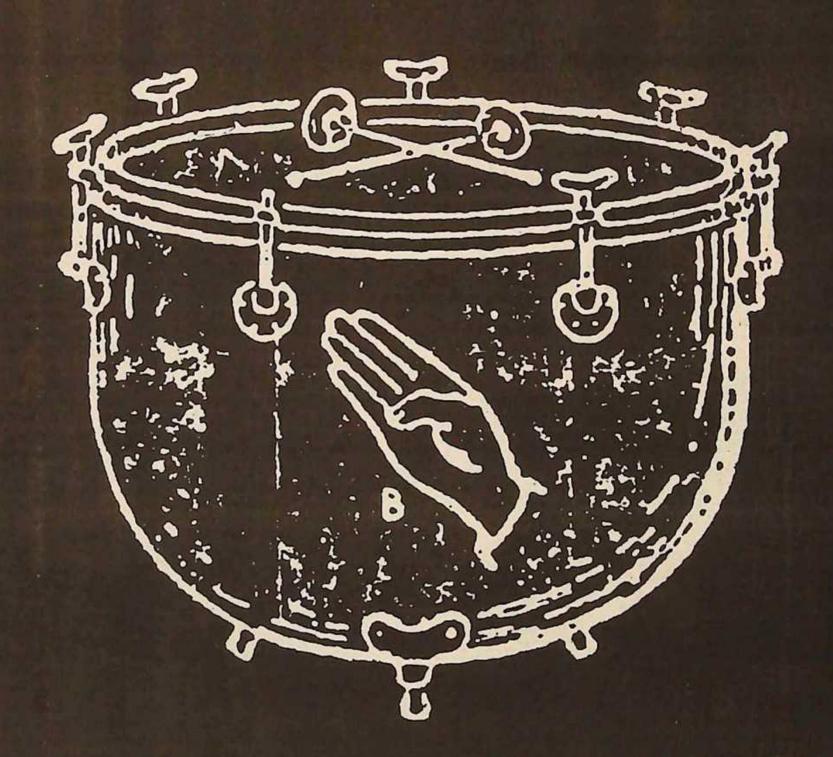
The Primitives' aim is to have real pop hits, and here is Tracy's burning message:

THE FATAL KILLING



With the release of KILLING JOKE'S new LP, NEIL PERRY finally gets the chance to do what no sane person would volunteer for — that is, spend a lot of time with the band's lead singer. Is Jaz Coleman really as mad as a hatter or is it just the way he laughs? In between wild car rides to wreak vengeance on unsuspecting rock writers, we find out the truth. Straight faces by PETER ANDERSON

CURSE OF JOKE

KNOCK KNOCK...

AZ COLEMAN has two smouldering coals where his eyes should be.

He cuts through the boisterous chat of his three fellow jokers and announces, "It's occurred to me that we never play our records to journalists. Let's listen to some music!"

He places a copy of the new Killing Joke album 'Brighter Than A Thousand Suns' on the turntable and cranks up the volume. By the time the third song comes hurtling out of the speakers, the band are in a party mood. Wild bassist Raven, who has spent the previous hour getting increasingly out of it, leaps off the sofa thrusting his groin madly, guitarist Geordie sways hypnotically while drummer Big Paul makes do with tapping his foot. As for Jaz, he may as well be on the stage of the Hammersmith Palais, eyes closed, arms raised dramatically, DMs pounding the floor. They are all smiling.

We are closeted in an office no larger than the average bedroom and we're inside Virgin Records HQ, because it's that time of year again; Killing Joke are back, new album, another tour, and a whole round of interviews in which the press would once more try and gain the upper hand on a band who have long stopped caring what the papers think of their music.

Killing Joke or Killing Joke, it's never been an easy ride, whichever way you look at it. They've spent seven years laughing while people consistently failed to get the punchline, seven years of journalist-baiting, rumour and intrigue. And – lest we forget – there are five previous studio albums, one live, and countless singles. They are also the most powerful live act I have ever witnessed.

'Are Killing Joke the most horrible group ever?' screamed a pop glossy in a recent interview, and that's been the upshot of it all to date. Even this organ has been guilty of indulging in high-horse judgement, giving their second album 'What's THIS for. .!' five stars for the music but one 'morally'.

'Thinking man's metal', the 'new barbarians', or even 'a complete bunch of bastards', it's all been water off a duck's back. Killing Joke turned their faces to the horizon and never looked back, surging forward on a mission of broiling passion. I first saw Killing Joke when I was 15 years old – such an impressionable age, I've always thought.

And now we're 'Brighter Than A Thousand Suns', smoother than before, more reasoned, a more accessible way to tell a joke.

O THERE I was, stepping into a cage full of docile lions who are slowly waking up. Whether they are in a room or on a stage together, Killing Joke have a predatory nature which they seem unable to repress, no matter how good their intentions may be. Raven and Geordie are having hysterics because we've been discussing the effect that their music has on people.

"That was the first thing we ever set out to achieve," says Paul in a voice that is as calm as it is deep, "a state where you play live and you leave such an impression on people that whether they love it or hate it, it can't be ignored. We want to reach a state of frenzy. We reach into our very souls and throw the excrement at each other. It's..."

"F***** horrible," concludes Raven.

And it seems to be true that people don't forget. Their long silences between each record/tour — 18 months since the last — seem to increase their popularity rather than kill it off. But the silences are of equal importance to the band as their music. They travel. It's all part of the joke, you see.

"You can't do seven years in a band called Killing Joke and just point out the flaws in your immediate environment," says Jaz, getting quickly fired up, this being the first of many times I would hear those last two words.

"Sooner or later you become obliged to create a more desirable reality. I don't think we can accomplish that much here. Going back to these holidays we all go on, they..."

"Become recces!" smiles Geordie, which causes Jaz to throw back his head and emit his comically evil cackle, long and loud. And Killing Joke are now playing their favourite game, dropping hints, cryptic clues, toying with me.

"We intend ambiguity," explains Paul.

"We don't want to be talked about in specifics."

"That you're here," ponders Jazz, "and attempting to express that which possibly cannot be expressed is very interesting. But it's something indefinable, and essentially completely unintellectual.

"My concern for all of us is that each one in the band... we set up our own environment and we materialise what we've selfishly given ourselves to, all our dreams. And we're close to doing that. We'll do it, because we always get everything we need."

Jaz then announces that he wants to read some poetry and, ignoring Raven's protests, he recites a piece of Sanskrit writing, describing what many believe to be the first nuclear explosion about 7,000 years BC, and from which the new album's title is taken.

"That affected me. The whole thing fits into my idea that civilization, when it's reached the final stage of growth, always arrives at the same point. Fission, or the splitting of the atom or a natural cataclysm — it's irrelevant which."

So it's inevitable?

Raven: "What do you think?"

Jaz: "Yes! Yes! What will it be like?!

How will you react?"

How will you?

"Mind your own f***** business!" He quietens down almost instantly, and waves at the world outside the office window.

"It's important to see beyond this, which I can only conclude is temporary. The atmosphere at our gigs relates to that. The future."

Five minutes later the rest of the band have departed and Jaz and I sit in the Virgin press office, waiting for a car. He hands me a recent cutting taken from a provincial paper, which tells of the death of a man who has been impersonating Raven for the last two years. Jaz is morose and darkly amused by the whole episode.

"Ha! We've known about him for some

time. It was coming to him."

Sorry?

"It was coming to him, we knew about this chap."

But the fact that he got wiped out in a motorbike accident. . ?

"Raven took particular offence to it."

And it would be silly to draw any
conclusions I know, but. . .

"It all depends on your intentions. If you associate with it, or use the name, it all depends on your intentions, what happens to you."

So this guy using your name was. .?

"He was wrong! But he was taking it further than that. He was taking... certain benefits in certain areas."

His eyes are burning now, and I'm thinking, How can you deal with this when the line between what is and what is not is so fuzzy, so indiscernible? I suppress a nervous giggle, but have no more time to think about it, because Jaz rises and growls, "Come on. We're going to Melody Maker."

We march out of the building to a waiting Mercedes. Jaz, you see, has just read something about himself that he takes offence to, so has decided to do something about it. We climb in the back, and I recall a tale Geordie related to me earlier about the time Jaz dealt with a person who was dealing in Killing Joke tapes without the band's permission. He strolled drunkenly into the poor sod's office, pulled up his own sleeve, slashed his arm and dripped blood over the guy's head.

On the way we stop off at a fishing tackle shop and then a butcher's, and I listen to Jaz calling Killing Joke "...a beautiful orchestra" and feel the first tremors of serious panic.

By the time we reach Melody Maker, Jaz is energised, possessed, a huge grin stuck on his face. We stroll into reception, where he asks to see various journalists and is refused. When one arrives, he asks who wrote the offending piece. He cannot be told, so he turns to the reception desk. He empties the tub of maggots he has been carrying onto the desk, then reaches into his pocket and pulls out hunks of liver which swiftly join the maggots. Various people start screaming. And I realise I'm enjoying this afternoon.

Jaz leaves, grabbing me as he passes, but not before leaving an order that the writer in question apologises over the phone within 12 hours. He did. That afternoon.

So we run out, Jaz shaking with psychedup anger, and jump into the getaway vehicle. We arrange to meet again.

WHO'S THERE?

FEW days later I meet Jaz at the plush King's Road offices of EG Records. He is in a fine mood, and paces around the room rubbing his hands together.

"Oh, I feel good today!" he announces, stuffing tobacco into his pipe and puffing away like a wise old sage.

"I'm looking forward to the new year, because it'll be time for me to transform what started out as a band into something. I'll be able to publish my book, and possibly my symphony, and I know precisely the direction I want to take the writing. I want to reflect total control of my immediate environment, and obviously to do this I'm

going to have to change a lot of things in my life. I need a base from where I can achieve these ends."

His book, An Irrational Domain, is the story of the killing joke to date, as important a part of the Jaz-Joke jigsaw as the new album or his symphony (Jaz had classical music training from the age of seven until he was 18).

"In my book it's Killing Joke all the way through. It's a biographical outline of a philosophy or a way of thinking. My approach is anti-intellectual because all my conclusions are derived from experiences. There's a lot of adventures, a lot of things I've felt compelled to write about because no one would really know what the four of us have been through, and the people we've met. When you use a name like Killing Joke you meet a lot of nutters... ha!"

He runs his hand through his jet-black hair. Today Jaz is warm, friendly and amusing, a man with an incredible reserve of mirth. All his waking, and probably most of his sleeping, moments are taken up with coming to terms with an approaching holocaust, or 'extremities' as he calls it.

"The week of the Libyan crisis... ha ha! It was hilarious! We got onto the travel agency, we had our flights booked out the next morning. You've never seen anything like it when the record company got wind of it. Ha! We didn't like the look of things at all!

"Human instinct picked up on it, it was thoroughly interesting. My phone would not stop ringing, people getting hold of my number. . . don't ask me! I familiarise myself with this nightmare to get over my own problems with facing the inevitable. I have to ask, what is my response? That has been the sum total, the motivating force behind book, symphony.

"It must dawn on people that after seven years I'm either a complete nutcase or have a healthy curiosity in something that I think is inevitable."

Are you a nutcase?

He pauses, for longer than seems

"No, I'm not a nutcase. Fanaticism is the only way one can react or respond to a situation of overwhelming odds."

He talks about the time he flipped and ran off to Iceland, the time of their third album 'Revelations', a period that saw the band lose original bassist Youth and gain Raven.

"It was a certain time, it was freaky. I was going mad then, seriously losing my mind. I'd decided ten months before to leave on February 25, 1982, the day before my birthday. We also started Killing Joke on the 26th.

"I'd made more money up until that point than ever before, and it was important for me to blow it all, get rid of it and go to Iceland with just £1. The idea of security was repulsive.

"At that time I was intimately involved with Norse mythology, and all the characters – Odin, Thor – had become as people to me. They were promiscuous, they liked getting drunk. Life in Reykjavik almost became like legend, the boundary between reality and legend was dissolved. It was a remarkable time for me, a big change.

JESSE JOHNSON 'Crazay' (A&M) So, you wanna be a rock writer? You saw our ad in Sounds and you like the idea of saying "I'm on the guest list" and being given demo tapes by total strangers? And you like making enemies you say? Well, stick with me, kid and I'll make you a star.

First, you gotta pick a Single Of The Week. How? Well, is there a Prince single this week? No? Well, is there something like a Prince single? There is? Then off you go.

"Jesse Johnson is a former member of The Time," you say with great authority, reading it off the press release. "And this single is taken from his second solo album 'Shockadelica'".

Why else should this be Single Of The Week? Because, unlike most of the others that lie there all flat and round, this grabs you by the throat and yells PLAY ME! until you give in. If Jesse Johnson hadn't made this record, it would probably have made itself, so strong is its will to live.

With the added name-dropping value of Sly Stone chipping in with his five cents worth, 'Crazay' fills all the other criteria of singlemindedness, vanity, total involvement of the whole body, exotica and bad spelling that go together to make a winner.

Lie back and think of Minneapolis.

If we start giving Iggy Pop bad reviews there's no telling where we'd end up. Anarchy, that's what it'd be. So even if it doesn't move you terribly much and you now own 104 records all called 'Wild Child', try to think of something positive like how he is very thin and how he 'invented' punk. Try to avoid mentioning the record. Hopefully no one will notice.

YELLO 'Vicious Games' (Remix) (Mercury) Erm, there's also this thing that says you can't slag off Yello either. Why not? Because they've got funny names and Fairlights and wings, that's why not! (Memo to Dieter and Boris: please co-operate with me in this by not just remixing a three-year-old song and by putting something dead good and groovy, eg 'Live At The Roxy', on the A-side instead of the B-side so I don't look like a complete sycophantic bastard in future. Thank you.)

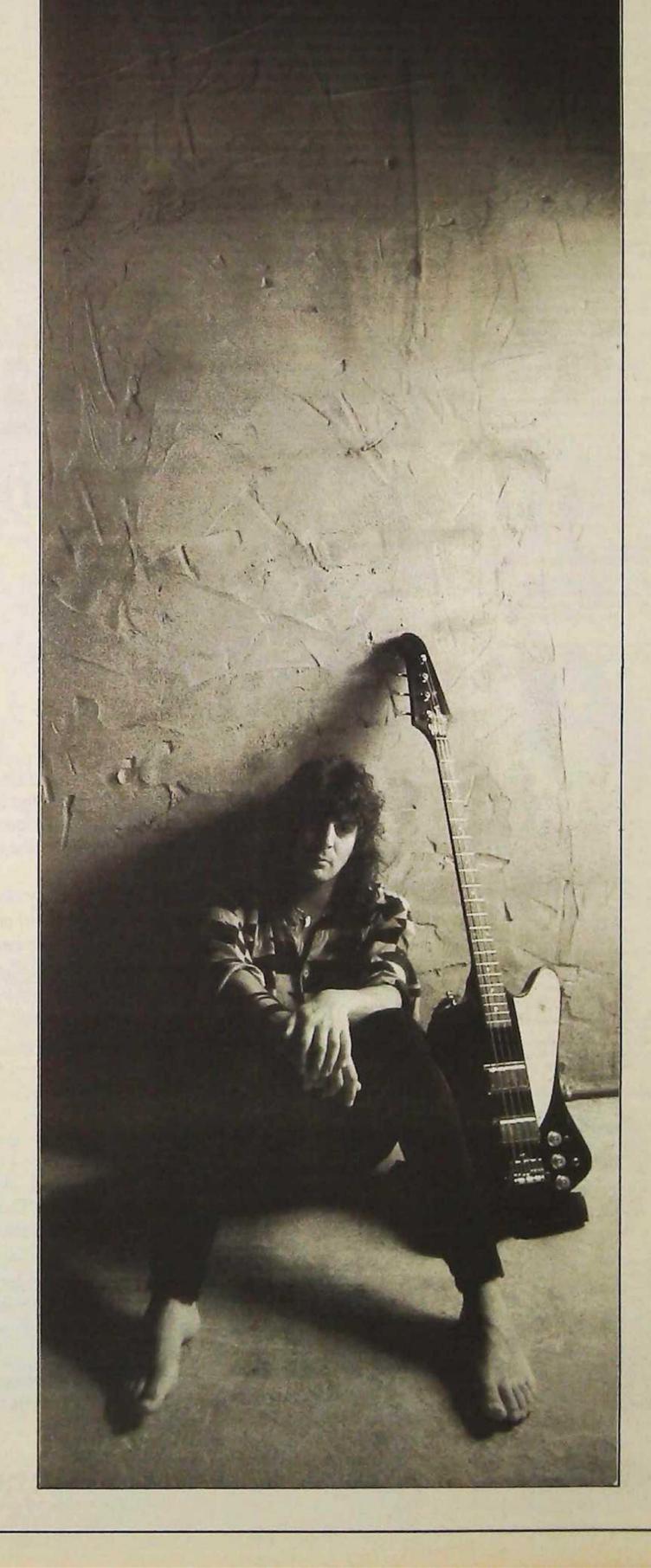

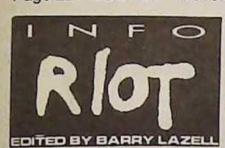

BIG SOFT PUDDINGS

Otway, Barrett and Blancmange revisited

THANKS FIRST this week to Les Wainwright of Cheshunt, Herts, for tying up loose ends on our recent discography of

John Otway. Despite what I said at the time, there had been one previously published Otway listing: Les himself had compiled it in August 1981 for the Margate-based fanzine Back Trax, though obviously it only included releases up to that time. Anyway, he offers the following additional snippets:

"The 'Headbutts' single on Stiff Indle was also pressed with the catalogue number STIN 1, while there was a further official Stiff single release which you overlooked: BUY 115 'The Turning Point'/ 'Too Much Air, Not Enough Oxygen' (1981)

"On the album front, it's worth pointing out that the Polydor 'Way And Bar' album was available in no less than four different sleeves, all carrying variations of the same theme,

SPANDAU BALLET 'Through The Barricades' (CBS 450259)**

YUP, YOU do not play about with Spandau Ballet, children. They are serious and firm young professionals, serious and firm, children, serious and firm. They combine classical piano with standard rock guitar, coffee table soul with penthouse funk. Their production is the ultimate gloss out, their image the Yuppie wet dream. They are polished performers who work stealthily with confident salespeople. Masters of the flog, they could give dull, off beat pub rock a coiffure, place it on a band's credible caravan of singles, and promote it as lean and efficient aural entertainment.

As bold as gold, Spandau Ballet have collared all popular contemporary styles and compressed them into one tight selection of songs, titled it 'Through The Barricades' and given it the prestigious honour of being the new LP. It is an insight of Spandau Ballet's immediate existence and surroundings. A situation where style is measured in personal wealth and sincerity in facial stubble. Note, even Gary Kemp is clean shaven on the sleeve shot.

Waiting for some excitement and passion on the A-side proved even more stupid and hopeless than waiting for the last train home. The B-side was only marginally more pleasing than the walk home in the rain. The only track worthy of real attention is 'Fight For Ourselves', a grossly unrealistic and reactionary anthem that can only have been written by someone who has never had to really fight for anything in their life. Someone who has reached the top because they are fortunate to live in a free enterprise mediocracy and not a true meritocracy. Someone like Spandau Ballet.

To cut a dull long story short, Spandau Ballet have ironed out any dare, lust or imagination from their sound and have left themselves so stiff they are of no use to anyone but their bank managers and undertakers. They are sexless pillars of white British pop, probably friends of Ultravox, and for both reasons only good for pissing against.

LITTLE RICHARD
'Lifetime Friend' (WEA
WX72 242018-1)***

AS A child, I spent most of my time hiding in cupboards. Every time I mutineered in some small way, my father would resist reaching for the sharp end of his slipper and reach for Little Richard's 'Tutti Frutti' instead. Slipping it onto the old Dansette, that unearthly caterwauling would send me diving amongst the brooms and old newspapers everytime. Once, he had to call the Fire Brigade to get me out and they had to lure me with copies of Whizzer & Chips and packets of Spangles. Eventually, pater's ploy toppled onto its side; young Wilde fell for Richard Penniman's Awop-Bop-A-Loobop every time like luggage off a cliff top.

These days, of course, the magic has dimmed somewhat and you can't find Spangles in any corner tuckshop. Richard's great screechy bits aren't quite as terrorising. In fact, you need a search-party to find any screechy bits at all.

These days, God is sharing Richard's favourite sofa again and rock 'n' roll hardly gets a look in. Most of 'Lifetime Friend' subsequently sounds perfunctory at best, the odd inspired soul sliver ('Somebody's Comin" and 'Ray Of Sunshine') slugging it out with a herd of blotchy old rockers, buried without protest under the sluggish Stuart 'Shakin' Stevens' Colman production. Meanwhile, the overall song quality is not all it could be, most of these clodders sounding like they were

rescued from Shakey's weekly garbage and Band-Aided back together again. The real Little Richard, the one who's spent half his life in carnal overdrive and the other half thumping a Bible and healing lepers, is nowhere to be seen. Come on out matey and give us a screech, we know you're in there.

'Lifetime Friend' isn't much coming from the man who invented rock 'n' roll. In fact, this waste of rock's most transcendent bellows borders on sacrilegious. I didn't rush for the tallboy once, feeling sort of cheated. Mind you, the old man didn't half give me a clobbering when he caught up with me.

KIM WILDE 'Another Step' (MCA Records MCF 3339)**1/2

SAY WHAT you will about Kim Wilde, no one could ever accuse her of being Diana Ross. So why on earth did she attempt a cover of 'You Keep Me Hangin' On'?

Of all the hit hungry attempts to recreate or embellish upon the staggering perfection of one of Diana's most supreme moments, only Bernie Nolan's faithful and breathtaking track on BEF's erratic 'Music Of Quality And Distinction Volume One' has ever impressed. And even though the current pop climate of 'safety first and creativity last' could conceivably see Kim Wilde's version outsell the original, all that could really achieve is a condemnation of today's sterile chart culture.

It also neatly underlines a few points about Kim Wilde. Firstly, she has only a thin and failing voice, incapable of expressing the soaring heights and plummeting depths of emotion which characterise the truly great singers.

Secondly, her true talent is simply for being Kim Wilde. For dressing in black and exposing her midriff. For adopting a distant and unavailable Madonna persona. For wailing prettily behind a thin veil of technology. For bouncing her otherwise inadequate vocals off a wall of sound built from loud guitars and a bricklayer's drum kit.

Kim Wilde's greatest talent is for fitting in. 'Another Step' fits in just so.

ROGER HOLLAND

HEAVEN 17 'Pleasure One' (Virgin V2400)***

MORE AND more do Heaven 17 seem like a missed opportunity – or rather, an idea beaten down by the business it works in. Though given ignorant reviews, 'How Men Are' was a subtle and accomplished set; but it was also a business failure, and when the game doesn't pay off something always calls you to order. 'Pleasure One' is the mistaken response, shuffling Heaven 17 a little deeper into the mainstream.

They still sound like a group theorising about pop, but the teasing line between theory and practice has lost its appeal. The lustre of their doctrinaire pop has gone dull somewhere in the production line. 'The Luxury Gap' and 'How Men Are' were cold records full of dazzling moments: 'Let Me Go' and 'This Is Mine' might have been cynically brilliant exercises, but they were brilliant all the same. This time the material is cut by rote. They use more 'real' musicians and give them tasks of machine-like precision.

One waits in vain for the contagious melodies and body-snapping white beats. 'Contenders' and 'Trouble' sound like exhausted remakes: one was recorded in five different studios. Curiously, Glenn Gregory – once the scorned element of the H17 mix – is now their only distinctive trick. His elegant, marbled crooning narrates rather than sings these songs. Sometimes, in that voice, you catch a

THE THE 'Infected' (EPIC EPC 26770)****

FOR MATT Johnson, a knowledge of his own land is the knowledge of himself. Affected more than he can bear by the feel of England, its shambles and its gore, he absorbs it, feeling himself absorbing it, against his will. The sound that comes out when Johnson throws back his head and screams is a formless, lupine howl.

I love that sound.

I loved it when it echoed out of The The's first LP, 'Soul Mining' — what was that, two and a half years ago? — and 'This Is The Day' strung me out cold with the hopelessly brittle, storm-soaked sound of my home, a rainy country. There's wet all over 'Infected', too, but it's the wet of sweat on a furious, rhythmically-moving torso.

What Johnson is up to now is his own transformation, and this jazzing and rolling and tearing piece of plastic is access to that. The first step in any war is to know your enemy. Matt examines himself on the first track, 'Infected', a consideration of a love so full, so ripe with juice it rots; it can't stop itself. Love's not always clean — it thrashes most when stench and grime itch on its thighs. Matt Johnson likes legs like that. There's a deep, magnetic beat to dance to, should you want to, Zeke Manyika and trumpet clarions setting the theme for a far more multi-layered noise than The The would have produced three years ago.

Analysis works into 'Out Of The Blue (Into The Fire)', too, underplayed acoustics letting the Johnson strangle pick its way like razor blades through the softest, most vulnerable dunes of your ear. "I was trying so hard to be myself, I was turning into somebody else." Sweat it out.

There's self-controlled passion and strength seeping all over this thing. Even when the pieces that close each side are recognisably weaker works — 'The Mercy Beat', particularly, disappearing in cramped and overused imagery, vultures and crows thrown away inside a limp melody — there's something magnetic in the starkest The The coda to each crafted syllable. 'Slow Train To Dawn', no particularly special sound, admits ex-Rip Rigger Neneh Cherry's fresh stream of vocal to lift it; 'Twilight Of A Champion' trots like a '60s soundtrack, and though we know the sentiment by now — "Y'see, I sold my soul to pay for my dinner/My stomach grew fatter but my heart grew thinner . . . I ain't lyin', I'm dyin' . . . " the horns wake this out of any self-indulgent reverie, pull it into shape like a clothes-horse.

And the clincher? You know it's 'Sweet Bird Of Truth'. As this masterpiece escalates into a spiral to death, Vietnam GIs watch the bird they're in go down with dopey smiles on their faces. We watch, dopey inside our own bird. Matt Johnson's mission is education for himself and for us.

"This is your captain calling/With an urgent warning/I can't keep her up/This bird is sinking."

CLAN OF XYMOX 'Medusa' (4AD CAD613)****1/2

THE SECOND sincerely striving album from the Amsterdam-based group formerly known as just Xymox may not have any of the answers but its questions are phrased beautifully. Background information: the first album was more varied and piercing and not all of Xymox are prima donnas but one is.

'Medusa''s overriding achievement is that every track sounds like the finale to a brooding epic overture. 'Medusa' grows more frighteningly strong each time you turn and look

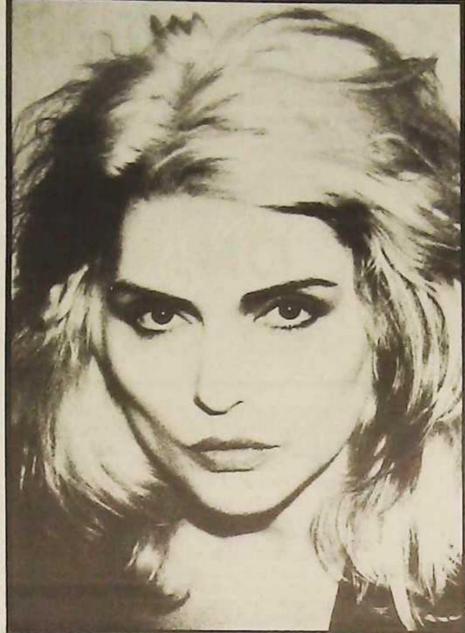
PETER HAMMILL 'And Close As This' (Virgin V2409)****1/2

NOT LONG out of short trousers I saw Van Der Graaf Generator, Peter Hammill's first group. I thought they were dead bloody boring. A decade and a bit later I witnessed a solo Hammill concert at WOMAD. I thought he was dead bloody good. Now, for the first time ever, I sit down and listen to a record of Peter's, his 25th album to date no less, and it's dead bloody transcendent. Funny that.

'And Close As This' is a confluence where human faith, hope and charity meet deceit, despair and greed. By turns, it's turbulent, tender, angry and vulnerable. Above all though, whichever emotional tunnel Hammill guides us through, his torch always sheds new light on old themes and his performances are utterly convincing.

A WITNESS 'I Am John's Pancreas' (Ron Johnson's Records ZRON 12)**** A WITNESS grapple with you, they pull you into a confrontation you'd liked to have avoided. Listening to 'I Am John's Pancreas' is like wrestling in quick-sand; everything is pulling you down beneath the dirt and grime of modern living. If you were locked inside an elevator for a week with this album it would drive you insane. It's so unrelenting and strong, it almost bullies you into submission.

Their obstinancy makes 'I Am John's Pancreas' tingle with a primal passion. Every sound here is so basic and yet so dramatically exaggerated that it injects this gritty album with an intriguing suspense which then escalates into a powerful tension.

'I Am John's Pancreas' is an awkward, jarring experience. It is full of contrasting moods that run parallel with the overwhelming despondency that saturates this album. 'I Am John's Pancreas' is one bastard of an album that will snarl at you everytime you play it.

THE SHOP ASSISTANTS 'Shop Assistants' (Blue Guitar AZLP 2)***

I TAKE 'Shop Assistants' by The Shop Assistants and play it. From a band that are, along with The Wolfhounds, Age Of Chance and Wedding Present the most promising pushers of sub-sonic monkey-booted pop, the debut LP is disappointing. By cramming 14 songs into two sides it appears to lack punch, perception, or power, when in fact all three are abundantly present but obscured by toc many formula Shop

It is disappointing because it should be so good. What is important to know is that the band have the simplistic qualities and nerve to write fashion bashing and time passing LPs but are seemingly being held back by their own lack of hunger and little decent competition. They should look to few but the Mary Chain in recent years for inspiration and should then add to them the names of Blondie, the Stooges, T Rex, The Ronettes, and Eddie Cochran before deciding just where they are going to place themselves. Be it ahead of an unoriginal and amateur bedroom scene or up there with the popular plastic masters?

If all wounds are self or press inflicted likewise all praise should be published, parcelled and posted to the heart of Edinburgh.

The adrenalin rushes so much a part of their music, are as abrasive and thorough here as the teeth on a zip.

When Alex and Sarah flip their lip through 'Somewhere In China' and 'What A Way To Die' they boast the bands vocal and lyrical range and capabilities, from subtle perception to chaotic wit.

When David buzzes and buzzes and buzzes the chords from his guitar he does so in competition with a low noise production so unaspiring it doesn't even hint at being the yapping end of the century relation to the Phil Spector wall of sound

that it should be. 'Shop Assistants' is quiet, polite and pleasant. The Shop Assistants should shout, coax and push you into dance. They have the promise but are yet to make, keep, or even break it. JAMES BROWN

GRACE JONES 'Inside Story' (EMI MTL 1007)***** WHAT IS the real Grace Jones? Would we be too disappointed?

'Inside Story' is the biggest Grace Jones surprise since 'Portfolio', the best part of her dance transcendental kitsch to be slapped together under one roof. There's no moment quite as colossally sexual as 'I Need A Man', nothing as rhythmically rich as 'Pull Up To The Bumper', nothing quite as brazen as 'Slave To The Rhythm', but still surprisingly complete.

As always, she's so removed, delivering in that slightly husky and willing way of hers - the kind that makes her one of pop's consistently commanding seductresses. As ever, those features just glare back at you, so dramatically sculpturesque, but no longer so chilly, no longer so threatening. Grace Jones gave up autobiography with 'Living My Life', while the 'Slave To The Rhythm' LP was full of observations on Grace, presumably just some fictional fragments to further the myth.

What does this make 'Inside Story'? Grace, may be retreating a little behind some jazzed-up mask, singing about the usual things, fame and sex and love and death, in different ways? Grace Jones, up to now, has been the world's most believable star, the greatest meaning of 'glamour', because nothing has been real. Now, without stylist Jean-Paul Goude to direct all this, her legend is left to its own devices.

If all that sounds playfully vague, then it is only because 'Inside Story' is a brilliantly indistinct Grace Jones album, seeming to push her outward as a narrator, but probably telling us less than ever. This is hardly Grace pushing it to the limits, just assured, measured, which seems just about right. From the exotically twisted rhythms of 'Chan Hitchhikes To Shanghai' to the becalmed passages like 'White Collar Crime', all her barbs are concealed, if they are there at all. Not that this is without some necessary frictions, just rather furtive.

If it's the real Grace Jones in there, then it's no selfplagiarist cover-up, just some welcome and thoroughly naked disguises.

ROBYN HITCHCOCK "Invisible Hitchcock"

(Class Fish MOIST 2)****/2 "WHEN YOUR dreams come true they pretty soon decay . . . " This new collection of out-takes and rarities from 1980-86 follows hot on the happy heels of the 'Element Of Light' album and finds Robyn reacting to his recent resurgence with a deliciously wry glumness. "We are all doomed, but some of us are more doomed than others."

It's a mixed bag, from the mock country of 'Give Me A Spanner, Ralph' to the plaintive acoustic sweep of 'My Favourite Buildings'. Of course it's the lyrics throughout which give an extra dimension to otherwise innocently accessible guitarbased songs. While 'It's A Mystic Trip' veers dangerously close to the hippy vernacular it sets out to parody, there's an accuracy of nuance in the emotional fusion of bitterness and slight optimism that constitutes 'All I Wanna Do Is Fall In Love', a gem. You either see the world in a similar way to Robyn Hitchcock or you shake your head and go back to work on

This record is a must for all Hitchcockphiles. 'The Pit Of Souls' is a startling subversive cousin of the intro to Roxy Music's 'Manifesto', while 'Point It At Gran' again moves you to shivers with the bold comedy of its manic poetry. Overall it's the darker side of the man, a side tempered on recent releases but anything but barren. Hitchcock revels in the ability to see both the beautiful face across the table and the cold baked beans on the plate in front of him. His near-asdammit unique gift is the strength to use both these images when spontaneously getting up on that table and bursting into song.

THE CASSANDRA COMPLEX 'Grenade'

(Rouska CXRA 001)** FIVE YEARS ago, when the last recognisible sound of Leeds was being battered into being by the enigmatic Sisters Of Mercy, grotesque March Violets and inebriated Three Johns, Rodney Orpheus was spending Saturdays scouring jumble sales for over-the-top, second-hand children's games. By night, he'd wander the corners of the Up-Zone videoteque telling all who'd listen of his plans to gather together a close knit unit of 'talented' people for live and studio engagements.

Half a decade has passed and Rodney has his first LP out. I gather from listening to it that he's long since dropped the ideas of chasing, capturing or releasing anything original, of bringing to life a talented musical unit, or of attempting popularity.

'Grenade' is a K-Tel-style compilation of effects every early '80s Yorkshire band were using. Eldritch's ludicrous vocals, the Violets' heavy chug-chug-chugging guitars, Cabaret Voltaire's scuttling beat, and the controlled feedback the Johns used like punctuation. What The Cassandra Complex have missed is the sense of the ridiculous that ran like cholesterol through the veins of every one of those early purveyors of gothic scuzz. As a cross-section of (other people's) ideas, 'Grenade' is appealing; but as an original debut LP, it is limited and stilted. Its only good point is the quality of the carrion it's comprised of.

'Grenade' might burst a few blackheads on German dancefloors, but back in postgoth Blighty it just won't rub. The Cassandra Complex are nothing more than an overthe-top, second-hand children's game.

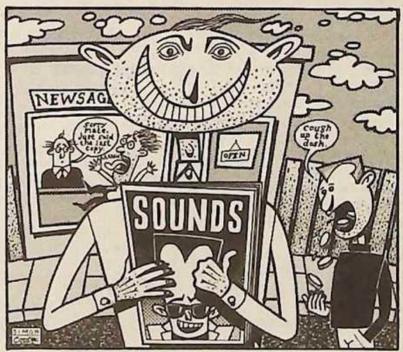

When LONE JUSTICE burst onto last year's scene, the band's charismatic vocalist found herself in the eye of a storm of sexist accusations, but Maria McKee is no brainless poppet. Back with a restructured band and a sore larynx, she tells PAUL ELLIOTT her plans for the future. PETER ANDERSON cuts the strings

JUST can't hold myself back," said Maria McKee with a roll of her big eyes for emphasis.

She sure didn't when she took up smoking to kill the boredom between recording takes for Lone Justice's current (and, at its simplest, very enoyable) LP, 'Shelter'.

In three months she puffed through so many fags that now, a full month after she packed them in, her lungs are still groaning under the ill effects.

When we met in Manchester during their recent British tour. Maria's windpipes were further troubled by a stubborn cold that wouldn't shift with steaming. And yet she still wouldn't, or couldn't. hold herself back for the night's gig at the International, a sort of longer and tackier version of the Marquee.

In spite of everything, her only lapse was a little sneeze, bless her, during the hushed 'Don't Toss Us Away'.

Still, it got a laugh.

ARIA MCKEE doesn't even have to sing with eyes like hers.' 'A sweet pickle sex attraction.' Oh yeah?

Sorry, but if accusations of selling sex are being slung around, then they're more likely to stick to, say, Whitney Houston or Bon Jovi.

And the old 'hype' storm, originating from a time in '85 when CBS wooed the rock weeklies with that most hardy of carrots, the American trip, seems to have blown over, too.

So what are Lone Justice selling? Some call it 'rock', some 'pop', some 'country', some 'cowpunk', and some, like our very own Hurt, call it 'AOR'. AOR?

Guitarist Shane 'Speed King' Fontayne laughs off the REO Speedwagon connection. Maria doesn't get it.

"I don't really know what AOR is. . . "

Oh. What does your mother think of rock 'n' roll now?

"She loves it" I thought she was dead against

"Oh, that was just a phase my parents were going through." She laughs at the idea. "No, they're both very supportive of me. My mother says that as long as I'm

happy she thinks it's wonderful." What regrets do you have

about taking up a performing career?

"No regrets." Not even living out of a

suitcase? "I enjoy that"

Loss of privacy?

"That hasn't happened to me yet. I love meeting people.

"There are things that I intend to do in the future which I'm not gonna let a career in a rock 'n' roll band hamper - having a family, raising children, which is something that I feel very strongly about If I have to slow down a bit, perhaps I will."

With the entire band being rebuilt around you between first and second albums, people are

bound to look upon Lone Justice as 'Maria McKee plus backing musicians' Does this put you out?

"It doesn't put me out I can understand people thinking that, though it's completely not true."

Shane nods in affirmation. Either that, or he was headbanging.

EOPLE HAVE told me, Maria, that you've a tendency to get quite beside yourself onstage - that you sometimes do things that you don't remember doing.

"It's all purely instinctive. y'know? I don't think about it. Sometimes it's a bit surprising when people tell me what I did." "It may sound a bit hack,"

Ritch, er. Shane interrupts, "but this band relies heavily upon inspiration. We're not like a lot of the bands who go out night after night and know exactly what's gonna be going on."

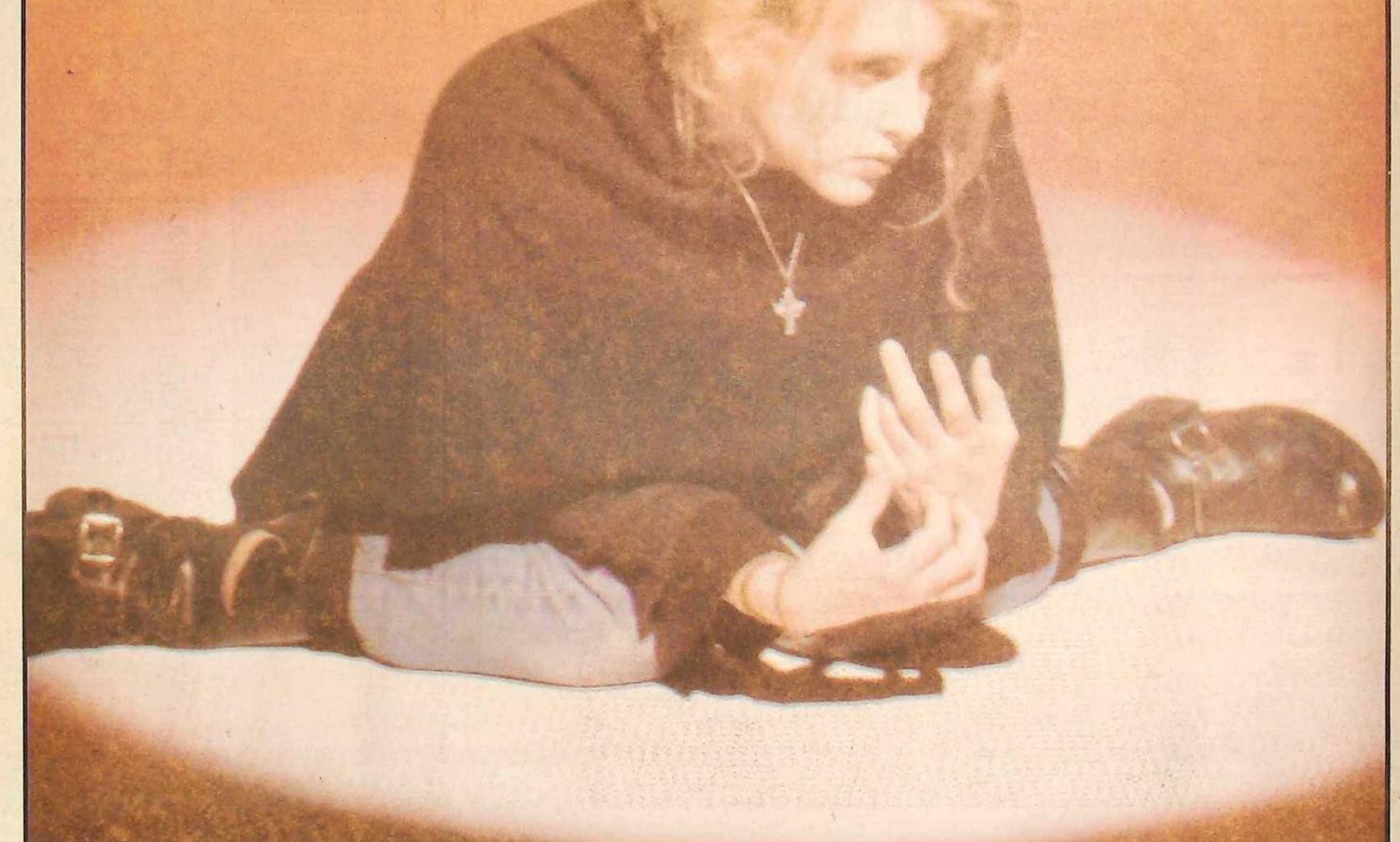
"I can't hold myself back." Maria continues. "I can't do it. even when I know I should.

"People might suggest that I do a low-key gig one night, but I don't know how to do that I hate those kinda singers who start freezing up when they go to hit a note, getting all prima donna. That's bullshit. If you've got a cold, you've still gotta do it."

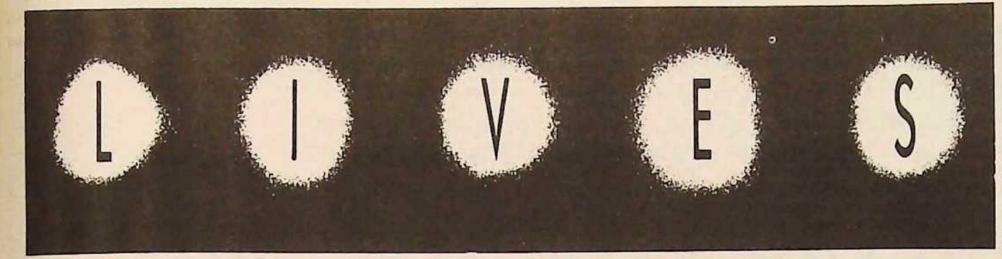
You've also been described as a romantic. Do you think your plans to relocate the band in Europe, or more specifically the British Isles, are based as much on romantic ideals as on practicalities?

"Yeah," she smiles. "What I know about Europe comes mainly from books, although I know when I go to Ireland it's not gonna be all William Butler Yeats.

"I'm looking forward to being rudely awakened."

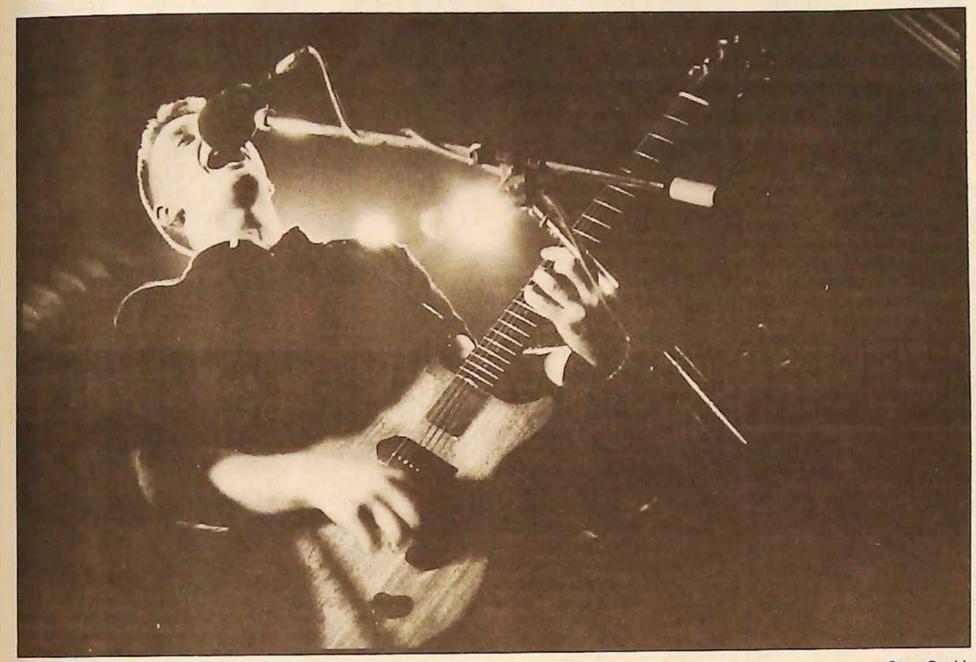

THE DAY Billy Bragg stops touring, the world will stop revolving, and the cast from EastEnders will cease to make records. Many of the fans at this gig have seen this particular Eastender numerous times and they still come in their droves, clamouring for more political pop-philosophy and a handful of singalong anthems. Billy Bragg built this gig up to a resounding crescendo and it could have easily led to the most exciting live performance that I would have had the privilege to witness this year. Parts were frighteningly brilliant, and only towards the end did the cockney let himself and the evening down.

Bragg, the pied piper of youth socialism, should by now have the experience and the self-confidence to allow his songs to stand up in their own right as overtly strong political statements; after all he would not have been able to pack this hall out if they weren't. However, he still found it necessary to preach unrepentant but purely superfluous political sermons towards the end of the concert. Apart from the fact that he was preaching to the converted, he has shown on past tours that he is a skilful enough all-round entertainer to be able to ad lib in a more satirical and, ultimately, more effective way.

Often artists reach a peak in performance when they are going through troubled times, and whether it was coincidence or not, Bragg set off with enough emotion and angst bottled up inside him to have filled the hall many times over. It flowed in his bitter-sweet love songs that seemed all the more pertinent. Favourites such as 'Milkman Of Human Kindness' and 'Greetings To The New Brunette', were delivered with awesome power. (Though quite why he did a version of the Jackson's 'I'll Be There' is beyond me, especially as he sounds painfully out of tune when tackling a slow song.)

The set came to a premature end with a chilling, if rushed 'A New England' and one of his stirring anthems 'Between The Wars'. But one of the tragedies of the evening was the encore farce. On came the houselights, out went the crowd, back came Bragg with his ensemble, and back came the crowd. Encores should never be obligatory, and this one left rather a sour taste in the mouth to what had mostly been a stirring evening. It's what Bragg himself might call sham-democracy.

VAN MORRISON Hammersmith Odeon

WHEN HE whispers, cooing so gruffly but delicately, when he steps back from the microphone, silences his band and lets loose this aching undertone, that's when Van Morrison is more than magnificent. When he crowd-pleases with a mouldering 'Gloria', getting all self-indulgent, mopping

off the cobwebs, then he's fleetingly tiresome. But his whispers? Suffocating.

Last year's Dominion shows shed doubt on his live prowess, Morrison conjuring up all the intimacy of a crowded airport lounge, trampling his best work into the dust like yesterday's cigar ash. Tonight, knowing he's made his most touching album for years in 'No Guru',

he's bent on seduction, even slipping some rare playfulness into the flow of the evening. The immaculate 'Vanlose Stairway' is one such early tremor, Van loosened up, deciding that tonight he's going to finally lose control. During a particularly fevered 'It's All In The Game', the sullen one literally shakes with abandon and a strange bearded man

steps up on stage in anticipation of a fainting-fit.

For once, newer offerings are met with the most ecstatic response, a soft ripple of applause before all 'No Guru' material, which even forces a smile from The Man himself. Without the slightest exaggeration, his reading of 'Oh The Warm Feeling', with a band on call to meet his

every soul tremble, was nothing short of holy. Us Morrison disciples are incorrigible though... we would happily pay through the nose to watch The Man gargle mouth-wash for 90 minutes, knowing he could make it sound like some kind of celestial bliss.

He neared the end with a breathless 'Rave On John Donne', ranting through Whitman and Yeats with tigerish aplomb, his believers punctuating the pauses with orgiastic wails of approval. Morrison, an artist who could never fake intensity, he's either going to let it go or he's not, allowed himself the second grin of the evening. It was a telling twinkle of the eye, the exclamation-mark on a near-classic night.

EDWYN COLLINS/THE STARS OF HEAVEN Sheffield University

LONG SINCE steeped in the lavish praise of Peel and the press, Dublin's The Stars Of Heaven took the stage to unexpected echo of indifference. Two guitars, bass, drums and a forceful, occasionally haunting voice, they shift easily from bittersweet country to straight rock and the most infectious pop.

The 40 or so who bothered to watch were soon swept along by a compellingly brief set which reached a peak with the title track of their debut LP, 'Sacred Heart Hotel'. Young, heartfelt and fast, The Stars Of Heaven are the brightest hope for miles.

From the present to yesteryear as Edwyn Collins continues his resurrection in style. Brandishing a Colgate grin and beloved guitar, Edwyn is Elvis '56 from the square cut of his padded shoulders and crumpled pegs to the carelessly coiffured

Backed by Denis Bovell on bass and former Orange Juice guitarist Malcolm Ross, Collins has added drums and keyboards, ripped up the old set list and begun again. More confident than ever, he unleashes the obvious singles 'Don't Shilly Shally' and 'Pushing It To The Back Of My Mind', and indulges in plenty of between-song banter. Replying to Postcard pleas with a stiletto sharp, "F*** 'Felicity'" and follow it with the unashamed raunch of 'Fifty Shades Of Blue'. "And they say rock is dead," he smirks.

Right now, Edwyn Collins seems more than happy to leave his pop past to the blue boys while he stakes out a rock 'n' roll vision for the future.

McCARTHY **Charing Cross Road** Godfathers

THERE IS a simple and thoroughly bewitching honesty about McCarthy, a purity that very few bands ever attain in the course of their long and rotten careers. But here, in a sleazy club above a pizza joint, is a group with that almost magical clarity of vision and depth of sound. A group with the ability to knock you back against the rear wall and leave you gasping for words.

I had imagined beforehand that my knowledge of seven songs would ably guide me through their set. Y'know, the standard deal: a couple of compilations, a four-track 12inch, all of them featuring tunes that bring a lump to my throat and tie knots in my stomach. But I waited for half an hour this night as unheard gems poured over my ears until the single, 'Red Sleeping Beauty', dislodged a memory cell and signalled the end of the show. God, how many more of these classics do they have tucked away under their Barking mattresses?

The drums tumble and roll beneath the pristine notes, and ringing melodies fill your head while Malcolm's nasal chords tug at a little forgotten piece of your mind. It's like having a voice whispering behind you, reminding you of simple truths that were once so clear-cut and obvious but which have become clouded by the trauma of everyday

It could almost be that McCarthy are too good, that some more deserving intelligence will come and steal them away from us. But I guess that's just the kind of fantasy they inspire in me. STRANGERS AND BROTHERS Glasgow Rooftop

THIS WAS never going to be easy, for here was a band anxious to prove themselves, stranded high and dry in the wrong venue, with the wrong audience who consisted of a curious mix of Friday night desperadoes and others of no fixed intent.

Despite the richly varied pedigree of the individual band members, the going hasn't been all that easy for Strangers And Brothers. But hell, if intro tapes are anything to go by, these guys have little to worry about. They come on stage to nothing less than John Barry's title theme from You Only Live Twice. All was bliss. momentarily.

You'd have to be grudgingly malicious to dislike a band like Strangers And Brothers, they're too ordinary too often! Tonight the decision went to 'Candi Train' and 'Sensational' on points, while the remainder failed to make any lasting impression, with the possible exception of 'Rain' and 'Miracle Man'.

But in the band's favour there are the Reilly Bros themselves - Jack with his studied bug eyed, hip shake, which is a welcome relief from the band's otherwise no frills manner; and Charlie with his guitar sound. Although to these ears it's altogether more Joe Walsh than Mark Knopfler on the night.

In the end, it seemed that the punters had no sooner boarded the 'Candi Train' than it was pulling into its destination, ahead of time. Shame.

SCHOOLY D **Brixton Academy**

"ROCK 'N' roll living's a thing of the past, so all you longhaired faggots can kiss my ass. Say it loud, I love rap and I'm proud.

Schooly D is a hard boy, a tough cookie who reckons he could throw stones at Mike Tyson's pigeons and get away with it - rumour has it that he got his record deal by placing his gun against an executive's temple.

This former member of Philadelphia's Park Side Killers gang is indelibly associated with the Yo Boys, Young Obituarist Blacks who wear Gucci and gun each other down with a casual fervour. Earlier this week he's reputed to have grabbed Mick Jones of BAD (who Schooly's supporting on their UK tour) and threatened to choke him unless he got more daily expenses.

With his DJ, Master Mixer Code Money, scratching over accessible drum patterns and rhythm programmes, Schooly's rap is direct, confrontational and essentially humourless. Wearing his beany hat, leather strides and the chunkiest garnishing of gold this side of Mr T, he alternatively twists his muscle bound torso through lissom manoeuvres and stares threateningly at Code Money. With communication restricted to the rapping and despite the absence of a gun, his usual stage prop, Schooly cuts a cold, removed figure, not without charisma.

His psychotically violent philosophy may be an accurate reflection of life in downtown Reagansville but nonetheless it's unworthy of the glamourisation it recently received in another rock mag. Schooly D may have rap as instantaneous as rock fuelled DMC but his moral stance is a lot less attractive.

"I like seclusion, isolation from people. Sometimes the work I do is of such intensity and darkness that I can't stand it myself. But I have to persevere. The individuals I like to make contact with are few and far between, because there are very few people who have reached the horrible conclusion that all this is going to come to an end, ha ha ha! I love it! As Raven says, Less furniture, more sky! Ha ha ha ha!"

And if you could only hear that laugh, everything would fall into place, make absolute sense. Understand that there is no insanity, only certainty, and you'll be

We leave the office, arranging to meet for a third and final time, and get on the tube. And I want you to picture Jaz pushing his way through a packed platform, shaking his head and murmuring, "Too many people. Too many people."

N A yuppie bar/restaurant in the King's Road, I suggest to Jaz that as a band Killing Joke are stuck between making their own plans and wanting a high level of success.

"I wouldn't complain at having a number one record. I don't think any of us would." But surely you have to maintain a higher

"What, little girly magazines? One or two more TV shows, you mean? Let's look at the reality, one or two more TV shows, more press coverage, one or two more front covers... huh? We don't worry about it."

But you do want Killing Joke to keep growing?

"It will, through word of mouth, through expanding in different directions. The book is part of Killing Joke. We have credibility with a lot of people that comes by just being yourself over a number of years. I don't see any massive changes, like suddenly we break really big. We enjoy international distribution and we play the music we want."

I tell him that people I know either see Killing Joke once and never want to go again, or they keep getting drawn back, like moths to a candle. And they know there's something about Killing Joke, but they can't describe it.

"I understand this. You're talking about the fifth member?"

Am I?

"Ha! I mean... people ask me when I'm talking about my managers... they think I'm talking about EG Records. Ha!"

He is chuckling now. What are you referring to?

"It's very difficult to explain. When you start crossing over on areas such as beliefs, convictions, to put them in print is. . . I'm reluctant to be definitive, but right from the beginning. . . there's been a guiding force which we have complete faith in.

Something keeps giving us all the facilities to express ourselves with. That's what I mean when I refer to management. I suppose the next question will be, What is your local deity? Ha ha ha!"

And in the next two hours we discuss Mishima, love, hate, pity, Wagner, morris dancing. Life and death, in fact.

"I don't neccessarily like my dreams, you know?" Jaz confesses. "That's just it, I don't necessarily like them. But I have to follow them, there's certain things you know. You know the sun rises in the East, you know the call of hunger. Existence is certain. To analyse my own imperfections, worries, guilt, all the impurities, to see them, and to create a reaction that will outlive my life - I cannot think of anything more, I can't see any other reason. Just owning that makes life worth living.

"The trouble is, the way we exist in our society, we settle with the assumption that we're frail, pathetic creatures who are blessed with error. And that's something I'm trying to unlearn. I'd rather see man foolish, proud, arrogant. . . I have great difficulty in living by my own creed, make no mistake.

"But my values have changed since the beginning of Killing Joke, hit singles and all that. You think it's in the winning of the race but it's not, it's in the running. There's no start or finish, just go! Another single, more music, and you get onto the next. I don't want it to ever stop, because when you stop doing, you start dying."

And finally Jaz comes clean, of sorts. He tells me of the inspiration behind a song on the new album called 'A Southern Sky'.

"It's a place I've been to, I don't want to say where - I've learned my lesson about that - one of the most beautiful places I've been to in the world. It's an island, a very small island. Geordie and I have been there. I would very much like to see more of this place, to say the least! Ha ha!

"Look at the imagery in the lyrics. It's not difficult to guess, untouched land, an ideal for me. It would be the kind of place for an anti-social character!"

You count yourself as anti-social?

"I certainly do. You've got to have some sort of idea of what your perfect environment would be, within the boundaries of your own lifetime. Plenty of 'Keep Out' signs, a few guns to back it up with... and then we'll start talking about uniforms! Ha ha ha ha ha!"

And if Killing Joke are about anything at all, in my eyes it's making use, carving out a straight line and forging ahead with your only care being ultimately for yourself. No favours, no free lunches.

As Jaz puts it, "I enjoy the bitterness and contempt in Killing Joke, I participate in that. We despise in Killing Joke, that's where we get all our inspiration from."

And Jaz was laughing when I left him, so much that I expected him to burst into tears.

"People aren't going to like me! People aren't going to like me! Life must end tragically, so I can have a good laugh at it all. Ha ha ha!"

A tragic comedy. "Yes it is! It's funny."
